

Dear Friends

When Her Majesty made her Coronation oath on 2nd June 1953 she ended with the words, "The things which I have here before promised, I will perform and keep. So, help me God." As we celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee we give thanks that Her Majesty the Queen has diligently kept those vows thus rightly gaining her a high reputation for her consistent dedicated public service. Perhaps this is to be the more to be respected as she for so many years been held in the nation's hearts with deep affection and high regard after years of careful and faithful service. In her Christmas broadcasts the queen has spoken of her own faith in Christ, and has often reflected on the need that we 'love our neighbour as ourselves'. 



What to do if you find a swarm of bees in your garden

Background



Left behind are queen cells containing virgin queens.

The first queen that hatches will sting and kill all the others, (there may be more than ten), and she will then head the colony. She flies out of the hive to mate with between 10 - 20 drones, returns to the hive and starts laying eggs. That does not leave the hive again unless the colony swarms again the following vear.



What happens next?

The swarm first gathers about 100meters from the main hive and hangs there while scout bees locate their new home. That could be a hole in a tree, a chimney or other fabric of a building or even a 'bait' hive set up by a beekeeper.

If you find a swarm collector

To find a local beekeeper to come and remove the swarm go to the British Beekeepers Association (BBKA) website. Search for 'Swarm Removal'. There is information that allows you to decide if you have a swarm of honey bees or have found some other type of bees, in which case a beekeeper will not be able to help. You will need to scroll down to the foot of the page where you can enter your postcode and click on 'Find the nearest swarm collector. There will be a series of pins on a map and if you click on the nearest to you, a name and telephone number will be shown.

What about other types of bees?

Most will die at the end of summer leaving a mated queen to start a new colony the next spring. If they aren't a nuisance, leave them alone, they are valuable pollinators.

What if the colony has made a nest in the fabric of a building?

In that case it is unlikely that a beekeeper will b able to help. You may need to contact a pest controller. He or she will most likely be able to help and will, as far as possible, save the bees.

Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

I'm tip-toeing through a hazel copse, treading with care to avoid trampling the bluebells that cover the woodland floor. Dense drifts of these fragrant blooms swirl away beneath the trees in a carpet of deepest blue. Somewhere just above me, hidden in the spring-green leaf canopy, there's a blackcap warbler pouring out its remarkable song. Later, as I stroll home beside a field now chrome-yellow with flowering oil seed, a swallow powers out of the southern sky. Flying fast and low it's heading for its summer haunts after spending the winter in South Africa, some 6000 miles away.

On a splendid morning of blue skies and bright sunshine, we travel over to Noar Hill near Selborne. Of many memorable Easter walks, this remains a favourite. While tramping along the bridle-path, now bone dry, I glimpse another early swallow diving away from Charity Farm. A chiffchaff chants from somewhere deep in the hedgerow canopy above; in the distance a blackcap sings from its woodland retreat.

At the entrance gate to the nature reserve, an orange-tip butterfly leads us to an ancient chalk-pit, now a sheltered sunny dell where cowslips nod, in full bloom. To our delight we find a Duke of Burgundy butterfly, a local rarity for which this reserve is renowned. Treading with care we soon chance upon another of these endearing fritillary-like butterflies, each darting up from their cowslip domain to challenge intruders. Easily disturbed, they are best observed through binoculars on close focus.

Following the close-cropped grassy trail, we wind our way over humps and hollows bright with splashes of cowslips. A hillside oak seems quite distinctive, sunlit with a flush of tawny-tinged leaf and catkin clusters. The whitebeams here leaf-up with elegant goblets of silver-green. The ash trees alas remain gaunt and bare, either late to leaf or doomed by dieback.

Our search now turns to orchids. Tucked away in the longer grass, almost hiding in plain sight, are early-purple orchids, a springtime delight. They cluster with tall spikes of purple-rich flowers, held on stout stems above narrow spotted leaves.



On the Farm - Andy Bason

Sustainable Farming at Newhouse Farm

Here at Newhouse Farm, we have been in training! For the last three years we have been working towards becoming a LEAF demonstration farm.

LEAF (Linking Environment And Farming) is a charity that works with farmers to deliver more sustainable farming techniques and food production. They also work closely with the food industry, scientists and consumers to inspire and enable farms to be prosperous, enrich the environment and engage with local communities.

