

#### Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

A robin sings in the half-light of a frosty dawn. Tucked away in the shadowy tree-tops, a song thrush similarly inspired, practices a few phrases, pausing briefly as though in rehearsal, preparing for a concert later in the spring.

A throng of rooks fly over from their roost in the far woods. They crowd into the upper galleries of two landmark ash trees, huddling into their black coats in the chill air. A jolly party of jackdaws drops down to join them. Tremendous characters with their raucous chatter and engaging ways, I presume breakfast is on their minds. With a clamour of wing-beats, all the birds take off, heading for the nearby fields and feeding grounds.

On this rare morning of blue skies and blazing sunshine, we head up to the hamlet of Axford, turning right along Berrydown lane. Parking near Bermondspit House, we set off for a brisk tramp, following the bridle path that leads up through a delightful wooded valley to Bedlam Bottom, below Farleigh Wallop.

Fortunately the trail is not as soggy or boggy as some we have trekked this winter, merging farther on into a well-surfaced estate track. A row of conifers on the skyline of Nutley Down immediately catches our eye. Bright green in the morning sunlight, they seem adorned with large numbers of a strange fruit. Plump and oval in shape, delicately pink and mauve in hue, we study them through binoculars. They are roosting wood-pigeons, a vast flock, well puffed up and warming themselves after a particularly cold night. They perch quite motionless as we walk on, now scanning the skies for raptors, soaring on the rising downland thermals.

Quite by chance, the familiar profile of a red kite drifts over the treetops. As it passes the pigeons, they all take off in a flap and flurry of wing-beats before diving down into the shelter of the woods.

The kite blithely continues its morning patrol, cruising high overhead and now joined by two soaring buzzards, as we stride away on our winter walk.



#### On the Farm - Julian Gibbons

After a dry November, the rain in December certainly wetted the ground thoroughly. There is a chance we might be able to drill some spring barley and Spring Beans in February, but realistically we will plan for March. We do need the ground to dry out a bit so we can spray off the cover crops. Where the cover has grown well it should have mopped up some nitrogen in the soil, however we have to get them killed off well before spring planting to allow the air to get to the soil and start drying out. Otherwise there is a danger that they hold too much water in the soil, delaying drilling. If we had a run of cold weather some of the less hardy constituents of the cover crop blend would be killed off, but as I write this they are still looking pretty green and healthy.

January saw the annual dinner and presentation of cups for the Basingstoke and District Agricultural society.

Congratulations to Andy Bason and his team at Newhouse Farm who won the best large farmed farm and also won best arable in that class. A credit to the whole team. They also came 2<sup>nd</sup> in Feed Wheat and 3<sup>rd</sup> in Beans, drilled field and cover crop classes.

Preston Farms were 3<sup>rd</sup> in the best large farmed farm and won the prize for best Conservation in that class. They were judged to have the best looking autumn drilled field, They were also 2<sup>nd</sup> in the cover crop class and 4<sup>th</sup> in the feed wheat class.

Moundsmere were 2<sup>nd</sup> in Poppies, Oilseed rape, Winter barley and in the best autumn drilled field.

M.Gibbons and Sons were 1<sup>st</sup> in field of Oats, 2<sup>nd</sup> in Peas, Milling wheat and game-cover, 3<sup>rd</sup> in winter barley.

It was really good to have the competitions running last year having had to cancel them in 2020. However If you think they get dominated by big farms, for the past two years the smallest farm in the competition run by a young husband and wife team on a County Council tenancy have scooped all the top prizes.

We are all pouring over the new Sustainable farming initiative that has been launched and will be open to applications later this spring. This is targeted initially at measures to protect soils and will be at a basic and intermediate level first followed by an advance level later. We will be getting policy announcements pretty frequently over the next few years as all farm support, in the way it has previously been administered, is removed over the next 7 years. We will have to spend quite sometime evaluating the rules and the benefits. On the plus side payment rates for existing environmental management schemes have in many cases increased to improve farmer uptake.

At Christmas we received the output report for the solar farm from the operator and 2021 was below average for output due to the dull summer, backing up our own harvest results.



#### **Summary**

The first two weeks were somewhat unsettled with rain on most days and a few sunny days in between. High pressure dominated the middle of the month and brought dry and dull weather as it trapped-in low cloud. The wet weather returned on the  $23^{rd}$  with drizzle or rain on all but one day thereafter. The temperatures were well above average in the middle and end of the month and on four occasions the overnight figure was higher than the normal daytime temperature for early winter. Warm air from the south west brought the mildest recorded New Years' Eve temperatures here, and  $62^{\circ}F$  was recorded elsewhere in the UK which was the highest recorded since records began in 1854. Overall, the month was mild and slightly drier than normal.

#### The Hard Yard: Sat 26<sup>th</sup> Feb **Chilton Manor Farm** in association with Blended Trails

Last summer Blended Trails organised a very successful half marathon trail race, The Hattingley Half.

Next up on their race calendar is The Hard Yard a 10 mile trail race through the Candovers.

