

It was at this stage that the heavens opened for a sharp and heavy shower that soaked a few of the slower walkers but did not dampen their spirits.

In total £1,158 was raised, nearly £300 from the raffle and £220 from the cake stall, the proceeds going to St Martin's and St Andrew's. It was an excellent result, and the walk was clearly enjoyed by all those who participated. A big thank you to all those who contributed to making the occasion such a success.





## **Benefice Recipes**

With the occasional day of sunshine, I'm allowing myself to think summer is round the corner or at least a couple of corners. The White Bells I snaffled from Janey's garden are beautiful and I'm looking forward to those warm evening strolls round the garden burying my nose in roses and sweet peas. It feels like it's been a long time coming.

So the recipe this month is a tasty treat.

### **Crab and Asparagus Clafoutis**

Serves 4

### **Ingredients**

4 Large Eggs, 125 ml semi skimmed milk 475 ml double cream, Finely grated zest of 1 lemon 2 tbsp chopped chives, 150 g Mixed Brown and White crab meat

12 Asparagus spears, trimmed.

### Method

Preheat oven to 180c, 160c fan, gas 4.

In a bowl whisk together the eggs, milk, cream, zest, chives and plenty of seasoning.

Stir in most of the crab mixture, then pour into an ovenproof dish, about 1 ltr. Scatter over the remaining crab and gently lay the asparagus spears over the top. Cook for 45 mins or until the top is golden and the mixture just set. Serve immediately with a crusty bread and a green salad.

### IN THE FIELDS By Seumas Foster

### **Spring gives way to Summer**

It is quite difficult to knuckle down and complete my contribution to the Hill and Dale at this time of the year. You might think that this year with all the showers of rain finding the time at my desk would not be a problem. Not so, there are plenty of jobs stacking up and yet another list building fast.

June, the mathematical middle of the year, sees the start of the flowering, pollination and maturation of the crops in the fields. The best time to look at crops is at the beginning of June while leaves are bright green, ears are emerging, and no weeds have popped up above the top of the crop. That will come soon enough. Spring sown crops grow comparatively more quickly than winter sowings, the varieties are selected for their suitability for a short growth cycle, but they too will peak in June and July. I am surprised to see the barley awns emerging so early in May this year. The crops must have really romped on, possibly hinting at an early harvest.

### The Bird surveys – Results

The RSPB Garden watch was topped by House Sparrows for the 20<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, and Blackbirds and Wood pigeons were commonly seen, Long Tailed tits have increased, however Green finches and Chaffinches are suffering from disease Trichomonosis, caused by a parasite that can also affect other bird species, so the best control is good hygiene at feeding stations and water bowls.

The Game and Wildlife Conservation Trust (GWCT) counted birds on farmland in February. 1700 farmers took part, covering 1.5 million acres and just over 50% of the total birds seen were in this order: Starling, Wood Pigeons, Rook, Linnet, Lapwing. Of course, we are not comparing like with like, but it does show the differences between urban and countryside. Our rural parishes should be able to get the benefits of both.

Both surveys conclude that bird numbers had declined so extra care will be needed to look after our birds.



On Friday 5<sup>th</sup> May, Oak class invited our parents in to school to finish the final part of our Design and Technology

project. We had been constructing miniature fairground rides, like carousels and Ferris wheels.

The final stage was to link our construction skills with our computing skills. We had been developing our coding skills throughout the \_\_\_\_\_ term and we then used

these to create codes which controlled the lights and motor. We all had to think logically and problem-solve – if we made the motors go too fast, our passengers would be sick or even fall off!

We all really enjoyed the project and our families were very impressed. We would like to thank the Friends of Cliddesden, who were kind enough to fund the purchase of the

Crumble kits for our class.

Our bakers!! What a wonderful spread to enjoy on the Saturday as we watched the actual Coronation live.


