Dear friends,

We are well into spring at last!

There are lots of bulbs pushing through the cold soil, displaying their green leaves as a precursor to the wonderful flowers that are silently being formed.

A tree in our garden has some early blossom – tiny clusters of delicate white flowers that hint at warmer days ahead.



On reflection perhaps everyone could have just given a £100? But no, the auction was such fun and many of us arrived home with delightful packages and promises as a legacy of a good evening out.

On the 14 March we said a fond farewell to Dorothy Hutchings (nee Parsons) who died at the age of 98. Dorothy was born in Wick St Lawrence in 1917 she went to the village school, and then later senior school in Weston taking the old light railway which then passed through the village. Dorothy and her husband Edgar raised their family on their farm in Wick and then retired in the nineties to a bungalow off Station Road in Worle. Here Dorothy became a regular member of St Martin's church, making many new friends there and in the community. A walk down Worle High Street would take a long time meeting and chatting with everyone she knew. We thank God for Dorothy's life and example and leave her in Jesus' care. She was remembered in the following extract from an ode written for her,

"Dorothy Hutchings, always there – twinkling eyes and silver hair, Happy and contended, welcome smile – come on in and chat a while. She was a loving great-gran, granny, mother, wife, A special friend to everyone – a cornerstone of life."





Easter


Easter is a good time in our parish – a celebration of power and new life!

Visit from St Mark's school children


