In the period of National Mourning:

- The Old Testament and New Testament readings follow the cycle below. If using a mobile/tablet, for ease of use go to bible.oremus.org in addition to the *Daily Prayer* app. The Vergers will set the bible markers as usual.
- Psalms at the Offices remain unchanged from the main lectionary.
- Saints Days are marked, but the readings cycle below used instead; the relevant Collect is used in addition to the Collects below for HM The Late Queen and HM the King.

The main lectionary resumes on the morning of D11 (Tuesday 20 September).
