



### **Betty Rapley**

Our very good friend and former resident of Cliddesden, Betty Rapley, passed away peacefully on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> February, at Beech Tree Care Home in Overton, at the age of 93.

Her funeral service will be held at St Leonard's Church, Cliddesden on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> April at 11am.

Betty was a key figure in our village for many years including being instrumental in fundraising for and the building of our lovely village hall.

We hope to include more information in the next Hill and Dale issue/ Cliddesden Newsletter issue about Betty's life.

### Financial giving and spending.

In late January David Chattell hosted a meeting with Colin Harbidge the head of the Winchester Diocese Finance team, who gave a presentation about the Diocese finances and Common Mission Fund (CMF) including how money is raised and how it is spent. What follows is a brief summary of the presentation, the full slide presentation is available on the Benefice web site.

The Diocese of Winchester is divided into 13 deanery's and covers an area from Basingstoke to Bournemouth and Southampton, Within the Diocese there are 100 church schools, 367 church buildings, 867 authorised ministers. About a quarter of the ministry team are funded and supported by the Diocese, and this includes stipendiary posts as well as house for duty posts and the rest are self supporing including over 400 with 'Bishops Commission for Mission'.

The Benefice of Farleigh Candover and Wield is part of the Deanery of Alresford, which has the greatest percentage of its population attending church (2.9%), and partly due to its size and rural location it has the highest ratio of clergy to population: 1:3,290 compared to Southampton where the ratio of clergy to population is 1:13,866 and where 0.7% of the population attend church. The average church weekly attendance over the whole Diocese is about 16,300 from a total population of 1.25 million, but there are large variations across the different Deanery's.

One of the strap lines of the CofE is 'A Christian Presence in every Community'. But that will vary and needs to be appropriate for the community in question. Going forward this may well need to change.

Infrastructure The total workforce and pool of members has reduced by about 40% in 20 years, so the decline in attendance has been happening for over 20 years. Over the same period the burden of operations, compliance and governance has increased (Safeguarding, data protection, financial management, etc) alongside the increase in the population that we serve. That means that the percentage of our workforce that we are investing in administration, operations, and governance rather than mission ministry and outreach is increasing every year. BUT the number of individual parishes has broadly remained static, and the number of church buildings has barely reduced.

The reduction in clergy numbers in this diocese began in early 2000s, not because we wanted to save money, but because there weren't enough clergy across the country. We even had a policy to replace stipendiary clergy with paid laity for many years, mainly because there is a shortage of people coming forward for ordination, which has led in recent years to the need to cut posts.

In summary this mean that we are asking a smaller group of people to do more every year.

Telephone: 07860 575990 Email: ianking47@btinternet.com **Financial.** The average giving in 2003 was £7.90 compared to £17.02. Whilst that is a 215% increase it represents an average increase of 46p per giver per year or less than 4p a month.

Almost 78% of the Diocese annual income comes from Parishes, CMF and fees and this amounts to £9.1M. The rest comes from investments, rental income or grants and 80% of the income goes directly back to support local ministry, schools and churches.

Many PCCs are not able to pay the requested CMF and so the Diocese is responding by reducing its total request by £700k this year. In addition, there has been a programme of house sales to provide additional income to bridge the shortfall to support the cost of stipendiary posts. However, supporting income by selling assets is not sustainable and hence it is projected that with a continued 40% decline in church attendance and an aging population there will be a £1m deficit by 2030.

Whilst this is not inevitable it is based on the risks and challenges that the church is facing. So, the challenge is to try new things and consider different ways of working.

Colin concluded by assuring us that the good news is we have time. We know these are the risks and the challenges we need to face and that gives us the chance, under Bishop Philip's leadership and trusting in the Holy Spirit to find a new future – one of hope, humility, and joy.

### **GO GLIDING AT LASHAM**

Lasham Airfield was completed in 1942 and during World War Two, it served as a base for many squadrons including Spitfires, Hurricanes and Typhoons. Gliding became established at Lasham in 1951 and in 1959 Lasham Gliding Society signed a long lease with the MOD. Lasham Gliding Society is now one of the largest gliding clubs in the world. Over 220 gliders are based at the airfield with about 800 members. In 1999 Lasham Gliding Society (LGS) completed the purchase of the airfield from the Ministry of Defence.

The airfield is in constant use throughout the year and regularly hosts national and regional gliding championships. It is recognised as a world class training club, running courses for beginners to advanced racing cross country pilots. Many of the British team members are trained and still fly at Lasham. Gliding is a sport open to everyone, young and old. It's possible to go solo at the age of 14 and we have members still flying into their 80's. To encourage more women to try flying there is a national Women's Go Gliding weekend on April 27/28<sup>th</sup>. So come along and try something new, see the details on the adjacent poster.