Partnering with Chilton Manor Farm, home to The Yard café and Moonroast Coffee, this will be an inclusive race open to all runners. The 10 mile trail race starts from the farmyard and finishes with a long home straight down the vew avenue.

The farm will provide the perfect spot for an enjoyable and inclusive event with registration, chip timing pods, event assistance, event catering for runners & spectators together with the menu of The Yard café.

Appearing on the running scene in March 2020, Blended Trails is a running community specialising in Pop Up trail routes in the countryside. Founder Ollie Steele-Perkins is no stranger to trail running and competition, and has seen the community grow from strength to strength.

Ollie explains "I set up Blended Trails during the first lockdown in 2020 as a way of helping people discover public access trails in our local area and to encourage them to explore with confidence by marking trails with distinctive black and orange temporary waymarkers. We offered various distances from 5k to 15k for 9 days at a time before removing signage as a part of our 'leave no trace' ethos.

The Pop Ups, as they are known, became popular not just with runners, but walkers and families looking to add interest to their daily exercise and they are a regular feature of the Blended Trails activity, with on average one a month taking place."

Leaving sat nav mounts, suction cup marks on windows or cables on view gives it away that you have left a Sat Nav. smartphone or other device in your car. Even if they can't see the Sat Nav or iPad they might still break in to see if it's stored in the car, out of sight.

#### 8. Tool theft from vans

Vans are often targeted by thieves for the tools stored inside. If you have to leave

tools in a van overnight, it's a good idea to mark them clearly with your name / company name and address using paint pens and seal with a clear lacquer spray. Alternatively, you can use a variety of other property marking systems. Items that are clearly marked are less desirable and more difficult to sell on.

Consider using a lockable cabinet within your van to store tools – a number of security rated products are available. Small cameras are also designed to record inside vehicles. Visit Secured by Design for more details.

You can also take photographs of items of value, make a note of the serial numbers and consider registering them online at a property register site.

#### 9. Park in well-lit and busier areas

It can take less than 30 seconds to break into a vehicle. Parking in well-lit areas and busy streets increases the chances of a thief being seen, so they'll probably steer clear.

#### 10. Take your documents with vou

Having a vehicle's registration and insurance documents could let a thief pretend to be the owner. Which means they could sell it on quite easily. So, never leave any documents in the vehicle.

#### 11. Choose your car park wiselv

If possible, always try to park in well-


lit and staffed car parks or those with a Park Mark safer parking award. To find one, simply check out Park Mark.

Catalytic converter theft

The precious metal in catalytic converters has led to an increase in their theft. Find out what catalytic converter theft is and what you can do about it.

Theft from Vehicles is on in the increase in general. Basingstoke Rural South have reported 15 over the last 3 months. The opinion of the police is that many thefts from vehicles that have occurred have not been reported to them, hence they are not getting a true figure.

#### Prevent theft from a vehicle

Having your car broken into and losing your things to thieves can be very distressing. Here are a few simple steps you can take to keep your vehicle, and what's in it, safe.

#### 1. Always lock it


Fuelling up or popping back into your house to get something are perfect examples of how easy it is to turn your back for a moment and forget your vehicle is unsecured. So get into the habit of locking your vehicle even if you're only going to be away from it for a moment. If your vehicle has wing mirrors that fold in automatically when locked, make sure you lock it properly. Criminal gangs are looking for vehicles like these where the wing mirrors are still out because it is clear to them that the vehicle has been left unlocked.

#### 2. Close windows and the sun roof to prevent 'fishing'

Leaving windows and the sunroof open invites fishing for items through the gap by hand or with, say, a bent coat hanger, which could also be used to unlock a door for them to get in. Thieves can be ingenious. Don't give them the opportunity.

# 3. Secure your number plates with tamper-resistant screws

The easiest way to change the identity of a stolen vehicle or avoid speeding tickets and parking tickets is to fit stolen number plates. Using security screws to attach your vehicle's number plates makes it harder for thieves to get your number.



# 4. Fit locking, anti-tamper wheel nuts to secure alloy wheels

Stolen wheels are valuable, either as parts or for their scrap value. Using locking wheel nuts reduces the risk of your vehicle's wheels being stolen.

#### 5. Secure anything that's on the outside of your vehicle

Anything left on roof-racks, tailgate racks, holiday top boxes or in tool chests are easily stolen when the vehicle is parked. The use of cable locks, padlocks and self-locking tools chests, which are secured to the vehicle, makes them more secure, but still, don't leave things in them if you can avoid it.

#### 6. Take it with you or hide it

Your mobile phone, coins for the car park, sunglasses, packs of medication or other items that can earn quick cash are irresistible to the opportunist thief. Remember, the cost of replacing a window is often much more than that of what's stolen. And it should go without saying that wallets, handbags, purses and credit cards should never be left in an unattended vehicle.

