believe that this was God's Plan A for us. An unlikely candidate was one of several who agreed to be baptised before we went into lockdown.



Recently, this candidate phoned me to say he still wanted to be baptised and my dream is to baptise him shortly after we return to the building even if social distancing rules may mean that I have to sprinkle him rather than fully immerse him.

What is the moral of my story? Simply, that we can't always follow through on God's plan A. Sometimes, we mess it up through our own stupidity, but other times, it is because the circumstances change as a consequence of God's permissive will.

Has lockdown delayed some of your plans? Perhaps, you are frustrated because they seemed to be God-honouring plans. Let's recognise that God is, generally, in less of a hurry than we are, so don't despair, and don't be surprised if those plans do actually fall beautifully into place... eventually!

#### **Prayer Walking**

"And so I walk in the Lord's presence as I live here on earth!"

Psalm 116:9

Prayer walking can mean different things for different people at different times.

It can mean walking in nature, going to the country



and experiencing the awe of God.

Many people feel a strong connection with God when immersed in his creation. Walk with God, be open to him speaking, and enjoy the beauty of the world God made for

you. Ask God to heighten your senses—listen to the bird song, bees buzzing round, animals in the fields; watch the clouds move across the sky, the butterflies fluttering by, the plants bending in the breeze; notice the different smells, good and bad, as you walk. Experience God's presence.

### **Praying as Jesus Prayed**

In this series we look at the prayer Jesus taught his disciples. This week we consider what Jesus meant by......

# And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

When we pray these words we aren't suggesting God tempts us—he doesn't—we are praying for protection. Protection from the temptation to sin and protection from the devil.

We are asking God to give us the strength to stand up to the things that tempt us to sin. There are a lot of things that tempt us, some of which we don't even realise have led us into sin.

We need to be aware that there is a force acting against God, ready to tempt us away from him, taking our attention and focus off God, and placing distractions in our path.

Or, prayer walking can be walking the streets in your neighbourhood. Ask God to show you what to pray; pray for the people in the houses you walk past, pray for people you see, and pray for businesses you pass. You can do this on your own or,

perhaps more effectively, with a prayer partner. You can pray out loud or pray quietly. Pick up clues from what you see, and pray what God puts on your heart.

And, thirdly you can 'walk and talk' - pray as you normally pray but do it as you take your daily exercise, wherever that happens to be, walking round the streets, in your garden, by the River Sowe, simply talk to God as you go - your unseen companion on every journey.
