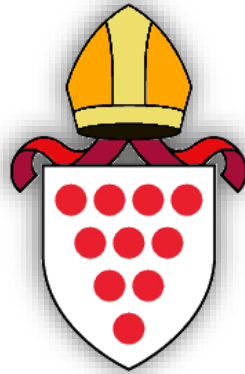

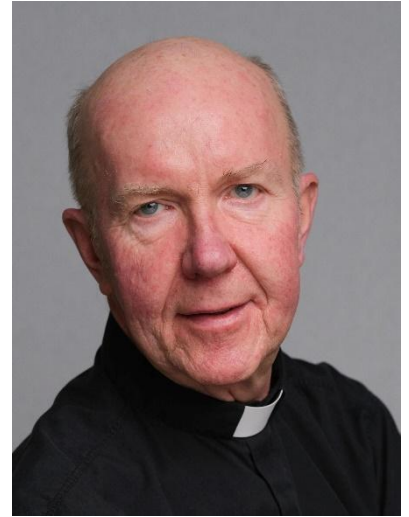

The session provides delegates with an overview of the SIAMS Framework for Inspection. Enrichment	<p>Stations of the Cross (a meditation for Holy Week) Wed 16 April, 12:00 – 13:00</p> <p>The Stations of the Cross is a traditional devotion following in the imagination (and often around a church building) the last journey of Jesus’s earthly life through the streets of Jerusalem, with fourteen stations or stopping points. It is often used particularly on Wednesdays and Fridays in Lent. **Hope, Holiness and Silence:
A Spiritual Path for a Dangerous World**

Thurs 1 May, 10:00 – 12:30

A morning of reflection and sharing facilitated by the Rev'd Canon Wyn Beynon.

Our speaker: Rev'd Canon Wyn Beynon. Wyn has been a parish priest in Wales and England – including his most recent appointments in Worcester Diocese – for 43 years but is now retired with permission to officiate in the diocese. He lives in Bewdley where Melissa, his wife, is now Rector, so he still hasn't quite got away from the 'firm'! He is also a spiritual director and clergy mentor. Wyn chairs the diocesan Spirituality Connexions Steering Group and served on General Synod until 2021. Wyn is the author of 'For This I Came', published in 2023. <https://www.amazon.co.uk/This-Came-Spiritualpriesthood-ministry/dp/1786224666>. In it he offers seventy reflections on the spirituality of priesthood to encourage and sustain all in ministry. Wyn Beynon brings a depth of wisdom and tools for reflection in the form of short poetic and prayerful aphorisms. Memorable, profound, challenging and assuring, his writing is a rich source for meditation and for growth in character and ministry.

The Purpose of the Gathering

Wyn writes: 'Hope' became a popular catchword during Covid. 'Holiness' has never been much of a popular catchword! 'Silence'? - well, it depends who you ask. To the suffering silence is an injustice. To those busy changing the world silence is a luxury we can't afford. But to others silence is the way to holiness, and holiness is where the rubber of hope meets the road of life. The Gathering is for anyone who is seeking to explore their spiritual awareness and deepen their faithfulness in the life of prayer. It is also likely to be helpful for those who are involved in the work of accompanying and listening to others on their spiritual journeys in a ministry of walking alongside others.

