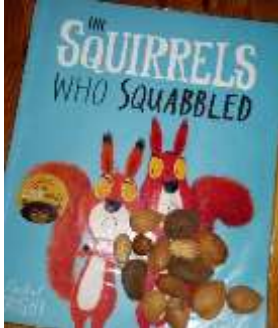


Sharing

“Then he (Jesus) said to them, “Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions.” - Luke 12:15.

We all know that being greedy isn't good, and it's good to see how Cyril and Bruce sorted out their greed problem. Being greedy can be shown in all sorts of ways, like wanting the whole bag of sweets or the biggest piece of cake or not sharing your toys.

What you could **do** as a family this month.

- Make a cake or biscuits and share them with a neighbour or friend?
- Put something into the foodbank collection box when you go shopping.
- Have a sort out of the things you no longer need and offer them to charity or to someone who might need them, such as a refugee charity or a Freecycle organisation.
- Take a walk as a family to appreciate this wonderful world and talk about how God shares the world with us.
- Share your toys as you play with your family and friends.

We believe in the power of prayer:

A prayer for you to pray for your child: Creator God, thank you for sharing the world and Jesus with us. Help my child/ren, to grow up with a generous heart. Amen.

A prayer we commit to pray for you as parents: Dear Lord God help these parents to appreciate everything that you have shared with them, and show them ways where they can model sharing to their children. Amen.
