

Dear Friends

"Remember, remember, the fifth of November, gun powder, treason and plot" as every year we recall Guy Fawkes and fellow conspirators plotting an explosion in 1605 to destroy the House of Lords and sitting Peers of the Realm.

Historians tell us a number of things went against the plotter's plans. The plague virus delayed parliament sitting for one month in which time the gunpowder deteriorated so much that if a burning torch were thrust into the powder there would have been fizz but no bang. The delay also allowed the plot to become known as an anonymous plotter wrote to Lord Monteagle warning him to stay away from the House of Lords.

That letter was leaked and the resulting search led to the arrest of a 'John Johnson' who was discovered near thirty-six barrels of gunpowder! He was of course Guido Fawkes. If the plot had succeeded there would have been huge bloodshed and England would likely have become a Catholic country reigned by Catholic monarchy.

Arising from a plot to murder the Lords came the Observance of the Fifth of November Act, that the Fifth of November be a celebration every year that the King's life had been spared. Now we have an annual event in which millions of pounds are spent on fireworks and thousands of bonfires are lit across the UK, though the Act was repealed in 1859.

So often small things have 'knock on' effects leading to big outcomes, sometimes tragically as in the case of accidents involving drivers on mobiles phones. A jury's verdict, or a 'yes' or 'no' which might be true or false, or the courageous whistle blower who exposes lies and wrongdoing in an organisation, all these change for ill or good the lives of innocent people.

Small faith results in a big outcome. A small yes from us, that we believe Jesus died for our sins and that through him God gives us forgiveness of sins and gives us eternal life, all comes from a believing 'Yes' to God. That has been the starting place for many whose lives went on to be transformed by God, their 'yes' brought the gift of the Holy Spirit's presence and their eyes spiritually opened to the wonders of God's truth in the Bible.

Perhaps we have experienced the small action of our own prayers, of opening the gospels and reading Jesus' words, or learning through the Bible or Alpha Course, and found that these small things lead to eternal outcomes. This is profound and wonderful; may God bless us in the small prayers of faith and trust in Him.

Thinking back to this Summer, there was only one story in town – the urgent need to help households and businesses with eye-watering **energy bills** expected this Winter

Every news bulletin screamed for action and my inbox was full of constituents, understandably, asking what help might be available.

Then, in the first few days of September – before the world changed and we lost our beloved late Queen – the new Prime Minister announced the single biggest Government intervention in peacetime in the form of the **Energy Price Guarantee**.

To recap for moment, the global rising cost of energy - caused in part by the war in Ukraine - created unprecedented price rises for Winchester residents. Energy bills were due to rise by £6,500 so direct support measures had to be announced by the government.

As a result typical **households in the Itchen Valley** will save £1,000 per year on their energy bills for two years which is ON TOP OF the £400 cash grant towards your domestic energy bill this autumn. This comes in six instalments over the next six months and will either be paid directly (as cash) into your bank account or credited to your electricity bill. That depends on your supplier but, to be clear, you do not need to take ANY ACTION to receive either but sensible energy saving measures are never a bad idea and there's lots of help out there to advise on ways to do that in your home.

Furthermore, a £300 one-off cost-of living payment is on its way to pensioners who receive the Winter Fuel Payment.

When we announced this help, we promised something equivalent for non-domestic properties and I spent time in the constituency talking to businesses, charities, schools and hospitals to ensure I could feed their need for help into Ministers. The **Energy Bill Relief Scheme** quickly followed (we announced as soon as we could after the period of national mourning was over) giving a discount on wholesale gas and electricity prices worth up to half the price of expected energy prices this winter. I know this will be a great help locally.

Unlike the domestic help, this is initially only until end of March but I will be lobbying to see it scaled back for big firms – I don't believe Amazon need the help even if they received it initially in the need to get help out there fast – and focused on small business in particular from the Spring.

There are still, however, gaps and as I write I am still pressing Ministers for clarity on how this help will achieve equivalence for park home owners, others who pay their rent and bills to one landlord and to those who are 'off grid' because at present they're not getting the same help as everyone else and that's not fair.