### Hello From Claire

All hail the merry gardeners! Yesterday it rained, tried to snow, the sun shone, the clouds made the sky look black, and there was a hailstorm! Our plans and hopes can be turned in an instant just by looking out the window. We are the most adaptable, resilient, and determined folk when it comes to preparing and

nurturing our green space. Hats off and hoorah to us all This month we are having a look at herb – Rosemary. Rosemary– Rosmarinus officinalis – family: Lamiaceae

Another evergreen shrub, Rosemary has always grown wild around the Mediterranean coasts, reaching a height of 6ft, but very slowly. The pale blue flowers are said to have taken their colour from the cloak of the Virgin Mary when she draped it over a Rosemary bush to dry. The Greeks and Romans would twine it in their hair



as they believed it would 'quicken the mind and aid with memory. It was also carried at weddings and funerals, and used as a strewing herb as it was thought to have disinfectant qualities. A strong-smelling herb, thriving on poor soil and little water, it has many uses, and is a firm favourite with bees and insects.

Known mainly as a flavouring for lamb, Rosemary can add flavour to other meat dishes, with fish such as halibut, and to add an unusual flavour to fruit salad, wine and with eggs, cheese, and jams.

Rosemary needs hot sun, with added lime and good drainage. Growing from seed is possible, but very slow, so taking cuttings from a mature plant, or purchasing a small one to grow on, is a better option. Take small side shoots approx. 6" long and plant in sand. Rosemary can grow equally well outdoors or indoors, however may need protection in the winter months.

Sow seed in early Spring under glass, transplant in late Spring to open ground. Sage grows rather slowly but should be a good size by the end of the first season.

Medicinally Rosemary is good for the digestion and stimulates the circulation. It can also relieve nervous headaches and colds. Make an infusion of the leaves as a hot drink. This infusion can also be used as a rinse for dark hair to deepen the colour.

A muslin bag of the leaves can be added to the water for an invigorating bath. And the fresh leaves are good as an application for stings and bites.

Something to try: Herb Cushions, Herb Sachets, Moth Bags

Rosemary can be combined with other strong-smelling herbs to perfume linen, scent rooms, and deter moths. Use fine material such as cotton lawn and make

### TRAFFIC ALERT FOR BASINGSTOKE!!!!

CAGE wants all residents in the Basingstoke area to know that there is a third Planning Application (PA) (23/03120/FUL) in process for an 8-warehouse site on 100 acres of open farmland next to junction 7 of the M3. The site is known as Oakdown Farm.

Should this PA get approval it will mean 2.5 vehicles, (including cars, HGVs, vans etc.) will enter the warehouse site every 1 minute. Given the traffic problems in the area from existing and future housing developments including Many Down South, the traffic on M3 as well as the road system in and around Basingstoke will increase considerably.

There are no plans to improve junction 7 nor will there be any new roads on the west of Basingstoke to improve traffic flows.

### Benefice Recipes

Hello all, hopefully we will have had some better weather by now. Ideally warmer but I think drier would be more welcome.

A couple of recipes this month from our neighbours Vicky and Ray, I can vouch for both recipes working and being delicious.

### The Ultimate Flapjack

You will need
175 g Butter
175 g Demerara sugar
2 generous tablespoons of golden syrup
225 g Rolled Oats
Pinch of salt optional

### Method

Line a shallow 18x27cm tin and turn oven to 160c / 140c fan / Gas 3 Put the butter, sugar, syrup and (salt if using it) into a saucepan and melt gently. Take pan off when melted and add the oats and stir well. Spoon the mixture into the tin and smooth the top over. Bake on the middle shelf for 25 minutes till golden brown. Leave to stand for 19 minutes before cutting and leave to cool in the tin.

I can never seem to get flapjacks right, but this works for me, as does a drizzle of melted chocolate over the top while they cool.

### The next recipe if for Spreadable Butter.

Let a 200 g of Anchor butter come to room temperature then beat with an electric mixer, drizzle in 145 ml of oil (I've tried both sunflower, light olive oil and they are lovely) and 4-5 tbsps room temperature water. Beat for about a minute until you have a smooth mayonnaise like consistency. Pour into a tub and refrigerate. That's it 400g of spreadable Anchor for the price of a block.

local economy, the quality of the environment and contribute towards the County Council's commitment to tackling climate change. This provision for Hampshire's infrastructure, including more school places, improving roads and bridges and investing in the fabric of Hampshire's older people's social care estate, is one of the largest in the country, and brings the County Council's four-year total investment in the fabric of Hampshire to £1.4 billion, providing a huge boost to the local economy through jobs, skills and construction.

### 3. Transforming in-house care for older people

I have referred previously to the proposed changes to how the County Council operates its in-house care homes for older people. The plan is to focus on specialist nursing and complex dementia care, as well as short term pre and post-hospital support, to better meet the needs of the county's ageing population.

These plans have now been approved, comprising a £173 million investment programme. It will increase the overall number of beds available to local people from 900 to 1,000, within a reduced network of 13 homes. Approving these plans secures the long-term future of our in-house homes, ensuring they remain in the Authority's ownership — in stark contrast to the many other local councils who have sold their homes in recent years.