Readers will know, I have been pressing Ministers and local NHS leaders since the launch of the "Get Boosted Now" campaign to bring some **walk-in vaccination** capacity to Winchester. This is to supplement, not replace, the good work our local GP surgeries and pharmacies are doing to get us fully vaccinated and it is needed because it's really important that we have a multi-channel offer for my constituents in places which are easy to access.

The pop-ups, at Badger Farm and the Park & Ride South site near junction 11, reported brisk jabbing early on which is very good to see. We do largely now have a pandemic of the unvaccinated but must remember not everyone in this category is vaccine hesitant or refusers. There are still a number of people who cannot have their next vaccination because of a recent infection and there are, of course, those who are unable to take the vaccine in its' current form because of a health condition.

I have rightly pressed the Prime Minister in Parliament for a long term plan to truly learn to live with Covid – which sets out how we will avoid a damaging panic when the next variant comes along – but am clear that must include how we will support the unvaccinated to do the right thing for themselves and the common good. In my experience, as a former Public Health Minister, people with poor health outcomes often have complex challenges and are excluded from good health in many ways so it's not unsurprising the Covid vaccine is the latest evidence of that. We need to understand a little more and condemn a lot less because compulsion will only work against us in the end. You can watch back all my contributions in Parliament at stevebrine.com/ news.

Secondly, I continue to engage with my colleagues at the Ministry of Defence around the future of **Sir John Moore Barracks** and play my part in the strategic group planning its' future use which met again last month. With the news, revealed in a letter to me from the Minister late last year, its' disposal is now delayed until 2026 we have time to consider even more carefully what it will be transformed into and to make sure our plan for a 25 hectare space nature reserve at Flowerdown becomes a reality. My strong preference re-

### The Wellhouse Lane railway bridge is going to be closed to everyone for 14 weeks until the 15<sup>th</sup> April.

Life will be complicated for many of us until this work (conducted by Cala) ends. But when it does, there will be traffic lights, with push buttons to stop traffic so pedestrians can use the marked paths under the bridge, cyclists too. At off peak times, the traffic lights will be red both sides until someone wants to go through- this will slow speeds into the village. A path will lead from the west side of the bridge to link to Kings Barton cycle path on the development.

Many people ask me how the refugee families are being welcomed here. HCC arranges accommodation, social events, school places, language, culture and driving lessons as well as upgrading skills to UK standards. Over 27 refugee families have been hosted to date by Hampshire, but you may have seen that some prefer to move on 'out of County' because they have family elsewhere in the UK. Well over 300 Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children are also in the County Council's care.

#### A Return to Stanchester




Figure 1 - Trench locations super-imposed over the geophysical plot.

In August 2021, the Basingstoke Archaeological and Historical Society (BAHS) returned to the Roman site at Stanchester for a week's long excavation. Covid had kept us away for a year and the break gave us time to reflect on our findings and to compare our site plans with aerial photographs. The outcome was that we decided to investigate a new area adjacent to our previous excavations with the aim of finding a building. The original plan was to have a very long trench across the area of interest, with socially distanced trowelling in mind. However, the opportunity arose to do a geophysical survey in July and the results, as shown in the plot in Figure 1, seemed to indicate the remains of a long building with a possible corridor along one of the long sides and with a potential wing at one end. This justified a change of plan to put in two trenches, trench L to straddle the front and back of the structure and trench M to start in the middle and to extend over an area where there was suspected wing.




Figure 2- Plan for trenches L and M showing exterior and interior walls and surfaces

Our investigations revealed that there was evidence of a structure still in place, with the remains of two parallel outer walls still in situ above the chalk bed rock to a depth of about 30 cm, enough for two to three courses of flints laid in mortar to be visible. Inside the structure we found the remains of interior walls of a similar construction with rammed chalk areas in between – see Figure 2 for a plan view of the contents of the two trenches.

Our finds included the usual range of Roman pottery and tile. However, whilst working on the interior of the building in both trenches, we were excited to find pieces of painted wall plaster, most of which was a greenish yellow colour, but some of which was of different colours suggesting a frieze. We photographed the plaster fragments in situ before lifting them for further analysis, see Figure 3 for a photograph of some of the plaster fragments in place.

The investigations in the area where there could have been a wing uncovered a lightly mortared band of smaller flints that formed a "dog-leg" across the trench. We think that this is more suggestive of a garden wall than a load bearing structure.

During the course of the week, we started trench N to investigate another area shown up in the geophysics plot as a dark "blob" at one extreme of the building. This turned out to be a complicated jumble of Roman tiles that was going to be difficult to record, so with an eye on the remaining time we decided to leave it in situ for another season. However, as you can see in Figure 4, at the top of the pile was a complete Tegula with a maker's mark which we were able to date to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Century AD.



It was a relief to be working in the field again, the team had a very enjoyable and productive week and the indications are that we have found the remains of a domestic building with several interior rooms. We plan to return in 2022 to do some more geophysical surveys and carry out more work to piece together a plan of the structure.

Our thanks go to Mr and Mrs Marriott for allowing us access to the site and for supporting our investigations.
