EAT SLEEP..... REPEAT!

I wonder if you've ever seen these logos on mugs, t shirts or maybe on facebook. It often feels like our lives are one continuous cycle of repeated activity. I wonder what you would put in the 'film' space – EAT, SLEEP,..... repeat. What takes up your waking hours, maybe it's watching TV, or working late? Maybe it's picking up a teenager from yet another night out? Maybe your day is filled with boredom and your blank space would be filled with facebook or Instagram, or maybe the daily shop. Whatever it is, sometimes it feels like it would be good to do something a little bit different. Maybe take a break, or maybe something which help you to make sense of your life?

The slogan on this mug reminded me that in the hum drum cycle of daily repeats, God is interested in my life, and is there through the mundane, the necessary and the challenging times. I pray that you will know God's blessing at this time of year, knowing his presence and his love to help you and your family in all your joys and challenges.