Finally, I may no longer have children at the school, but my job took me into the wonderful **Itchen Abbas Primary School** last month. I spent time chatting with Mr Bogan's Year 5/6 class and then had a session with the school council to help them in their work this year.



Summary

The first few days of September were mild and dry before an unsettled spell with two and a third inches of rain and two thunderstorms. There was further rain around the end of the second week and distant thunder on the 12th. High pressure then brought a week of dry weather, with mostly below average temperatures and these continued through to the end of the month. The last week or so was unsettled with showers or longer outbreaks of rain. Overall, the temperature was below the seasonal average. Whilst rainfall for the month was almost 50% above the norm, it was only the second month this year with above average rainfall and the total for the year to date was the lowest recorded here with only 65% of the long term average.

Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

In the early dawn of a misty Michaelmas morning, I hear the distinctive honking of wild geese. These are not winter visitors flying over but a large roosting flock of Canada geese. Some 90 or so birds are camped out, towards the far side of the back field. Some are still asleep, heads tucked in; some are alert with long black necks held upright, and some are on their feet cropping grass, their distinctive black heads and white throat patches clearly visible.

Canada geese were introduced from North America in the 17th century, originally as exotic parkland ornamentals. Now widespread as a resident breeding species, they were a late arrival to the Hampshire wetlands, with sightings dating only from the 1880s (according to the HOS's 'Birds of Hampshire').

A gregarious bird, with a familiar clamour as they fly up and down the Candover valley, I presume this flock has flown over from the nearby lake at Northington Grange. As if on cue, a grey heron, vast of wing, sweeps low over the wooded brow of Northington Down. With slow steady wing-beats, he seems to be heading away from Grange Park towards the ponds and brooklets of the Dever valley.

The autumn migration of swallows and house martins appears to be almost complete as the last few birds pass through on their long journey south. One moment they seem to be everywhere, floating across the skies, whizzing around the stubble fields, or hedgehopping along the lanes.

Days drift by without a sighting, before one fine evening with the sun setting over Micheldever Wood, a feeding flock of house martins and swallows suddenly drops down from clear skies to scoop up insects along the woodland edge.

The wayside hedges are laden with hips and haws, sloes and the curiously pink spindle berries. The pompoms of flowering ivy buzz with foraging ivy bees. I turn, distracted by a silvery gleam. Pied wagtails are darting about the bare brown earth of a ploughed field. As they chase flies, the flicker of their long bobbing tails catches the low sunlight.

Riparian Responsibilities

This is the time of year when we need to think about the state of Hampshire's land drainage network. As the season for rainier days approaches and leaves begin to fall, all riparian owners (those who have watercourses on or bordering their land) across Hampshire, should be checking the state of drainage ditches, pipes, culverts that carry watercourses to ensure there is unobstructed conveyance of surface (rain) water to reduce the risk of localised flooding.

Below is the link to a leaflet/poster detailing what responsibilities riparian owners have and guidance on how to undertake this maintenance to reduce flooding from surface water. 

To reduce the risk of future flooding we would also appreciate being informed of any planned, ongoing or recent works to install a culvert, pipe or infill/realign a ditch (i.e. an ordinary watercourse) so that we can check that a land drainage consent is in place for those works. I hope this Autumn finds you well, and maybe even as active as these runners at the Rotary Clarendon Marathon! It was fun to be just one of the hundreds of volunteers supporting nearly 1000 runners taking part. 'This month we had a stark warning from



the County about the state of the finances at HCC, given to us in preparation for the Council tax budget in December. They expect a £200m per annum deficit by 2025/26, even having made £640m per annum savings since 2008. (The budget for 2022/23 is £2.4 billion)

Inflation isn't just a problem for us at home: the social care of adults and children is increasingly expensive and the costs of building new projects and maintaining older ones are rapidly increasing, in many cases by up to 40%. When I first became a County Councillor, approx. 1/3 of the income had to be generated locally, the remainder came from Government. Now the position is more than reversed and after a period of nil and lower council tax increase limits, and a restriction on the social care levy, the potential income has been forcibly reduced.