Those who've recently completed their specialist ALM training as Pastoral Workers or Worship Leaders are particularly encouraged to attend, but anyone who is interested is welcome.</p> <p>The Church of England shares two main creeds with the wider Christian Church. The Apostles' Creed is the basic creed of our common baptism. The Nicene Creed comes out of the resolution of a major disagreement in the early church and has become the fullest shared statement of faith we use regularly at the Eucharist.</p> <p>These creeds together form the bedrock of our understanding of the Christian faith, and the framework within which we carry out our Christian life, witness and ministry. Buildings and Churchyards	<p>Introduction to the Buildings Management Portal</p> <p>If you have responsibility for your Church building or are a key lead for fabric projects, then you'll want to join us for this introduction to the new Buildings Management Portal. In October 2025 we're anticipating the release by the National Church team of a new online system for the submission of Faculties. This system will replace the current Online Faculty System (OFS) and will be set up slightly differently from what we have become used to since the Faculty system was introduced in Worcester c.2018.</p> <p>The training will address everything you need to know to log List A works, make a successful application for List B (Archdeacon's) permission or a full Faculty online using the new system. We'll be able to show you all the steps, from registration, to how to submit an application, including how to upload and organise documents to support your proposals. In addition to the practicalities of the system, we'll share tips for making successful applications; such as templates that are available to make certain steps of the process easier, and how to arrange photos to best support your proposals.</p> <p>We will be running two in-person training sessions and one online, though if we have significant demand we may run another later in the year. Wed 14th May, 12:30 – 13:30</p> <p>Miriam: poet and prophet</p> <p>Speaker: Dr Rachel Starr</p> <p>Miriam is mentioned by name in more books of the Bible than any other woman. (Exodus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, 1 Chronicles and Micah.) In at least some traditions, she seems to have been rather more important than the texts we now have describe after all Micah goes so far as to say “I brought you up from the land of Egypt ... I sent before you Moses, Aaron and Miriam.” She is remembered as both the poet and prophet who proclaims the great song of the Exodus, and the woman who is punished for criticising her brother Moses.</p>  <p>In this session we will explore a character who deserves more attention than Christians usually give her, and what we can learn from her story.</p> <p>Rachel Starr teaches biblical studies and contextual theologies at Queen’s, Birmingham. Publications include with Robert Beckford, <i>Behold the Men. Ministry and Leadership	<p>Gospel of Life Mon 19 May, 10:00 – 12:00, In person Mon 19 May, 19:00 – 20:30, Online</p> <p>Last autumn we completed a series on the gospel of the year, with a session on St Luke’s gospel. Since then, people have asked for a follow-up session on the gospel according to St John. John’s account of Jesus doesn’t get a year to itself in the lectionary, but we read it, especially at festivals, in all three years.</p> <p>It’s fairly obvious that John is different in lots of ways from our first three gospels. Instead of speaking in short memorable sayings, Jesus often delivers lengthy speeches. There are no exorcisms. Jesus regularly speaks of the relationship between the Father and himself as Son. Positively, the gospel has powerfully shaped Christian doctrine of the Trinity. Negatively, John’s statements about the group he calls “the Jews”, has fed the long history of anti-Semitism.</p> <p>How do we read this different gospel? What are its key themes? How does it help us think about, and relate to Jesus? Doug Chaplin will explore these and other questions, as he completes his series on the gospels. Wed 11 June, 12:30 – 13:30 Mary Magdalene Speaker: Canon Doug Chaplin</p> <p>Mary Magdalene's greatest claim to fame in the gospels is that Jesus appointed her "apostle to the apostles" — that title is not just the result of modern feminist readings of scripture, it was one given her in the Middle Ages by none other than St Thomas Aquinas.</p> <p>The tradition has regularly conflated various female characters in the Bible, often making Mary Magdalene a former prostitute who has amended her ways in response to Jesus, although that is not how the scriptures presents her. In reaction, she has also been the heroine of various heretical and unhistorical retellings of the story both ancient (The Gospel of Mary) and modern (The DaVinci Code).</p> <p>In this session we shall root ourselves in the biblical traditions about Mary Magdalene, but also take a look at some of the ways others have narrated her story, outside as well as inside the church. Doug Chaplin will reflect on her role in the Gospels, and the ways people have co-opted her for their different agendas.</p> <p>Doug Chaplin is Discipleship and Lay Training Officer in the diocese, and an associate member of staff at the Queen's Foundation. Mary, mother of the Lord</p> <p>Speaker: Mother Victoria Barlow</p> <p>Mary, the mother of Jesus, has been a contentious figure through faith history. A shared point of connection between Islam and Christianity, her name has been on lips and hearts through the centuries. She has also been the centre of many controversies, and misunderstandings. We reflect on her place in our lives of faith, what can we learn from the young woman who saw angels, who said a yes that changed the Universe, and who birthed Love into the world.</p> <p>In Luke’s gospel she is blessed because she heard the word of God and obeyed it. She waits with the lost and broken at the foot of the cross. She forms part of the community with the disciples after the resurrection, and on the day of Pentecost. She is a woman who is filled with the Spirit at the beginning of both the gospel and the book of Acts.</p> <p>For many Christians, therefore she is also a model of prayer, and a praying companion on the Christian journey; while others, uncomfortable with asking her to pray for and with them, nonetheless value her as a model of faith and obedience, and, as her Magnificat prophesied, rejoice to call her blessed.</p> <p>Come and reflect on Mary’s role in the gospel and in the church with Victoria Barlow, Team Vicar in the Halas Team Ministry. Financial Planning During your Ministry & Beyond

Wed 1 Oct, 09:30 – 13:00

Speakers: Subject experts from The Church of England Pension Board, clergy pension and housing teams; plus independent financial advisers from Ecclesiastical Financial Advisory Services.

This session is aimed at helping clergy (and their partners if applicable) demystify financial matters and helping you plan for your financial future no matter how far you may be from retirement. The speakers will address personal financial planning issues and questions that in their experience face most clergy at various times in their ministry.



In the financial planning session in addition to a session from the pensions board and housing teams we include:

- The importance of planning ahead
- General financial planning hints and tips (including but not limited to, budgeting, claiming allowances, having an emergency fund, the importance of Wills and powers of attorney (it is important to point out that we cover the key points of wills and POA's but we are not legal advisers so we don't provide will writing or other legal services ourselves and signpost to solicitors, but no particular firm is recommended))
- Housing options including buying property (or remortgaging) during your ministry.
- Options for saving more for retirement and understanding what to do with non-church pensions you might have.
- Protecting the family (depending on the age group, this is usually more relevant to younger age groups)
- Saving & investing hints and tips including tax on pensions & investment and tax efficiency, investment risks and ethical investment options
- Inheritance Tax issues (if there is sufficient time)
- Answering your financial questions (questions from the audience are encouraged)
