### **Back to normal?**

With an eye on the infection rates we are still keeping a few precautions in place in order to try to keep everyone here as safe as possible whilst welcoming many aspects of normality.

\*You no longer need to book your seat each week (*Hooray!*) but we will be keeping an informal register of those who attend, just in case.

\*As yet we are still unable to share Holy Communion or the peace, and we are still unable to put Bibles in the seats, so please continue to bring your own from home if you wish. And we can't pass the collection plate around. But we would encourage you to please make use of the collection plates at both doors.

\*Refreshments will still be served to the tables after the service; not because we need to but because it's one aspect of the precautions that everybody likes!
