Minister's Musings.

Dear Friends,

I wonder if everything feels to you a bit like déjà-vu all over again? It is getting cold and there is precious little daylight. Moreover, we have just been told of a new coronavirus variant which means we are to be stricter in complying with the various protections in place, with no real sense of whether or when further protections will be reintroduced. Many of us will have hoped that Christmas 2021 could be celebrated much more fully than last year...and whilst that is still a real possibility, there is now an element of doubt. We enter Advent (and Christmastide) on shoo-gly ground that feels both familiar and yet strange.

Disconcerting as this is for us, it is perhaps how we might enter Advent every year. For we know it comes every year. We know it starts 4 Sundays before Christmas. We know roughly how long it will last and what the outcome is. Yet, each year, we are somehow different. We are different for the life we have lived over the previous 12 months and, God willing, will have been formed a little more in the likeness of Christ. And so, our preparations for the coming of Christ—as a baby, in our lives, at the end of time—these preparations will look different. Likewise, the meaning of God-with-us, Immanuel, can also be different.

So, however you are feeling just now, ponder that throughout Advent. Notice what feels 'normal' and what feels 'different'. Most especially, be as open as you can to hearing afresh about how God took on flesh and dwelt among us in human form. In all these ways and places, you will be blessed by God; thanks be to God!

We are, however, still working with MNMT towards a Mission Plan for our parishes, which needs to be presented to Presbytery in draft form by March 2022. Whilst there might not be a formal linkage between us, the links are still there and need to be strengthened.

We are looking for a Chairperson and Deputy for the MPC Management Team

The Management Team is being set up to manage the various day to day functions in the church therefore allowing the Minister and Parish Assistant to be able to fully carry out their roles, knowing that the necessary support functions will be taken care of.

The Team will be supported by sub-committees for specific functions within the Church but would be a standing committee responsible to Session with the authority to make day to day decisions.

It is envisaged that this committee will meet monthly, with specific meetings being additionally held on an "as required" basis.

The Chairperson and their Deputy will support the Management Team by:

- Chairing Management Team meetings.
- Working with the Management Team to produce an annual plan for approval by Session.
- Supporting the team members in their roles.
- Being the point of contact for the Church Management Team.
- Ensure clear and co-operative communications with Kirk Session and Minister.

If you have good interpersonal skills, a knowledge of how the Church of Scotland operates, a strong drive to enable the Parish Church family in Monifieth to thrive and grow, we would like to hear from you!

This will be a developing role for an initial fixed term of 3years, would suit people who have the confidence to chair meetings, have good communication skills and the ability to prioritise.

It is hoped we can start to form this committee in the New Year.

Future Structure Group

The Future Structure Group has been formed by the Kirk Session to look at the management structure of Monifieth Parish Church. The Group is to appraise all the various committees that presently look after the affairs of the Church and to streamline and put in place a structure which will satisfy the governance of a modern Church and give responsibility to a number of committees ultimately answering to the Kirk Session. A prime objective will be to remove much of the day-to-day running of the Church from the Minister and Parish Assistant to enable them to more fully concentrate on the spiritual and pastoral side of their jobs. In this regard the Group, consisting of Ron Jack, Jane McArtney, Dave Inglis and Malcolm Bell, in consultation with the Minister, hope to have the new structure in place and fully operational in the first part of 2022.

Initial thoughts are that there should be a Management Team overseeing the operation and suggested sub groups are, Congregational/Community Life, Fellowship, Safeguarding, Social & Fund Raising, Worship and Hospitality. It is our opinion that we should draw up broad remits for these groups, seek volunteers to chair them and then ask the chairperson to recruit no more than 3 members with whom they can work to flesh out their more detailed remits.

Initially the Group are looking to form the Management Team and are looking for volunteers to fill the position of Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson and to this end there is a "job advert" in this edition of Impact. It is stressed that you are not required to be an existing office bearer but that the positions are open to anyone with a knowledge of the workings of the Church. Santa Claus is Covid secure.

