# Pupils search churchyard for all creatures great and small



Youngsters from St Mary's Church of England Primary School in Woodbridge have visited their village church to record the flourishing wildlife in its churchyard. Three classes took part in the Churches Count on Nature scheme, a national initiative to create a database of wildlife in the UK.

The children scoured the churchyard for creepy crawlies, birds, animals and plants, making a note of everything they discovered.

Father Nigel Prior said the children loved their day out and hoped it would inspire in them a lifelong love of wildlife. He said: "The project was to encourage all churches to take special care of their local wildlife and to discover what is living around their churchyards. The children were on the lookout for all creatures great and small, from insects to plants, and to jot it down in their workbooks. This will form a national record of wildlife around the country. I hope this is something we be able to do every year, it was

great to get the children together and everyone had a wonderful time."

ministry continues to be strong, and this means we are able to provide Christian care and service across our communities. This year, I am particularly aware of the extraordinary circumstances in which those being ordained have found themselves. Those to be ordained deacon will have received much of their formation and training over the past sixteen months online because of the pandemic. Those who are being ordained priest, after a year in parishes across the county, will have been exercising ministry in the most constrained of circumstances. All ordinations are special, but these will have this particular dimension of faithful service through the pandemic."

# Would you like to represent us at General Synod - for the next fiveyear term 2021-2026?

The elections to stand for General Synod are taking place this year. General Synod is the legislative body of the Church of England, it agrees the national budget for the Church of England and debates a wide range of public and social issues from the perspective of a faith organisation.

Becoming a General Synod representative is an opportunity to represent the concerns of your community and your diocese at a national level. It is a time to pray together, think together and make decisions about the future of the Church of England together. It is an opportunity for you to raise issues and contribute to debates on the life of the church regarding topics such as poverty, education and climate change.

This is a voluntary role although your expenses are paid for by the diocese, and you will need to be happy using email and reading the considerable amount of documentation involved in the General Synod meetings. As part of the role you are also offered the opportunity to report back on proceedings at our Diocesan Synod.

Each diocese is allocated a number of seats in the Houses of Clergy and Laity, our diocese is entitled to three clergy and three lay representatives, each elected for five years. All beneficed, licensed and PTO clergy are eligible to stand for election, while to be elected to the House of Laity, a person must be a communicant member of the Church of England, at least 18 years old and have their name on the church electoral roll in a parish in the diocese. All clergy in a diocese (other than PTO, unless they are on deanery synod) may vote for clergy candidates. Lay members of deanery synods may vote for lay candidates.

**How to get elected?** Whether clergy or laity, you will need two people from your category to nominate you to stand for Synod; i.e. clergy will need two clergy electors to nominate them, and lay candidates will require two members of their deanery synod to nominate them. Details of how to nominate and other election information will be supplied at the end of July. The election process is being conducted electronically this year, so everyone taking part is encouraged to have an email address, although the paper alternative will still be available.

- The closing date for nominations is 1 September.
- Voting will run between Friday 17 September and Friday 8 October.
- Details of those elected will be displayed on our website and shared via eNews, week commencing 11 October.

This is an exciting opportunity to have an impact on the future of the Church of England at a national level.
