



#### **Dear Friends**

Someone I know visited London to photograph various buildings for an A level project enjoying the many varying architectural styles to choose from. But not knowing

London very well they were unaware that one building to which they gave particular attention was not a shop or a private residence but a place Ministry of Defence Police keep a close eye on!

It was not long after photographing this building with a long lens, zooming in on the interesting window designs and brickwork two armed police officers detained, questioned and searched the student! He was not found to be in possession of weapon or explosive and persuaded the officers he was a bona fide student. As a trophy of his experience, he has his 'Stop and Search' receipt to this day!

Some things prompt our inquiry and questioning, we might wonder what is going on in our villages if a large gathering is seen, or on a motorway amidst a haze of blue flashing lights. When someone's routine changes we might speculate on questions of health and circumstances for we are by nature a curious species!

The big questions of life have been around for as long as human beings. Here are some to ponder. Why is there 'something rather than nothing'? Why is the world so beautiful? Why is there such ugliness that some people are content to can make life miserable for others in defiance of natural values of love and justice?

We might think about Russia and Ukraine...and other examples.

Why is there a sense of "eternity in our hearts" and what and why is there love? A question arises about how we do find our answers? We are by nature 'sense making' people who long to 'know the reason why' and even if our belief is not correct, nonetheless having an explanatory belief provides comfort. Is that sufficient?

Christian belief offers explanation for the questions above, from beauty to ugliness, understanding that God is good, that human kind can abuse their freewill, reject God's love, with contempt for God, justice and love. Things, as we see go seriously wrong at this point.

What is God's answer to this and why do Christians believe it?

One place to start might be this, from Psalm 27 "One thing I have desired of the Lord, That will I search for, that I may dwell in the house of the Lord, to behold the beauty (perfections) of the Lord, and to inquire in His temple.

#### Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

There were wonderful days in March, especially on Mothering Sunday. Under hazy blue skies we headed off to Magdalen Hill Down, near Winchester, for a spring ramble around this broad barrow of conservation downland. Parking opposite Morn Hill Cemetery, we crossed over to take the track beside the stonemason's yard leading up to the nature reserve. Here the Hampshire branch of Butterfly Conservation has created an impressive array of wildflower meadows and chalk grassland.

A herd of cattle, British Whites, roamed the cowslip meadow known as the Extension. This docile, hardy breed, white-faced with black ears and muzzle, are widely used for conservation grazing. As we noted the recent sightings chalked up on the reserve notice-board, a chiffchaff began chanting. This small olive brown warbler was busily foraging through the sunlit tree-tops, while a kestrel floated silently overhead.

The warmer weather had brought out the first of the spring butterflies from hibernation. Peacock butterflies with their startling eye-spots were basking in the sunshine. Dark-edged bee-flies, endearingly ginger fur-balls, hovered while probing for nectar among the early cowslips. Queen bumblebees, buff-tailed and heavy bodied, cruised low over the wayside banks, searching for suitable nest sites in old mouse burrows.

As we strode along the central hilltop path, with fine views over Winchester and beyond, a skylark suddenly lifted off from the surrounding grasslands, fluttering upwards to hover and circle in its song-flight.

With a keen breeze behind us, we strolled down to the sheltered south-facing slopes overlooking the Chilcomb bowl. The morning sun was lighting up the primrose-yellow banks of St.Andrew's churchyard, on the far hillside above the hamlet of Upper Chilcomb. Next we meandered along the chalk scrape, a niche habitat of bare chalk, seeded with vetches, created to conserve colonies of the small blue butterflies and rare moths

Taking the perimeter path to the far boundary with Morn Hill, we peeked under sunlit sheets of corrugated iron to reveal a wood mouse hoard of nibbled hazel shells, plus a slow worm, a legless lizard, coppery-brown, gently warming in its retreat.



#### On the Farm - Ben Robinson

The media portrayal of lambing emphasises the cute. Fluffy lambs, sunny days, daffodils. At times the reality can be somewhat different. There tends to be one major issue at lambing each year. The year of mastitis, the year of blizzards, the year of the rogue fox, the year of magnesium deficiency and so it goes on. As long as they don't all happen during the same lambing I can generally cope!

This year the problem was abortions. Starting about a fortnight before lambing quite a few ewes aborted their lambs. It is normal to expect a few abortions- vets says the threshold of concern is around 2% of the flock. As this threshold was approached I took some dead lambs to the University of Surrey Vet School laboratory in Guildford for testing. After much delay it became apparent that the problem was campylobacter. On the plus side it wasn't enzootic abortion, which can result in huge losses over the course of a lambing campaign. More negatively the only vaccine available for campylobacter is manufactured in New Zealand, with importation to the UK only possible via a special DEFRA licence granted to vets on an individual case basis at serious expense. However as soon as the expected due date for the start of lambing was reached the abortions stopped and the lambs were born stronger. They always say that lambing problems are worst at the start- by the end the sun is usually shining and you have forgotten the horrors until the next year!

