### **Advent Observance in the Benefice**

We thought it would be good to share some reading and reflections during Advent within Walbury Beacon Benefice this year and are suggesting that we adopt Canon Arthur Howell's *'The Little Book of Advent'* to read 'together'. This 'little book' offers reflections from many well-known Christian authors, Old and New Testament Bible readings and prayers from various sources – one of each for every day from Advent Sunday until Christmas Day. As it is noncontinuous, the occasional missed day does not result in a flurry of guilty 'catching-up' – something I'm sure we have all exp

Because 'together' can be a powerful way to remind us of Christian community, we are also proposing forming a virtual 'Advent Group' so that those who wish can share via email any comments or responses to what we have read. If you would like to be part of this, please contact <u>jennyveasey@hotmail.co.uk</u> and I will create an email group to communicate with each other via Reply All. For this aspect, you would therefore need to be comfortable with this type of interaction; but if not, you can still join in, and read independently – while knowing you are part of a wider 'congregation' – or share your thoughts only with your own friends.

The book is widely available for under a fiver in a number of different formats including large print from Eden, Kindle, e-book or just plain ordinary from Smiths, Amazon etc.

In many of our churches we light candles on the Advent Wreath week by week. This year, let's share that at home, and show the Christ Light in our villages, by placing a lighted candle in our windows at 6:00pm on Advent Sunday and each Sunday thereafter until (and including) Christmas Day.

As in previous years, the national Church will work with dioceses and churches to make a range of digital and print content available, branded with the **Comfort and Joy** theme:


#### Reflections

There will be weekly reflections published on social media and available by email and app for each Sunday of Advent. We have partnered with a number of public figures to produce short reflections exploring the theme. **Comfort and Joy: Nine Lessons and Carols for Christmas** mirrors the structure of a traditional carol service, exploring both biblical texts and the words of much loved Christmas carols.

The reflections for each day from Christmas Day to 2 January feature contributions from **Kate Bottley**, **Jonathan Bryan**, **Bob Chilcott**, **Martha Collison**, **Stephen Cottrell**, **Guli Francis-Dehqani**, **Chine McDonald**, **Sally Phillips and Justin Welby**. The booklet is introduced by the Archbishops and has been edited by the Ven. John Kiddle, Archdeacon of Wandsworth, author of the best-selling *God With Us: Your Christmas Journey*.

They will also be made available freely via audio, smart speaker, as well as via app and email formats with accompanying prayer activities for children and families.

Working with the Archbishop of York's Youth Trust and the Evangelism & Discipleship team, we will also produce a series of youth reflections in December.