We have been part of LEAF's 'Resilient and Ready' program which is delivered in partner-ship between LEAF and Corteva Agriscience. Corteva is a global company supplying seed and crop protection services and is working with organisations such as LEAF to promote greater agricultural efficiency while limiting its environmental impact.

Being part of this program has given us access to a plethora of industry experts in soil health, business management and even advice on the use of social media and public speaking. Through our partnership with LEAF we have been working towards a philosophy of Integrated Farm Management, covering the following nine core priorities to enable us to produce food more efficiently and sustainably.

1. Organisation and planning 2. Soil management and fertility 3. Crop health and protection 4. Pollution control 5. Animal husbandry 6. Energy efficiency 7. Water management 8. Landscape and nature 9. Community engagement.

On 26th May we will become one of fifty LEAF Demonstration Farms across the UK, all promoting the IFM principles and values.

Over the past few years we have frequently welcomed visitors to Newhouse – through our Open Days and school visits as well as hosting industry groups, politicians and farming groups. As part of our commitment to LEAF, we will host at least 6 visits to the farm each year. Having been farming for 36 years, I have seen some big changes in the industry and I now think that we are on the cusp of another. The phasing out of government subsidies, rising input costs, unstable markets - not forgetting the delicate balance between feeding the growing population and satisfying the fashionable demand for rewilding and the need for affordable housing. British agriculture certainly faces some challenges but we also have the opportunity to advance the case for domestic food.

With this in mind, my goal is to get as many people as possible on to our farm, to showcase the good things that we are doing and ultimately encourage support for British agriculture.

So far this year we have had visits from two local schools to discuss topics on their curriculum. The leader of the Lib Dems, Ed Davey dropped in with Danny Chambers to discuss the problems that we are facing in agriculture and in June we will be welcoming 50 members from DEFRA for a farm tour.

We hope that you will be able to join us for our Open Farm Sunday and Summer Market on Sunday 12 June which will be a great opportunity for you to see more of what we do here at Newhouse Farm.

notes using fountain pen, doing night's on-call carrying a bag full of equipment and medications, and relying on paper maps and torches to find rural addresses. A fond memory is holding weekly branch surgeries in Preston Candover Village Hall, using the nearby phone box to enquire about home visits to be done afterwards. Hospital referrals were simple, and I had easy access to Consultant colleagues, meeting them once a week over lunch for an educational session. From antenatal to end-of-life care, and everything in between, we were involved in it all.

How things have changed. I am now part of a large multi-disciplinary team where greater specialisation, and technology has allowed me to consult by text, email, and video, even working from home when necessary. There is a "template" for everything, electronic inboxes and messaging systems, and various pathways to enable hospital referrals. Medicine is more complex and treatment possibilities almost endless. Education and meetings are done via "Teams" sitting at my computer, and lunch is noticeable only by its absence!

Yet, much has remained the same. Concern, anxiety and fear around ill health is a normal human characteristic that can affect us all. Illness continues to present in many different ways, challenging clinicians daily as we try to make a diagnosis. Some of my patients have been from the same families for three decades, though in recent years from the third or even fourth generation! Over the years we have shared many stories together, and I have had the privilege of being there through both good and difficult times. It is the continuity of these relationships that has made my role as a GP such an enjoyable one and I am grateful for this. 

WHY IS MY CONVEYANCING TRANSACTION TAKING SO LONG?

It is a common grumble that conveyancing takes longer than expected. Buyers are keen to own their new properties as soon as possible but the average transaction takes around 12 weeks from offer to completion. Several factors can contribute to delays:

Identification

Conveyancers are required by law to verify the identity of clients and the source of their funds. Ensure you have ID documents and proof of

deposit readily available at the very start of the transaction.

Lost Documents

If have carried out work to a property you are selling, get planning and building regulation paperwork together. Check you have your Final Certificates. A surprising number of sellers do not request the building inspector for a final inspection so do not receive their Completion Certificates.

Lost Title Deeds

Although most properties are now registered with the Land Registry some unregistered land remains, particularly where the property has remained in the same family for many years. If you have original deeds, please keep these safe.

Missing Rights

When viewing a property make a point of checking for private access roads and shared driveways, private or shared services such as drainage, and other unusual features.

Service Information Packs

Properties that are leasehold or have an estate service charge require these, and they can take anything between 2 to 8 weeks to be returned by management companies. If your property is subject to a service charge, let your conveyancer know early.

