Dear Friends

'Pops Ups' on our computer screens can be quite annoying but 'pop ups' occur in more solid forms. Pop Up Cafés, turn up in village halls and homes and even pop-up orchestras or choirs show up in shopping malls. One short video that has been around for a while now shows a small girl placing money into a solitary street musician's hat and as he begins playing on a cello the opening bars of Ode to Joy, he is soon joined by other musicians, one by one, until there is an entire orchestra playing Beethoven in a public square.

There was once a Pop-Up Psychiatrist, a couple of chairs placed in a London square, and strangers were invited to sit down and talk to each other about, well, anything at all. The purpose of this social experiment was to explore how personal problems might be reduced in our perception when they are shared and why not share with a stranger?

Jesus made a Pop-Up Café once on the beach. His disciples had gone fishing one night and Jesus met them on the shore, made a fire and cooked them a welcome breakfast after a night's fishing and had a conversation with the Apostle Peter that showed Jesus' forgiveness of Peter's strong denial of him, before his crucifixion.

In a sense our own lives are 'Pop ups', we arrive at some point, and we have a short span of time. Psalm 143 reminds us, "Our days on earth are like grass; like wildflowers, we bloom and die. The wind blows, and we are gone as though we had never been here. But the love of the Lord remains forever with those who fear him".

In everyday life God pops up, if we can put it like that, it isn't that he is absent but there are times when we do find that God seems more present, and we are aware that there is much more to life than the trivial things pop up ads tell us about. We may be more aware of the beauty of the landscape or of a piece of music, there are conversations and life events that make us think

Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

On a bright breezy Sunday afternoon we head up to Magdalen Hill Down, the Butterfly Conservation reserve, near Winchester. On a previous visit in April, the meadows were pale yellow with a vast carpet of cowslips. Today we are greeted by drifts of tall grasses, swaying with a wonderful array of the flowering plants of the chalk downlands.

Here are the purples and mauves of knapweeds and scabious. The blue flowers of meadow cranes-bill or wild geranium stand out. The summer scents of marjoram and thyme linger over the sheltered sunny banks, while high overhead the larks pour out their sky-songs.

Despite the breeze it's a marvellous day for butterflies, in particular the marbled white, a delightful butterfly with a distinctive marquetry of wing-patterns, chequered black and white in the male, while the female has more sepia tones. Although marbled whites and meadow browns were abundant with nine other species on the wing, one eluded us – the small blue.

A habitat for small blues has been especially created here from a sheltered south-facing chalk scrape, sown with kidney vetch, the caterpillar's foodplant. Clearly the stage was set, but we had missed the early summer flight period and will have to return later in August for a second showing. Nevertheless as we meandered along the permissive path through the grasslands overlooking Chilcomb, we chanced upon a fine display of pyramidal orchids, cherry pink, to complete our visit.

On the sunny morning following the July 4th downpour, when a colossal amount of rain fell in a few hours, I biked up to Micheldever woods. I was hoping that the damp stony hoggin lining the main avenue through the woods, when lit up by warm sunshine, would appeal to foraging butterflies, by luring them down from high in the canopy.

By the Iron Age settlement, a butterfly flew up from the path. At first I thought it was a white admiral, but as it circled in the sunlight its wings flashed shades of blue – it was a purple emperor – a summer highlight.


This phase of the work should take ten weeks and be completed by the 18th September.

Travelling abroad

Immunisations and advice are available through our Travel Service.

It is important to make this initial appointment as early as possible - We will be unable to offer travel appointments to anyone travelling with less than (12 weeks) prior to their departure date as in some cases a second appointment will be required with the practice nurse to complete a course of vaccinations. Some vaccines have to be ordered as they are not a stock vaccine. Your second appointment needs to be at least 2 weeks before you travel to allow the vaccines to work.

Radiology department - Royal Hampshire County Hospital

Work will start on Friday 14th July on the much-needed refurbishment of the department starting with the installation of new digital X-ray equipment to our X-ray rooms. The new equipment and environment will very much improve the patient experience as the Department modernises and improve the efficiency of the service.

However, they will have limited capacity in the department while the constructing team and engineers are on site.

On the Farm -

. One of the advantages of being a mixed farm is that it allows me to think that any type of Summer is good for the farm. Hot and dry is good for the grapes, a dry cereals harvest and easy haymaking. Cool and damp is positive for big cuts of silage and plenty of grazing grass in front of the sheep and cattle. At least this Summer we haven't had the very hot weather of last year, where the soil profile became so dry that the electric fencing wouldn't earth correctly meaning there was sufficient current through the fence to keep the sheep contained. They just kept on walking straight through it which got highly frustrating. At least with the damp this year the electric is giving enough kick to keep the beasts where they are supposed to be.

Training is an important part of any business, and farming is no different. Farmers and their staff need certificates to use a telehandler, industrial forklift, chainsaw, and crop sprayers as a minimum. These are not technically the law to acquire but are good business health and safety practice. If there is an accident and no evidence of training is available, then the proverbial 'book' is likely to be thrown at the farm business. Agriculture is the second most dangerous industry in the country after trawler fishing, so it is important that we do all we can to minimise risks wherever possible. My staff and I are booked on to do telehandler and quad bike refreshers in the next month.

