A Holy Remembrance

Remember, remember the 5th of November... It seems that the month of November is filled with occasions for *remembering*. There is, of course, the 5th of November and the thwarting of the gunpowder plot to remember with fireworks and bonfires. But there are also other, more weighty occasions for remembering too. On 2nd November the Christian Church celebrates All Saints Day, in which we give thanks to God for those godly people who have gone to glory ahead of us, whose lives have been an example and inspiration to Christians throughout the ages. We also (in what was traditionally known as All Souls) remember and give thanks to God for our own loved ones who have died. At St Mary's we will hold a Memorial Service on 7th November for all who have lost loved ones, as we remember before God those whom we love but see no more, and pray for comfort and hope, for us who grieve.

We then come to Remembrance Sunday when we as a nation remember together those who have lost their lives in war, and those whose lives were forever changed: soldiers, victims and survivors of war. We remember the sacrifices they made for the freedom we enjoy today, and we commit ourselves to the building of peace, together.

At the centre of all our remembering is Jesus, who told his disciples to remember him in the breaking of bread and the sharing of wine, and who is present with us as we do this today. Through him we are able to remember with *hope*: hope in the Cross, as, through his death the power of sin and evil was broken, and the fulness of his kingdom will bring true peace and reconciliation; hope in the presence of his Spirit with us, who comforts and strengthens us in our grief and trouble; hope in the resurrection of Christ, through which we too receive the promise of resurrection and fulness of life in his presence.

Remember, remember... with humility, with thankfulness, and with hope in Jesus, our Saviour and King.

The Disaster's Emergency Committee UK (DEC) brings together 15 leading UK aid charities to raise funds quickly and efficiently at times of humanitarian crisis overseas.

In these times of crisis, people in life-and-death situations need our help and our mission is to save, protect and rebuild lives by working with the communities affected.

Pooling our resources to work as one, we are pivotal in co-ordinating the UK public's response to overseas disasters. In collaboration with our Rapid Response Network of national media and corporate partners, we raise the alarm to the UK public by launching high-profile appeals and setting up easy ways to donate.

And we have immediate impact, getting help to people who need it, fast.

When we launch an appeal, we use a set of criteria to decide when we launch an appeal in response to a disaster overseas and ensure we work effectively.

We only launch when we know that we can make a difference and add value to the work already being done by our member charities.

Our three criteria for launching an appeal help ensure that the DEC launches the right appeals at the right time.

Our three appeal criteria are:

1. SCALE

OFFICIAL

The disaster must be on such a scale and of such urgency as to call for swift international humanitarian assistance.

2. CAPACITY

The DEC's member charities, or some of them, must be in a position to provide effective and swift humanitarian assistance at a scale to justify a national appeal.

3. SUPPORT

There must be reasonable grounds for concluding that a public appeal would be successful, either because of evidence of existing public sympathy for the humanitarian situation or because there is a compelling case indicating the likelihood of significant public support should an appeal be launched.

The DEC has launched and emergency appeal to support the people of The Middle East and the British Government will match all donations up to £10million. Please support the coffee morning, all donations will be matched by the government.

Please pray for peace in The Middle East:

O God of all hope and peace, we bring to you the needs of our broken and hurting world.

Our hearts are breaking with images of lives lost and torn apart by grief in Israel and Palestine.

We pray for an end to violence and warfare so that the challenging work of rebuilding may begin.

Help us, O Lord, to affirm our common humanity so that in our differences we may build together for justice and peace.

In Jesus Christ, our Lord.


