How are you feeling this week? Have you got worries and concerns? Perhaps you are feeling anxious about returning to church in person? These are all natural feelings to be feeling especially in these strange times that we are living through. Be encouraged, just as Esther puts it so beautifully. Our God is amazing, hand it to Him, leave it with Him and trust Him.

"Leave all your worries with him, because he cares for you." 1 Peter 5:7 GNB

How do you feel about returning to school next week? Nervous? Excited? Worried? However you're feeling, there is probably something that you're worrying about at the moment. Sadly, it seems that everyone I know is worried about something!

But as this verse says, we can 'leave all our worries' with God. Not 'tell God about our worries' - leave them with him! Give anything that's troubling us to God, trust him to carry that for us, and then move through the day without the weight of that worry. That's often quite difficult to do, but if you manage to do it, it's such a relief!

What's even more amazing is the second part of this verse: 'because he cares for you'. God, who made the entire universe, and has seen the whole life of every single living thing on the planet, cares about me! Sometimes I find it hard to believe that such a big God really wants to listen to my pathetic worries. But he does, and he wants to carry them for me, if I'll let him. And he'll do the same thing for anybody who asks him.

I'd like to encourage you, however you're feeling right now, to talk to God about it. Tell him your worries and leave them with him. If you're not even sure if you believe in God, give it a try. Talk to him! If you want to know if he's really there, tell him that. It's important to remember that there's no one way to chat to God – you can do it however you feel comfortable! You might be surprised by what happens!

The Electoral Roll opened for amendments and additions on Tuesday 1st March 2021. No further additions or amendments for 2021 will be accepted after Wednesday 31st March.

What is the Electoral Roll? The church's Electoral Roll is the register of it's voting members; it is a list of those qualified to attend and to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting. (*Our APCM this year is on Sunday 25th April immediately after the morning service.*) Electoral Rolls provide an indication of the real membership and strength of the Church.

Who can be on the Electoral Roll? Baptised adults (over 16 years who live in the parish, or who have worshipped regularly at St George's for at least 6 months *(unless prevented from doing so by illness)* and are committed to being part of the life of the local Church of England congregation.

Why join? Enrolment is a way of saying...."I belong". For us it is an act of commitment to St. George's Church and the Church as a whole. It opens the way for a greater involvement in the life of the Church at parish, deanery, diocesan and national level.

So if you've started attending St George's, either in person or 'virtually', in the last 12 months please complete an Electoral Roll Application form available from www.stgw.org.uk/about/electoral-roll.php or by contacting the Church Office. **To check that you details are correct** on the Electoral Roll please contact the Church Office. If you need to make any amendments (to change your address, for instance) please complete a new form