We gave George from Endell vets, an interesting day early on in lambing. I find vets tend to love a bit of gory surgery. The only ewe in the flock scanned for quads tore her uterus and prolapsed so needed stitching. As George was on farm and had nowhere else to rush off to I asked him to deal with a bad eye on a Hereford steer that had not improved after a course of treatment. Out came the eye under anaesthetic, with the socket being stitched up. The Hereford is a much happier chap now.

After a quick cuppa we went to check up on the ewe with quads. She had pushed her stiches out so there was only one option left- a caesarean. The odds were not good- the gestation period of lambs is only five months less five days so any born prematurely are often not viable. We could quite easily have had four dead lambs, a dead ewe and a big bill. Propped up on the back of the pick up the c-section was performed. George got three large lambs out of the left-hand side but couldn't reach the fourth lamb. This meant the first side had to be sewn up and a second c-section performed on the right-hand side of the ewe. The fourth live lamb came safely out and the ewe was stitched up again. She is now happily turned out to grass with two healthy lambs and the other two were fostered on to ewes with single lambs.

#### **Appointment system changes**

Over the last couple of years, the Covid Pandemic has changed the way we provide General Practice care. It has been a very challenging time and we had to be responsive; moving quickly to 'on the day' service, providing the Covid vaccination program whilst also trying to maintain General Practice services with high staff sickness levels. Our clinical demand locally and nationally has now reached levels which are not sustainable in the current way General Practice is being offered. Nationally there are now 1,608 fewer fully qualified full time GPs compared to numbers in 2015 despite the promises of increased recruitment. As a result, each GP is looking after approximately 300 more patients. In January 2022 there was a total of 25.7 million appointments nationally, which is an increase of 0.5 million since January 2020. Our own consultations rates in Alresford have increased month on month despite the challenges of increased staff sickness and difficulties with recruitment. In March we offered 2925 appointments and this was an increase of 15% and 17% offered in February and January respectively.

As we are now moving out of the pandemic and addressing the backlog, we recognise the need for the appointment system to change. We have listened to your feedback and recognise the importance of having access to pre-bookable appointments as life is returning to normal. We have responded to increasing demands by recruiting new members to the clinical team such as Helen Hall (Acute Nurse Practitioner) and Megan Power (Paramedic Practitioner) to help us deal with the emergency workload. We have in addition recruited Dr Hannah Harring as a new salaried GP and recently appointed two more GPs to the clinical team who are replacing retiring GPs in June. We now have access to musculoskeletal specialists via reception and several of the local opticians offer a Minor Eye Conditions service. Please be aware our staff have been trained and may appropriately direct you to an alternative service, which may be better suited to your problem thus ensuring you can access GP appointments when you really need them.

Our new appointment system will provide a balance of on the day emergency care alongside pre-bookable appointments (up to 7 days in advance). We hope that this system will provide a better balance of appointments for the Alresford Population and preserve some of the continuity of care we have lost. In addition, we have boosted our access for those who are more vulnerable by having additional slots throughout the day for this group to access. There will be a range of methods for booking appointments including online, by telephone and through the e-consultation



#### **Forward Planning**

We often like to think of ourselves as invincible. A lot of the time we are. I am constantly amazed by what business owners manage to achieve whilst also balancing the never-ending challenges of running a business. Sadly, sometimes life events can bring a halt to our best laid plans. I recently helped a family friend through a very difficult situation which I wanted to share so that you can ensure you have the relevant plans in place for you, your business and

your family.

#### Background

My family friend was happily married with three children. Her husband was a one third shareholder in a professional service company. He was in his early 40s and was diagnosed with terminal cancer. Very sadly, he died six months later.

I became involved, after his death, and it was clear that little planning (which was not that unsurprising given his age) had been put in place. This left his wife and children in a difficult

situation. There was no life insurance in place, and by the time he received his diagnosis, it was too late to get any insurance in place. There was also no provision in any of the company's constitutional documents as to what happened with the shares.

As a result, my contact was left with a large mortgage to pay, three children to support and minimal income as she, at the time, was

retraining. Given that most business owners are growing their business ultimately for their family's benefit, I wanted to set out some of the points which you may want to consider.

- 1. Set out a clear process in the articles of association or shareholders' agreement as to what will happen on the death of a shareholder.
- 2. Consider whether a cross option agreement may be suitable for your business model.
- 3. Ensure you have adequate life assurance in place for you and your spouse/ civil partner
- 4. Make sure you have a Will in place and that it is up to date
- 5. Consider having a lasting power of attorney for both financial and health matters.
- 6. Consider what the effect on your business would be if you were unable to work for a prolonged period or were to die.

