We are delighted to announce that donors can now join the PGS online. Donors can do this by visiting the website <u>parishgiving.org.uk</u> and searching for the parish they wish to give to or by following a dedicated link to the parish webpage. For parishes already in the PGS there are three ways to give:

- New donors can set up a regular donation online
- By phone: 0333 002 1271
- By post (using the printable pdf of the Gift Form which can be downloaded here).

Each method is simple and secure. What's more, every pound gifted goes to support your church's mission and ministry, with no donor fees or charges to parishes.

InHarmony Lent and Easter videos update

St Edmundsbury Cathedral's InHarmony project continues to provide a unique resource for churches to use in online services. There are now over 20 music videos available for the Lent and Easter period. The selection includes hymns, worship songs and anthems, recorded in Suffolk by local musicians during lockdown, all free for church use.

A more unusual item is a Ghanaian Kyrie, sung by Cantus Firmus Choir with marimba accompaniment, which is available in three versions. in the first, the sung sections are interspersed with confession prayers especially suitable for Lent. In the second, the musical interludes are left blank for church video creators to insert prayers recorded by their own congregation. The third is a stand-alone version of the complete song.

A set of short sung responses from the Iona Community will be available soon, suitable for use between intercession prayers. Also coming soon is a new song by Felixstowe musician Andy Rayner, performed by local international opera singer Christina Johnston.

The crisis in Yemen by Richard Stainer, World Development Adviser



I am sure that many of you have been moved, as I have been, by Orla Guerin's reports from Yemen on the BBC news. They show the terrible situation of children struggling to continue with schooling in desperate conditions. The UN is struggling to raise funds for its humanitarian programmes. The UK has a proud record of supporting Yemen and will still be a major donor, but is cutting funding by 50% meaning many more children will die. As Christians I don't think we can stand idly by. Could I ask you to write a short letter to your MP asking them to raise the matter with the

Foreign Secretary Dominic Raab and requesting that they do not support the bill cutting international aid when it is brought before Parliament. If you would like a pro forma letter then do please email me at richard.stainer14@gmail.com.
