Parish Prayer and Prayer for Youth

Parish Prayer - Archdeacon Andy Piggott came to the WPCC meeting in June to talk us through the vacancy process for a new Team Rector for Worle Parish. He was accompanied by Caroline Bruce, a Parish Consultancy Officer for the Diocese, our new Rural Dean Lydia Avery and Deanery Lay Chair Mike Tedstone who have all offered us their help and support during the vacancy. Archdeacon Andy said prayer must be our priority, that we are not in the recruitment business we are doing Kingdom business; the God who loves us will lead us and guide us. It's difficult to say how long the vacancy will last, it could be up to twelve months. A small team will be pulled together to begin drawing up a Parish Profile and two members of the WPCC will be chosen to represent the parish during the interview process. Caroline Bruce has offered her expertise in pulling together the profile and helping us discern a vision for Worle Parish. Part of this is likely to be a vision day to which everyone will be invited, at a date to be advised. To this end we will be holding monthly Parish Prayer round the churches and in smaller groups at other times. This is not only to pray for the right person to become our Team Rector but also to pray for our Parish and to ask God's blessing on all who live and work in Worle and Wick St Lawrence.

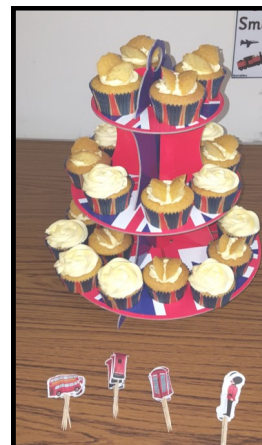
