# Bishop's Letter

'To be or not to be – that is the question.' Or perhaps we should say 'to stay or not to stay – that is the question'. June 23 is EU Referendum Day and some commentators say it is the most important election most of us will vote in. The difficulty seems to be, for me at



least, to know what the real issues are and how these should be assessed and weighted. Financial, political, economic and social arguments have been presented by both sides and there is seemingly no consensus as to which arguments are the most persuasive or compelling.

In all that I have heard to date, however, there seems to have been too much emphasis upon self-interest ('what we might get out of it') and not enough being said about service and mutual flourishing ('what we can put into it'). Of course, it is important to consider what the impact on staying or leaving would be on the UK but there is another important question which we need to consider - what can we contribute as a nation to the development, security and prosperity of other countries in the world and would that be best served by staying or by leaving?

As we know, opinion polling is not an exact science but analysts seem to agree it might be close. Research suggests younger people are more likely to vote to remain in the EU, while older voters tend to favour leaving. My hope is that we will all make it a matter of focussed and sustained prayer. Let's pray that this will serve to unite rather than divide the UK and, whatever the outcome, that the UK will continue to seek the peace and welfare of all. Let's pray for God's peace and blessing on all the nations of the world.

**Prayer -** During the week leading up to Pentecost, the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby, challenged us to pray through the initiative 'Thy Kingdom Come.' Many of us in the churches committed to praying The Lord's Prayer at 12 noon every day, at home, in their place of work, travelling or wherever they were. As we enter the Team Rector vacancy, why don't we continue to pray this prayer every day at noon and add a short prayer for God's will to be done in Worle Parish. Below is a prayer you may find helpful from the CPAS (Church Pastoral Aid Society) website.

Heavenly Father, as we move into our Team Rector vacancy, would you will help us to share responsibility, grow in faith, love one another, care for those in need, reach out to others, and welcome newcomers.

Lord Jesus, guard and grow this Parish and its four churches during this vacancy. By the power of your Holy Spirit please guide those who are seeking the right minister for us, and those who are seeking the right church for their ministry, that together we may discover your way for the future and see your kingdom grow. Amen

Archdeacon Andy Piggott will be joining us at our WPCC meeting on Wednesday 8 June to offer his guidance and advice as we move into the vacancy.

Celebrate - At our Joint Parish Pentecost service lead by Rev Paul Larcombe at St Mark's Church on Sunday 15 May, we celebrated over twenty children who came forward to receive their first communion. The sight of so many youngsters wanting to grow closer to God was both touching and powerful as was the support from their parents, people from their churches and sponsors. The children each received a certificate, candle and small book of prayers. In the preparation for this service, our four churches have contributed to a colourful paper wall, beautifully assembled by Rachel Rooke. Some 'bricks' had an individual's testimony of the meaning of communion written on them, others were blank. In her talk Reader Yvonne Criddle explained that there is always room for more, we are a living wall, not a barrier, continuing to be built into the body of Christ. As the wall is portioned out for each church, we are invited to 'add' to the wall.

We also celebrate our Friday evening 'Parish Wide Youth Group' which takes place at St Mark's Church, ably run by Mark Fuller and a team of helpers. 12-14 children in school years 6 - 7 have been coming along for an hour and a half of activities, games and spiritual input. Any support of prayer, finance and the ability to reach out to young people would be much appreciated.