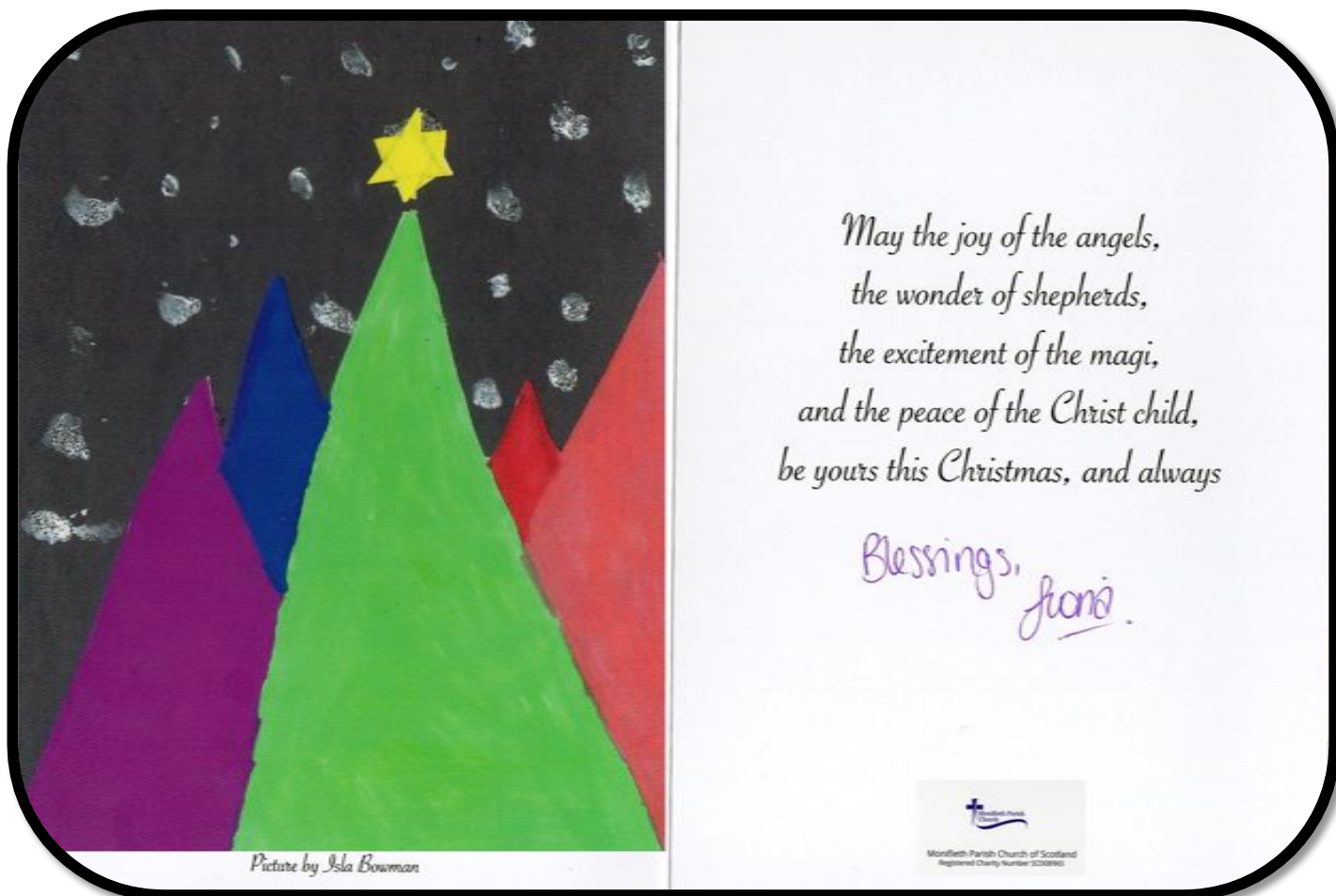
His sleigh is ventilated, the presents are as well.