I highly recommend that you do spend to time to consider these points and discuss them with your fellow shareholders and family.



**Summary** There was a dull and wet start to March and a north-easterly breeze kept temperatures below the seasonal norm. High pressure then brought a week and a half of dry and largely fine, sunny weather with above average daytime temperatures. The highest at 66°F was recorded on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. The last days of the month were dull and significantly colder, a reminder that this was still only early spring, with snow flurries and the coldest day at 44°F on the 31<sup>st</sup>. Overall, the month was mild and dry, with 85% of the normal rainfall.

Swarraton and Northington WI
We welcomed five new members to our April meeting and members enjoyed afternoon tea and a wonderful time with four of our members sharing their reminiscences.

**Bobbie Sanderson-** In this our 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary year Boobie delighted us with her memories of Swarraton and Northington WI which she joined back in 1980. Bobbie recalled the fun they had entering group competitions, Scrabble, tennis, skittles, darts, and the many quizzes which they did rather well at. 'Adopt a granny' and afternoon tea and games hosting members of an organisation for the blind were days they enjoyed.

During the Iraq war **Primrose Reynolds** had a great idea for the WI to make fruit cakes for the soldiers who were so far away from home. The recipe was shared and at the county meeting in Winchester thousands of fruit cakes appeared from WIs throughout Hampshire. All were carefully wrapped, packed, and despatched. Swarraton and Northington were known for 'Operation Fruit Cake'. Bobbie summed up her memories by saying 'It was a privilege to be a member and it has given me 40 years of fun and friendship.'

**Linda Amarnani** – Talked about her work in London's fashion world with Marv Ouant and later De Beers jewellers in Bond Street. London was buzzing in the 70's and Mary Quant had a wonderful eye for style and colour. The Mary Quant brand was hugely successful because as well as great designs she had terrific support with marketing and business know how from her husband and a friend.

Later Linda moved to work for De Beers in Bond Street and was involved in planning and organising photo shoots, displays and special events. She recalled frequent walks along Bond Street with a carrier bag of priceless jewels as she crossed to another venue for a photo shoot where she would meet many of the famous models of the day. Linda reminded us of Mary Quant's famous line 'Clothes get there first'.

Sarah Martin – Sarah was born in Peshawar and her father was stationed at Fort Jamrud at the beginning of the Khyber Pass. She recalled her early years in Bombay and Karachi and how her mother gathered her three children in 1944 for the long journey back to England and safety. It began with a two-day camel cart journey to Hyderabad before the train journey to Poona. They embarked on the troop ship Highland Brigade for the 6-week journey back to Glasgow travelling through the Suez Canal into the Mediterranean Sea with blackout blinds drawn and a ship nearby sank probably mined. In 1964 Keith and Sarah were posted to Karachi where Keith took charge of a Pakistan Refinery.

A year later The Indo/Pakistan war started, and they were placed on 24-hour alert for evacuation with a Royal Naval ship waiting off shore ready. A suitcase was

There's so much news around at the moment – and so much going on in Parliament – I was spoilt for choice on what to write about but it had to be my latest ASKtheMINISTER event



#### Tackling the species invading our chalk streams

Around 10,000 years ago, a land bridge connected Britain to what is now mainland Europe. The end of the Ice Age allowed wildlife to cross, until rising sea levels formed the English Channel. All the plants and animals that were present at this point are now classified as native species.

Non-native species, by contrast, are those that have been transported outside their natural range by human activity. This isn't always a bad thing – sheep originated near the Caspian Sea and the apple tree comes from Kazakhstan, but neither poses a problem for native wildlife.

When a species negatively impacts the environment, the economy, or hu-

man health, however, then it is classified as invasive. These species might hunt native ones, or outcompete them for food and habitat. They might carry new diseases or have the ability to hybridise.

This impact is a top cause of worldwide biodiversity loss, and costs our economy £1.7 billion each year. Our precious chalk streams - globally rare havens for many endangered species - are badly affected by invasives like Himalayan bal-



sam, American mink, and signal crayfish.

Invasive Species Week (16-22 May this year) reminds us that this remains a pressing issue. But we can help to tackle it all year round, with a few simple actions:

- 1) Some species can survive long periods out of water and may hitch a ride on your damp clothes or equipment, so follow the 'check, clean, dry' procedure.
- 2) Plants are natural escape artists, so choose local species for your garden or take steps to stop non-native ones from 'jumping the fence'.



3) There are websites and apps for recording species sightings, so let them know even if you're not completely sure what you've seen.
