Exploring Faith

As I write this I am home alone whilst my husband, Howard, is sailing around the coast of Britain in the footsteps (or should that be the wake?) of the Celtic Saints. He is immersing himself in how the story of Jesus was brought to Britain all those years ago



and taking the opportunity to see how life is lived in those coastal communities today. He is sharing in conversations about what faith in Jesus means for us in 2018.

My travels are rather more local than Howard's but I encounter the same desire to see what it means to be a Christian in Britain today. One of the themes that often emerges is that people want to become more confident in their own faith before they try to share that faith with others.

I am saddened by the suggestion that one legacy of centuries of clericalism is that lay people do not believe themselves to be 'authorised to communicate their faith.' Lay people are already living out their faith in their churches and communities without that, the church wouldn't exist! But many of us (and this is true for people who are ordained as well as lay people) are not confident and want to know more and understand our faith better. It's wonderful to know that so many of our churches have home groups, Bible studies and other activities to help, but I also want to commend two courses that the diocese offers and which have new sessions beginning in September. They both have exploring in their title – for good reason: even though this exploring is more armchair than coastal adventure.

Exploring Christianity is for those wanting to learn more about the Christian faith and the Bible and past attendees have found it has really enriched their understanding of their faith and given them greater confidence. *Exploring Spirituality* is more experiential and focuses on different ways of prayer, allowing people to connect with God using a range of Christian traditions, many of which even those who have been church goers for decades, may be surprised to discover.

It maybe that one of these courses is just what you are looking for, or maybe you can think of someone in your church who you could encourage to set sail. We cannot promise a smooth voyage but in the Bible we have an amazing guidebook and in prayer a solid compass to help you along the way.

Dear Worle-Wide Parishioners,

Just an update to thank you all in the Worle Wide parish for the wonderful support and prayer, which you have given me during my first year of training for Ordination. It has made all the difference to know that I have such a loving and caring church family walking by my side.



During the past year, once a month I have been attending for a long weekend of study at Sarum College in Salisbury, and have weekly on-line tutorials. I also have a Local Learning Group and a training minister Rev Dr Gilly. There are 21 other first year Ordinands at Sarum College, from Diocese all over England, of those there are 8 of us from the Diocese of Bath and Wells.

During training we learn about leading various types of service ranging from traditional Sunday worship, evensong, morning and evening prayer through to Celtic and many other types of prayer service. Alongside this we have academic study units. For each unit we are required to write two assignments, one essay based and the other one more practical/research based. This year I have studied: - "Mission and Evangelism, "Human Identity", "Doctrine and History", "Understanding the Bible

"Integrative Practice" (Group work), and "Placement Learning Experience".

I have just finished a placement in Locking Castle Church to learn how worship, ministry and mission are carried out in a different context to my home church of St Martins.

Thank you for all the generous support and encouragement I have been given by Worle parishioners and clergy, in taking part in my training; by answering my countless questions, giving interviews, wise advice, endless s patience, and kindly listening to my stumbling efforts.

I feel very grateful to have had a challenging and yet wonderful first year, and long for the time to come when I can give some of this training back. Now as I enter my second year of training, which will be preparing me for Ordination in Wells Cathedral, next year 2019, Peter-tide,

I ask that you kindly continue to keep me in your prayers and please do know that you too will be in held in my thoughts and prayers.

Grief Café Space @ St. Martin's

On Wednesday 25 July 2.30pm-4pm, during the summer holiday, St Martin's will be offering a Safe Space at our "Grief Café" for anyone who is experiencing bereavement. This may be very recent or an experience from a number of years ago.

All will be very welcome to come to think and talk about anything frightening you or worrying you about grief and grieving.



When someone we know has died, it can leave us in turmoil and denial, we may feel deeply sad, lonely, afraid, angry, or we may experience relief,

release and many other puzzling or upsetting feelings.

Sometimes it is good to just be in a Safe Space, enjoy a cup of tea and speak or think through those very human fears and feelings.

We will meet for 1 hour 45 minutes. You will receive a welcoming soft drink and biscuits. There will be a short explanation of how the "Grief Café" will run and then an opportunity to sit in small groups of 3 to 4 people and talk in total non-judgemental safety and confidence using some straightforward and helpful conversation starters.

It is hoped that by the end you will have had the opportunity to voice your fears and concerns and been affirmed and supported in a totally confidential Safe Space of the "Grief Café".

You will be feeling comforted and know that you are not in isolation but have others who care and are walking that hard path of bereavement by your side.

We look forward to welcoming you.

On Saturday 16th June we handed out approximately 100 chocolate bars to "dads" in our community for Father's Day. We gathered in the Quadrangle by the shops and it was good to give a free gift to people and continue to let them know that there is a Church here in their community for them! On what is a special day for a lot of people but also a difficult day for others! We invited children and their dads to "pot a plant" together, we provided all that they needed and this proved to be very popular with dads and children alike. We had Giant games for children's to play and refreshments were available inside our church. Again we had lots of great conversations with people and further "seeds were sown". We pray that God will continue to develop this outreach and people will continue to be blessed by it.

On Sunday 8th July, we will be welcoming Dave Hopwood to our Church. He will be speaking during our All-Age Service and then staying for our "bring and share lunch" to chat with people.

Dave visited us last year and was brilliant, we all really enjoyed his very funny and clever interpretation of the parable of the Lost Sheep! Dave is gifted in telling the Gospel through drama and mime and very engaging. Please do join us. In the afternoon, Dave will be spending time with our COSMIC leaders and helpers to give them ideas and resources for working with our children.
