Car theft in multi storey car parks – it's wrong on so many levels.

During our May All Age service we had a bit of fun – I told a few jokes (including the one above) and performed a highly technical dance move (not!) But what did it have to do with worship?

Well, sometimes as the vicar I feel like I'm being given a score for my Sunday morning performance – how well did I lead the service? How good was my sermon? Did it go on too long? Was it just right this week?

Perhaps others feel it too – musicians, sound desk, singers etc.

But when we come to church to worship our Father, *He* is looking at *our* performance! He is looking at our hearts; He wants to be blessed by *our* worship of *Him*.

All the programmes like the X Factor and Britain's Got Talent – they're great fun but we have to be careful not to treat church and worship like that. We don't come to be entertained, we come to offer our best to God – to worship him with all our heart, not to critically assess the worship (and I know it's easy to do – I do it myself.)

We're bringing our best to him on a Sunday morning: our best intentions, a prepared heart, our focus and attention – so that He enjoys our worship.

From the Rector

Annual Meeting - Ladies Breakfast – Pentecost – Youth Development Worker

Annual Meeting – Our Annual Parochial Church Meeting took place on 27 April in St Martin's Church. As we looked back on 2014 there was so much to be thankful for, particularly around provision. So often, we begin the year with concerns about whether we'll be able to meet our budget, but at the year-end we're celebrating how much we've received! We gave thanks for those who have served as Churchwardens, Treasurers and Lay PCC members and for those who will serve in the coming year.

Ladies Breakfast - The Ladies Parish Breakfast took place in May, in which Elizabeth Alden was welcomed and who gave a very helpful and amusing talk about the delights and challenges of raising four very different sons. There was something for everyone about the constancy and covering of God's love. There will be another breakfast in September.

United Pentecost Service – Languages and Release were the themes of our Pentecost service at St Mark's Church on 24 May. The service began with a drama from Emma and myself illustrating the transformation in the disciple, Peter, and the problems it may have caused in his relationship with his wife! Revd Anne gave a great illustration of the gift of the Spirit and the release of refreshing, confidence, power, wisdom, praise and comfort. There was an opportunity at the end of the service to receive the release of the Spirit.

Youth Development Worker – The WPCC has approved the recruitment of a 'Youth Development Worker' using the existing £44,000 from the Youth Fund and work is going on to produce a Person Specification and an advert.

Last July the staff team began working with Tony Cook (Diocesan Coordinator of Services for Young People) towards identifying the type of roles that are needed. A paid Youth Development Worker is needed to build up a team of lay workers to provide a vibrant ministry to young people. Once a person has been appointed to this position, then it is hoped that work can begin on appointing a volunteer 'Children's Work Coordinator'.

St Lawrence Church, Wick St Lawrence

At the end of April we held a very enjoyable Vision Morning, led by Caroline Bruce from the School of Formation at the Diocese, to think and plan for the future. During the first part of the morning nineteen of us gathered



to think about, why we come to church, why we stay, why we need to plan. What was frequently repeated was the pleasure people get in being part of a church community. During the second part of the morning we looked at four specific areas under the headings: The Building; God Stuff; Encouraging; Hopes and Wild dreams, then decided on our three personal priorities.

What came across clearly is a need for additional space to include kitchen facilities in the form of some kind of extension; to offer opportunities for Bible study and discussion; to add a quarterly morning Holy Communion service as well as our monthly evening Communion; to offer more autonomy to our young people's group; to set up a Wick Facebook page. There were many other great thoughts and ideas about worship, reaching out, and encouraging others which we will be considering over the coming months. Those who couldn't make the morning joined us for lunch at the Ebdon Arms during which the children had a hilarious time playing skittles very noisily!

On a quieter note, Saturday 6 June is our Sanctuary Morning, when we offer the peace and quiet of the church, this month from 10am – 12 noon. Drop in any time, to pray, reflect and renew with refreshments provided. It is often in silence that God speaks the loudest. Think of young Samuel in the night (1 Sam 3: 2-10) of Joseph, earthly father of Jesus, spoken to in dreams and of Jesus who got up in the quiet of early morning to seek out his Heavenly Father. "I have stilled and quietened my soul." Ps 131: 2

Christian Aid Fair

Last month on May 16 we held our Christian Aid Fair at St Mark's.

There was lots of fun and games: Splat the Rat always goes down well, and don't forget the Fishing Game that's become something of an institution!

There was a bouncy castle, car washing, and books and toys were on sale. We had a constant stream of people coming along, and many stayed for quite a while, relaxing and enjoying the refreshments and the friendship.

Using our collective gifts, time and talents from God in this way allowed us to raise a very significant £750 for the work of Christian Aid. So how will this be spent? Read on for one of Christian Aid's many life-changing projects.

Loko's story

Loko dreads collecting firewood, but has no choice. To earn enough money to feed her children one small meal a day, she needs wood to sell.

In the Borena community, girls are expected to fetch and carry wood and water to provide for their family. Denied a good education and the respect of their community, women are trapped in a life of poverty. Christian Aid can provide cows to vulnerable women in Ethiopia – just £150 is enough to buy a cow and a promising future for someone like Loko.
