A Message from Laura

Last week, the division bell rang in parliament. But instead of MPs dividing for a vote, they kept a minute's silence to remember the death of MP David Amess: a friend and colleague remembered in so many ways. Despite all political divides, all were quiet and respectful, the usual shouts and jeers were silenced by grief.



In November, we turn each year to a time of remembrance. We remember at the start of November 'All Souls', in the first week of November, which is a time to remember all those who have died that we wish to call to mind each year. Then, we move to remember on Remembrance Sunday, 14th November, those who died in war. On Remembrance Sunday, we say the Kohima Epitaph: 'For our tomorrow, they gave their today.'

In the silence that follows those words, more than words can be felt. We know that many of the last people who fought in the Second World War are, or have come to their end. Their stories never told, their actions never honoured. They were called the 'silent generation' and didn't feel the need to share the details of their stories with us. In the silence of the pandemic, without visitors, many more lost their lives. We keep silence for those who have died, for those we remember, for those whose actions might have saved us. We remember all the names on the cenotaph and all those who have died in the covid pandemic and beyond. Join us on 14th November for

Remembrance Sunday.

You may have noticed that we've been doing a little project over harvest time, **Twinning our Hall Toilets!**



What does that mean??

Well, we're helping 2 billion families worldwide who don't have a clean private place to go to the loo. Yes, there are millions in every continent! So we thought that we could do something about that at harvest time.

A charity called 'Tearfund' has set up a universal idea called 'Toilet Twinning'. What this does is enable people like you and me to raise funds to show villages all over the world how to build a new loo. For many communities, hearing about the link between sanitation and health is a revelation: a light bulb moment. Many have never known why diarrhoea is so common, and why their children have fallen ill or died. Suddenly, they understand, and then they want a latrine – that they build themselves - because a family who have built their own latrine is much more likely to use it and look after it. In some places, of course, this approach isn't possible. So in conflict areas or places hit by a natural disaster (such as an earthquake or typhoon), Tearfund do send in people with water and sanitation expertise to dig wells and build latrines.

WHY ARE WE DOING IT?

- 1.7 billion people don't have somewhere safe and hygienic to go to the toilet. (WHO/Unicef)
- Every day, over 700 children under fives die from diarrhoea linked to unsafe water, sanitation and poor hygiene.
- Today, 1 in 4 people around the world lack safe drinking water. (WHO/UNICEF 2021)

- Children worldwide miss 443 million school days each year because of dirty water and poor sanitation. (UN)
- Every year, women and girls spend 97 billion hours finding a place to go. (World Bank)

It costs just £60 to build a new toilet, and soon everyone in the village wants to build one too!

At the harvest lunch we collected money for the lunch and that came to £240. There we are - 4 new toilets for people who will really appreciate it. To show you the toilets we'll be sent a certificate and that will be displayed in our own hall toilets. Have a look and see what we have done together. You should feel flushed!!

A meeting of Hargrave and Huxley Parish Council will be on Sunday **7th November at 5.00pm** in Huxley Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend.

Hargrave and Huxley Parish Council would like to thank all who came along and helped on the litter picking events which took place on Saturday 9th October in Hargrave and Saturday 16th October in Huxley. Ridding our lanes of litter does make our villages more pleasurable to walk, drive and ride around. We hope to carry out the next community litter picking event in the Spring.

The following was received from the Chairman of Tarporley Memorial Hospital and in view of the support our community has given to the hospital over the years, it was thought appropriate to share this.

Message from Tarporley Cottage Hospital

We would like to thank you for all the support that you have given Tarporley Hospital over the years.

It is with a heavy heart, the Trustees of the Tarporley War Memorial Hospital (TWMH) are writing to inform you that they have spoken with all employees to inform them that they are entering into a period of redundancy consultation.

Throughout 2021, TWMH has been attempting to secure a strategic partnership with a partner or partners within the NHS to protect the future of our community hospital. It remains our view that such a partnership is the only realistic solution to the long-term financial and operational challenges faced.

TWMH benefits from some NHS funding, but significantly it relies on donations, fund-raising and legacy contributions to provide for its running costs. Although some donations have continued to come in and these have helped the Hospital continue to support the community, the pandemic has impacted the hospital's ability to fundraise, and many revenue-generating healthcare services have been paused.

The redundancy proposals follow extensive discussions with local commissioning bodies, healthcare providers, and vested political parties in which the Trustees sought financial and operational

guarantees to continue viable operations at the hospital. During these discussions, the Trustees stressed that the end of September was the point at which a decision needed to be made and guarantees given, for operations to be continued.

The Trustees remain eager to seek a longer-term solution for the facility to continue to be used for the provision of healthcare services to the community, ideally with a continued connection to the charity sector. Progress continues to be made to secure this outcome.

However, in light of the expected change in the service model, the high likelihood of new job roles being significantly different to the current roles, and the lack of opportunity to retain staff indefinitely whilst these decisions are made, the decision has been taken to commence redundancy discussions.

The Tarporley facility is a much loved and treasured charity-funded hospital that has provided more than 100 years of care for the village and surrounding region. We are all devastated by this news, and we will naturally be supporting staff as they seek alternative employment opportunities.

On behalf of the Trustees, I would like to personally thank you for your generous support of our hospital and hope that a realistic long-term financial and operational solution can be achieved

Having a Bad Day

Well you can be sure someone somewhere is having a worse one.

A paint scraper, costing pennies, dropped in US nuclear submarine Swordfish jammed the torpedo loading piston in its cylinder. Divers tried in vain for days to remove the item and free the piston. Finally she had to go into a drydock, where the repairs cost over £80,000.

Nor is the Royal Navy immune from "one of those days". In 1966, in the Tamar estuary near Plymouth, HM frigate HMS Ulster's starboard engine control got stuck in Half Astern position. Attempts to free it then jammed it at Full Astern, and the ship accelerated backwards towards a stone jetty. The engine room telephone rang unanswered, so the captain ordered both anchors dropped, and sent an officer to the engine room to take charge. This officer was unable to get more than halfway because he met the ship's company going the other way to emergency stations. The ship hit the jetty at an estimated 8 knots, becoming 7 feet shorter in the process. This compressed the air within the ship, causing the only casualty – a sailor who was halfway through a hatch when he was shot 15 feet into the air, to land neatly on the jetty.

It seems that Jack Tar has form for having a bad day. HM destroyer, HMS Saintes (named after Admiral Rodney's victory over the French at the Battle of the Saintes), in 1947 was having gunnery practice off Portsmouth. Tug Buccaneer towed a target for the practice. Saintes fired one shell, missed the target and sank the tug.

A British submarine, believing that a large ship was hiding against the dark Italian shore, fired two torpedoes. And hit the beachfront Casino.


