World Mission Conference: Modern Day Slavery

Slavery still thrives in the UK and around the world. About 13,000 people are enslaved in the UK today and 40 million worldwide. This conference will be opened by Bishop Mike followed by three speakers:

- Emily Kenway, writer and activist, whose recent book 'The Truth about Modern Slavery' is thought-provoking and shines a light on the politics of MDS. She was an advisor to the UK's first Anti-Slavery Commissioner.
- A speaker from Antislavery International who work to bring about an end to slavery around the world
- Dan Pratt who is a member of Southend on Sea Against Modern Slavery Partnership and is involved in anti-slavery groups across East Anglia.
