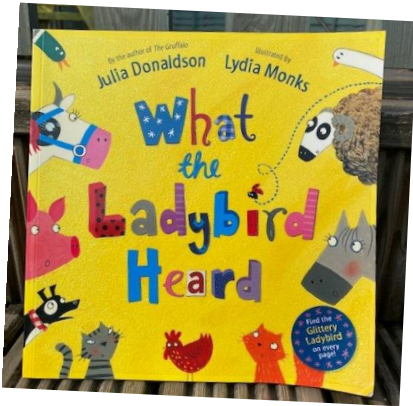


Being Responsible
