Update from Vicar and the Churchwardens re Covid restrictions - May 2021

Hello all. In April we managed to increase church attendance, reintroduce many more live elements to the church service, and start to reopen the Children's and Youth activities. We are keeping all these matters under regular review. Here are our thoughts about what to expect/hope/pray for in May. Further restrictions could be lifted in June if all goes well.

First let us say that many things are NOT expected to change in May, namely: masks, social distancing, hand sanitisation, registration, live music group nor congregational singing. These are all prohibited by law, Government guidance or Church of England requirements. We anticipate provision for online viewing will continue throughout May, although viewing numbers are regularly decreasing as more people attend in person.

However, the following may have some opportunity to restart. Refreshments after service, if taken outside to drink, could be possible. Also the serving of communion bread might be possible. On both of these subjects further advice is being sought.

This short note is to bring you up to date with our thoughts and plans and to remind you all that your health and safety are our primary consideration in these matters.