### 4. New Local Transport Plan approved.

The County Council's new local transport plan (known as LTP4) has been approved. Its aim is to boost economic prosperity, reduce carbon pollution and help promote healthy lifestyles and build stronger communities over the next ten years. It is guided by two principles, widening the choice of travel options that people can use and providing a transport system that puts people first and creates high quality and prosperous places.

### 5. Schools

Funding of £5.9 million has been approved by the County Council to help more parents access childcare before and after school, following a grant from the Department for Education. This will enable the provision of childcare which 'wraps around' the school day, enabling parents and carers of primary school-aged children to access and pay for term time childcare from 8am-6pm. The scheme will start in September this year and run for two years.

In separate school news, 90.71% of the 14,587 online applications for a secondary school place in September have been offered a place in their first preference school, whilst more than 98% were offered one of their top three preferences.



### **CPRE North Hants District Group**

The team thought you would like to know what we have been involved with during January, February and March.

Basingstoke and Deane Draft Local Plan - the response to the Draft Local Plan consultation has been the focus of recent activity. Support from a planning consultant, to apply our responses to the position statements of CPRE Hampshire, allowed us to concentrate on individual sites detailed in the plan. We have objected to the proposed 'garden village' at Popham airfield but supported the development of a 'brownfield site' at Overton Mill. We also objected to the inclusion of warehousing at junction 7 of the M3 in the Local Plan and will be objecting to an application for 245 houses at Skates Lane, south of Tadley, a site which was excluded from the draft Local Plan.

Cliddesden Neighbourhood Plan Valued Landscapes – the response highlighted the importance of valued landscapes and stressed the significance of inclusion within the plan and, indeed, all neighbourhood plan. These areas of countryside must be protected along with the content; take into account the criteria set out in the Landscape Institute's 2021 guidance on assessing landscape value outside of national designations (TGN 02/21). Heritage, Cultural Heritage, Landscape condition, Distinctiveness, Perceptual (Scenic, Wilderness, Tranquility), Functionality (important farmland) and Recreational.

We have made comment on:

**Local councils serving North Hampshire** - continue to plan to build more and more new houses, becoming new towns! The Government's faulty housing algorithm (standard mythology) places councils in a difficult position. The number of houses required to be built each year as a directive of the Government, on green fields, important farmland, and with no real attention to water supply, waste water/sewage, electricity, infrastructure, schools, doctors, wildlife etc. is nonsensical. **Speculative development needs to be stopped** — unplanned piecemeal development is doing so much damage to our already stretched infrastructure.

Brownfield sites and high-rise building techniques (where appropriate) should be prioritised over destroying countryside, landscapes and farmland which is needed for food production. The Prime Minister, recently stated at the Farmers Conference, about the huge importance of farmland for food production in this country and how the countryside is, also, essential for recreational purposes for the wellbeing of all.

Green Belt countryside loss has tripled since 2012 – the countryside needs our protection now more than ever. If you are not a member of CPRE then please do consider joining us and help to protect our green belt before it is too late. ### Juliet Henderson Hampshire County Councillor

Hampshire County Councillor report March 2024

1. County Council Budget Consultation

I talked about the ongoing consultation on the County Council's future services in my last report. That consultation is seeking Hampshire residents' views on proposals to change and reduce some local services and help the Author-

ity address a £132 million budget shortfall faced by April 2025. :https://www.hants.gov.uk/aboutthecouncil/haveyoursay/consultations/future -services-consultation

A reminder about the areas covered by the consultation - road maintenance and winter gritting, public transport, streetlights, school crossing patrols, parking charges at rural countryside car parks, homelessness support, library stocks levels, adult social care contributions, grants for voluntary and community organisations, funding to Hampshire

Cultural Trust and changes or closures of Household Waste Recycling Centres.

Many people have already responded. The consultation runs until **the end of the month** so if you have not responded yet, I do encourage you to take part. This affects us all. ### 2. HCC budget 2024-25

The County Council's budget for the next financial year has been approved by the council. This budget covers £2.6 billion of public spending on the ongoing delivery of important local services to Hampshire's 1.4 million residents.

From 1 April 2024, Hampshire County Council's portion of council tax will increase by a total of 4.99%, of which 2% will go specifically towards adults' social care and supporting the county's higher numbers of older people and adults with complex needs and disabilities – in line with Government policy. This equates to an annual charge of £1,533.24 for a Band D property – an increase of £72.99 per year or approximately £1.40 a week.

The increase will generate an extra £39 million of vital income towards the delivery of crucial services to the people of Hampshire in 2024/25, and still means that Hampshire has one of the lowest council tax precepts of any county in England. Even with this increase, there is still a

significant gap in the budget which will be filled from reserves – dedicated funds set aside specifically to address such shortfalls.

The County Council also approved the spending of £880.6 million over the next three years on capital programmes to help boost jobs and the