Missing Landlords and Defective Leases

If your property is leasehold or subject to ground rent, ensure you have your latest ground rent receipt or freeholder contact details available.

Finance Problems

Speak to your bank or financial adviser before making an offer. If you are funding your purchase from savings, check how long it takes to release the funds - a Life Time ISA can take up to 3 weeks to be released. If you are receiving a gifted deposit, you need to provide information on the source of the funds to your conveyancer and mortgage lender, so submit your paperwork early.

Search Delays

Most local authorities can return an Official Local Search within two weeks, but some require longer as not all records are readily available. Further searches may be required in particular circumstances like former mining areas or relative to the particular property such as a Highways Search where there are access issues.

Whilst delays can be frustrating, there may be factors outside of your conveyancer's control. It is important that the documentation is correct and complies with legislation to avoid future problems, so you need to be flexible with target dates and review these regularly as the transaction proceeds.



Summary Daytime temperatures were below the norm for the first week and a half and it was generally dull with a snow shower on the 1st, then occasional showers or longer outbreaks of rain. There were overnight frosts and the coldest April night in over two decades at 20°F was recorded on the 3rd. Temperatures then increased and mostly above the seasonal average for the remainder of the month. High pressure was a dominant feature in the second half of the month with some fine, sunny weather. Apart from a light shower it was dry from the 13th. Overall, there was just 39% of the normal rainfall for April and it was the driest start to the year since 2005 with only 60% of the normal year to date rainfall. April was colder than normal for mid-spring, due to the cold start to the month.

Much has changed since Lord Mayor of London, William Purdie Treloar bought an old Boer War campsite on the western side of Alton and carried his first disabled youngster to what became the Treloar hospital.

His talk is entitled, 'Who needs a camera in the age of the Smartphone?'

First up this month, out on patrol in Winchester City Centre with the **Street Pastors**.

Many of you will know of this fantastic organisation which organises volunteers, always backed by prayer, to patrol our city centre on a Friday and Saturday night. They are now ten years old and, having supported them from the start, I went out with the team recently to observe the quietly effective work they do.

Whether it be handing out a cup of hot chocolate or a cuppa-soup to rough sleepers or a lollipop to young (and old) people high on life – and possibly a few drinks – they just come alongside people and I have to say it's hard to over-state the calming presence they can have and the quiet acts of kindness they dispense. Everyone out in town - or who has kids out in town with their mates - should be very pleased they're around. You can find out more and join the team at streetpastors.org/locations/winchester

While we were patrolling the streets here of course, an ancient ceremony dating back to the 17th Century was taking place in Westminster as the cellars of the House of Lords were searched for gunpowder ahead of the **State Opening of Parliament** which was presided over by Prince Charles.

It was always a huge privilege to see Elizabeth II in person open the new session of Parliament (and I have done so many times) but this one - we had to mobilise the little used Regency Act of 1953 to enable the heir to the throne to present the Government's legislative agenda for the year ahead - was obviously very different and tinged with sadness in this Platinum — As we stood at the Bar of the House in the Lords Chamber we knew we were witnessing history before our eyes, in a ceremonial sense, and a whole lot of work for MPs in practical terms.

As a country we have risen to challenges with no precedent in recent history; leading the response to Putin's attack on Ukraine and protecting lives and livelihoods in the battle against Covid but these events have caused huge disruptions to the global economy.

The Queen's Speech set out 38 new bills helping us to continue delivering on our top priorities; including easing the cost of living and growing the economy, cutting crime and supporting communities while clearing the **Covid backlogs**.

On that, I spent time recently inside the theatres at the Royal Hampshire County Hospital speaking with surgeons and nursing staff who are, day after day, clearing that backlog. These are often conditions – urology, orthopeadic, gynaecology – which seriously inhibit quality of life for those waiting and the team there are doing really well to get through the work.

And I wouldn't be true to myself talking about health without mentioning prevention. I am working with **Diabetes UK** after the launch of a new report as part of the charity's *Diabetes Is Serious* campaign. There are 4.9 million people living with diabetes in the UK and we're pushing a number of recommendations for improving care including a routine care recovery plan. A recent survey of over 10,000 people with diabetes found that 1 in 3 respondents had no contact with their diabetes healthcare team in the last year. Without these vital checks and routine care, people living with diabetes face increased risk of developing serious complications. You can find out more at stevebrine.com/diabetes




