Words of wisdom from our Pastor, Mike....

I spent a few days recently walking in Wales. On the cliff paths, everyone was giving other walkers plenty of space to get by. When I thanked one particular walker, she used a Welsh word I know well, croeso, which means welcome or you're welcome. Even though she was using her native tongue, she was communicating in a way that I could understand.

However, it was different when I was driving in South Wales on the M4. A message was flashed up over the road in Welsh only. The same message appeared about a mile further on. There was no English equivalent provided for travellers like me unable to understand much Welsh. I'm guessing that the message was giving information about local lockdowns.

I wondered whether I was indirectly being told that this local problem was not something to concern me. I wondered whether God was using this situation to remind me to focus mainly on the local problems of Coventry rather than thinking too widely about problems in the rest of the UK or the rest of the world.

I think that sometimes we can get overwhelmed by so much need that we become aware of. I think that we should always be guided by the Holy Spirit about the realistic limits of our prayers rather than spreading our prayers around too thinly.

For instance, during some past evangelistic events, we were encouraged to pray every day for just 5 local people we knew to attend the meetings and become Christians. I found I could do that and you probably could pray for 5 non-Christians as well so why not start today?

The same can be true in our spiritual lives. We can be busy 'being Jesus' in the world and praying for other people and yet forget to tend our own needs.


We all need to spend time with God.


Seeing the Bigger Picture...
