We are thankful that so many support food banks all year round, some offering permanent collection points, providing donations of many non-perishable goods such as long life milk and tinned food, toiletries and the occasional treat too!

So how are we celebrating Harvest? Here are a few recent stories:

"The harvest was a tough one - in East Anglia the weather was against us.... as we prepare for our Harvest Festival I will be making our traditional sheaf-shape loaf out of our own milled flour!!" says Tom McKenny, deanery treasurer in Clare Deanery.

The Revd Carl Melville, Rector at Bacton with Wyverstone, Cotton and Old Newton and Wickham Skeith, is making microwave mug cakes in Harvest Festival services to illustrate all of the ingredients needed to make a good cake, reflecting all the ingredients needed in life too.

Graham Miles, Lightwave Rural Chaplain, is preaching at the Withersfield Harvest evensong celebration alongside the Revd Max Drinkwater.

Jason Busby in St Mary's Halesworth says: "We celebrated harvest as part of the Heritage Open Days and we pulled out all the stops". This service also celebrated the first phase of a regeneration project in the church with an opportunity to show off the 'new look'



lighting, level floor, chairs, upgraded heating and sound system. The weekend event was attended by nearly 300 people and all food contributions were donated to the Halesworth Community Larder.

'Hope and Aid Direct' is a charity that works to provide aid to refugees and it's supporting an Arts Festival to bring to light the harsh realities of child refugees and migrants. In collaboration with the Handspring Puppet Company, the world-famous creators of the play 'War Horse', they are presenting The Walk – a travelling festival of art and hope, bringing together artists, cultural institutions, community groups and humanitarian organisations, creating an innovative and adventurous public artwork. At the heart of The Walk is 'Little Amal', a 3.5m tall puppet of a young refugee girl. Little Amal is a nine year old female refugee who has embarked on a remarkable journey, taking her across Turkey and Europe in search of her mother, an education and a new life.
