I myself have been using the Church of England's "Watch & Pray" Lenten App, an

was particularly struck last week, right at the start of the 40 days of study by the daily reflection of "God in darkness" and we were asked to 'be open to seein darkness, as somewhere God is at work!' We were reminded of how God's great work of creation began in the hidden and the unfathomable, and that far from always being bad, darkness is often where God's most mighty work is done.

My husband and I hosted two young Ukranian refugees for a year in 2022/23 an the nation has become very dear to our heart. We have and continue to pray fo the peace of that land but I was recently told of a great movement of God withi Ukraine that is happening despite (and maybe 'because' of) the darkness and desolation of the war there.

That darkness and desolation is turning people towards God in huge numbers and so many people are coming to know Him in a personal and relational way through

His son Jesus, that they don't have enough churches or pastors and Bible teachers to meet the needs of the numbers who are coming to faith. I am then reminded that our God is still at work in the darkness, He is the light that the darkness can never extinguish!

What a great God we worship and serve.



Caring for Creation gathering in Penzance – Feb 2024

It was a misty, damp day – but not cold, windy, or raining! (The heavens opened in the afternoon!) Our spirits, however, were not dampened as we gathered in Penzanc for a time of songs, readings, prayers and reflection. We were a small but noticeable band of people – representatives from Madron Church, Madron Chapel and St Mary Church, Pz. Many passers by heard our cry to look after creation, to speak up and hold leaders accountable for their actions (or inactions).

Our Genesis Rhyme Reading told of the wonders of our world and we prayed that w might look after it rather than exploit it, and treat everyone in it justly and fairly. As la reminded us, we must not only give thanks for our world but also speak out against its abuse.

Our gathering was timed to coincide with the current vigil in London, 'Against fossil fuels'. The former Archbishop of Canterbury Lord Williams called for urgent action to address climate change as hundreds of Christians took part in the 10 day vigil outside Parliament, calling on the government to stop issuing licences for fossil fue exploration in UK waters. Previously he had said, 'Every day that passes increases the urgency of action on the climate crisis. In Lent, Christians remember that they ar part of creation, not lords of creation'. 


Prayer Focus

Shrove Tuesday Pancake Fundraiser

A fabulous time was had when I visited All Saints Church, Marazion last week or Shrove Tuesday. Church Warden Julia together with support from Rev Sophie, was busy whipping up amazingly light and airy pancakes and cooking them on a couple of camping stoves within the church. It was a fabulous event that ran from 10.30 to 3pm and was well supported, with good numbers of people popping in, enjoying freshly made to order pancakes together with an equally marvellous range of toppings and a hot cup of tea or coffee.

The Shrove Tuesday event was all part of the Mount's Bay Lenten Appeal, to rais much needed money for 'Solar Aid'. 590 million (!!) people live without electricit across sub-Saharan Africa. After dark, work stops and the only option is to ignite kerosene lamps and paraffin candles which emit toxic fumes into the atmosphere. The Mount's Bay benefice are raising funds to purchase solar light - every one of which, is an instant win for people and for the planet!


