Penwith Deanery Synod

The first Deanery Synod for this year is being organised for the 18th April 6.00pm at Paul. The agenda will focus on the Deanery Plan progress to date and there will be an opportunity to meet the Deanery Implementation Team. Deanery Synod Members please do put this date in your diaries. We will also use this Synod to publicise the need for a new Standing Committee.

Penwith Rural Dean and part time incumbent for Gulval and Madron

Although the post of Penwith Rural Dean and part time Incumbent for Gulval and Madron sparked interest from around half a dozen clergy from across the country, for various reasons there was not a firm application for the post. Feedback from those who considered applying was along the line that though attracted to the post, after further consideration this was not the right time to move. After meeting with parish representatives of Gulval and Madron and Towednack and Zennor consideration is now being given to the separating out of the two roles for further recruiting of both an Incumbent and a Rural Dean.

Land's End Transition

Ten people, representing the five parishes and two benefices of the proposed Lands End Benefice have been meeting since early January to discern God's vision and the mission and ministry priorities for the benefice. The Statement of Needs will include this vision which is based on the newly formed deanery plan and a profile from each of the parishes, summarising the community in which it is based and the needs and opportunities within those communities. We are looking to advertise throughout May and interview short-listed applications in early-June.

Godrevey Benefice


