September Staff Letter

GO and MAKE disciples

Shortly after I gave my life to Christ, I discovered that there was a whole Christian sub-culture of residential seminars, camps and festivals. It wasn't long before we took the family away at Easter to Spring Harvest and experienced the joy of big celebrations as well as learning more through lots of seminars. These later extended into the summer months as we went along to festivals in Dorset, and then to Faith Camp in Peterborough, which we've been a part of for over twenty years. These camps are a great way to accelerate your understanding of the Christian faith and you don't even have to camp as many have alternative local accommodation.

I had an unusual experience last year at New Wine at Shepton Mallet. The speaker gave a message calling the congregation to get up and go – in other words to take action in reaching out to those who don't know Jesus. As she was speaking, I had this urge to stand up. Given that I was among a couple of thousand seated people and therefore very visible in the large marquee, I decided to play a waiting game. However, I know from previous times when something similar has happened, that it is not simply going to go away. The compulsion continued to grow and it seemed that the Holy Spirit was on my case. This went on for about fifteen minutes, but I then saw a man stand up further across the marguee. This was all I needed and as I stood to my feet, I saw someone else do so as well. By now, there were three of us standing and the speaker, on seeing us, invited anyone that was sensing a compulsion to come out to the front. I didn't need inviting twice and I rushed to the front climbing over the back of my chair, accidently kicking my wife in the process, and running to the front of the stage. The prayer ministry team prayed for me and I fell to the floor in the power of the Spirit and had a sense that I had received much anointing – and the word, GO.

This year, at Faith Camp, I felt that I should go along to a seminar on Making Disciples. The speaker believed that there was a fresh anointing coming to help the church to make disciples, through multiplication. The speaker was emphasizing the importance of prioritising on three key actions – to Know Christ, to Follow Christ and to Make Disciples. He asked us three questions:

- Does everything I do connect with Jesus' command to Go and Make?
- Am I living as a disciple of Jesus in these three areas?
- Is the church I'm a part of focused on these three areas? It seems as if I've collected my second word, MAKE, to attach to my GO.

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:19 (NIV)



Sunday services. James, 6, has been keeping hens since he was 3 when he asked to have some for his birthday. 'Hutchings Happy Hens' live in a field behind the house. There are now 20

hens which James looks after with his brother Henry, 4. The hens are fed grit to help them build bulk to develop eggs, layer pellets and as a treat corn and worms which the boys pick up after dad has been ploughing. James takes orders from his teachers at St Anne's school, carrying the eggs to school in a basket on the bus. The boys are entirely hands on, feeding, cleaning out and caring for



the hens themselves. This year James won 2nd prize at the North Somerset Show for his eggs, competing in the adult category.