There is a new trend to ask councils to bid against each other for a limited pot, which results in extensive consultations, and maybe no outcome. Unfortunately, Hampshire's bid for 'Bus Back better' was unsuccessful so there is no budget to transform buses as hoped.

Capital programmes must be limited to those which maintain safe environments. This does not give us much hope on starting new capital programmes, but I am pleased that certain capital programmes outlines last month are expected to be going ahead. You can read more at https://www.hants.gov.uk/



On the Farm - Ben Robinson

In amongst the madness of politics at the moment it felt good to turn the tups out with the ewes again yesterday. Eleven lads for 700 ladies- a bit like a vet school disco these days. If you see any sheep with brightly coloured backsides it means they are ewes that have been tupped. All being well they should have lambs from around the 12th March onwards. The US market has recently opened up for UK lamb for the first time since the BSE crisis, so Wield reared lamb could potentially be finding its way onto American plates.

The grass is growing nicely into the Autumn which is a welcome bonus after such a dry Summer. I recently sold 240 lambs at Wilton sheep fair near Salisbury and bought 80 Mule Shearling ewes (18 months old) ready for the ram.

The lambs were bought by a couple of vegetable growers on the Isle of Wight. They will graze them on cauliflower fields that have already been harvested until they are finished and ready for killing. A great example of nutrient recycling in farming.

Though the fair is a shadow of its former self it is still a great spectacle- a competitive auction held in an open field monthly from August to November. At its height in the 1980s the September 'Wilton Great Fair' apparently attracted 20,000 sheep. Now around 6,500 would be the September average, with lower numbers for the other month's fairs.

We recently hosted the North East Hampshire ploughing match on the farm, in a stubble field that will be planted with Spring Barley in March next year. It was great to see the 33 entrants taking such pride in their machinery and work. One 13 year old local youngster who wants to enter the 2023 competition has asked for a small old plough for Christmas to attach to his father's vintage David Brown tractor. I have said he can use the rest of the field to plough to practice. I suspect with a two furrow plough and a 45 acre field it will take him the best part of a month!

At the time of writing Ranil Jayawardena, MP for NE Hampshire, is the new DEFRA secretary. Could this be the first time an MP for at least part of the Candover Valley has held the agriculture brief? He appears to be a keen supporter of UK food production, which is a welcome change of direction. However, his tenure may be rather short depending on the make-up of the post-Truss PM's cabinet.

How invertebrates show the state of our chalk streams

When it comes to the health of our local chalk streams, few animals are more crucial than invertebrates. As a major food source for fish, birds, and mammals, their presence – or absence – directly impacts other wildlife populations. Many are ecosystem engineers that shape their surroundings, and some are found only in the UK. Yet of the 724 aquatic insects known to be here, 11 have been lost and 68 more face extinction.



coal mine' for the habitat at large. Three groups in particular – the 'EPT species' – are invaluable for spotting problems, since all spend extended periods in the water and have unique sensitivities to different pollutants. This makes them excellent indicators of subtle. chronic pollution that may be missed by spot water sampling. Mayflies, or 'Ephemeroptera', take their name from their short adult lifespans – mere hours in some cases. As nymphs, however, they can spend up to two years feeding

on algae and plants in the water. Unusually among insects, they have two adult forms: the dull-coloured 'dun' and the clear-winged 'spinner' that follows. The adults often emerge en masse, creating an impressive spectacle.

In their nymph stage, stoneflies – or 'Plecoptera' – can be found clinging to the undersides of rocks in fast-flowing streams. The adults have intricately patterned wings but tend not to be strong fliers, so will usually stay close to where they first left the water. Some species communicate by 'drumming' their abdomen on a solid surface; if they're lucky, this display will win them a mate!

Caddisflies, or 'Trichoptera', are best known for their larval stage, when they bind stones, leaves, shells, and sand together to form protective cases. These shelters are portable, allowing the larvae to crawl – and sometimes even swim – while inside. As adults, they have hairy wings like a moth, which they fold along their bodies when at rest, and can typically be seen sitting by the water.

If you'd like to help monitor these important species, there are a few ways to do so. The Riverfly Partnership hosts several projects for local groups, and citizen science initiatives for individuals.