This year is my first year as Alresford Show Livestock Chairman. It is a slightly daunting role. Most challenging so far is navigating the bureaucratic government machine with its regularly changing demands. I am pretty up to speed with this for my own farm, but the requirements for a show ground bring many extra levels of complexity. I am sure it will click into place on the day but forgive me if I appear a little stressed in the days leading up to the Show!

Please do come and enjoy the Show. For a relatively small, one day show the Alresford Show has a fantastic display of livestock and wonderful arrays of vintage and modern machinery to rival any show in the country. The committee is very focused on ensuring that it stays principally an agricultural show that celebrates the best of country life. As well as the pure farming element there will be local arts, crafts and produce, local food, several packs of hounds and a busy horse ring. Some of the equine classes are now qualifiers for Olympia for the first time. I hope to see you on the 2nd September at Tichborne Park – head down early to avoid the traffic!



Summary There was a fine start to June, with early cloud dissipating to give clear skies, or unbroken sunshine in the first nine days whilst a cool north easterly breeze kept the average temperature below the seasonal norm. It was warmer by the second week, with the daytime temperature peaking at 87°F on 10th, and temperatures remained mostly above average to the end of the month. The first rain in over three weeks fell with a thunderstorm on the 11th then more fine, dry and sunny weather that lasted into the third week. There followed sunny spells with some rain before warmer, sunny weather then dull and cooler conditions in the last few days of the month. It was the warmest June recorded here, and the Met Office reported it as the hottest in the UK since records began in 1884. Rainfall for the month was a third of the long term average.

Going Batty

As dusk falls over a Hampshire chalk stream, those looking skyward may see strange shadows flit into view. Charismatic and enigmatic in equal measure, bats are some of the UK's most fascinating animals. Our county's chalk streams – each humming with insect life – make it an attractive place for these winged wonders.

Many different bat species frequent our waterways, from the high-flying noctule to the diminutive soprano pipistrelle. The Daubenton's bat is even called the "water bat" for its love of ponds, lakes, and rivers. When the sun goes down, this aerial expert can be seen swooping close to the water in search of a tasty meal.

Every bat species has its favourite food, but all feast on various types of insects. Chalk stream residents like mayflies and caddisflies are on the menu, as are mosquitoes, moths, and beetles. The tiny size of their prey means that bats spend a lot of time hunting – the common pipistrelle can eat 3,000 insects in one night!

While their abundant insect life makes them great places for feeding, our chalk streams have more to offer. Bankside trees supply temporary shelter, while bridges provide potential roosting spaces. Female bats roost together in the summer, when they have their babies, and all bats hibernate in roosts during the winter.

Sadly, like many wildlife species, the UK's bats are struggling to thrive. Loss of habitat, shrinking insect populations, disease, and pollution have caused their numbers to decline in recent years. Luckily there are local volunteers, like those of Hampshire Bat Group, who are supporting these amazing animals.

Among the group's many projects is the installation of 65 bat boxes in the Alresford and Overton areas. The project, which received two Watercress and Winterbournes Community Grants, aims to provide roosting spaces near the River Alre and Upper Test. The boxes will be checked twice a year for signs of use.

If you'd like to support our local bats, there are many ways to help. You could hang a bat box on a tree or a wall of your home. You could also turn your garden into a bat haven – try adding a pond, reducing artificial light, and planting night-scented flowers. The Bat Conservation Trust website has lots of good advice.



First, thank you to all those who've written since I announced I would not be standing again in Winchester at the next election. I suspect this Parliament has some way to go yet - so much still to do both here and in Westminster – but thanks for the kindness.

Residents will have heard a great deal lately about the NHS as it marks 75 years. We've honoured that locally by securing £40m of capital investment to develop an elective hub and orthopaedic outpatient facility at the **Royal Hampshire County Hospital** in Winchester. It will provide more capacity and allow more operations to take place therefore improving access to elective, planned surgery such as hip and knee replacements.

At the same time our Trust is also developing proposals to build a new outpatient facility, also in Winchester, specifically for orthopaedics. Scheduled to open in early 2025, this is part of the ongoing investment into services in the city. Winchester is heard in the corridors of power because that's my job.

Secondly, Owen Carey was just 18 when he suffered a **fatal anaphylactic reaction** after eating a chicken burger, which was stated on the menu as being plain grilled, at a restaurant in London.

Owen's sister, Emma Kocher, lives in Winchester and I am working with them to secure a change in the law to prevent other families suffering their agony. We recently met with the Food Minister at DEFRA as part of that.

They've created 'Owens Law' which calls for legal change to put more appropriate and accurate information about the allergens in their food on menus, changes in the regulations around proactive discussions with customers about allergies as well as changes in guidance and industry practice for the restaurant sector. The campaign also wants to see greater research into the causes of allergies and proper recording of, and a national register for, anaphylaxis deaths.




