

Psst, want a font?

Olivia Mills' history of Wield says simply "the font in St James's church was dug up in a garden in the close of Winchester Cathedral". I was therefore quite intrigued when, by chance, I discovered a report in the Hampshire Chronicle published on 6th August 1893 which reported that a font that had previously been dug up in a garden of the Dean in the close of Winchester Cathedral had been installed in the Cathedral.

The report was detailed. The font was Norman, made of Purbeck marble, and had originally come from the church of St Mary Kalendar in central Winchester. When that church was deemed to be redundant at the end of the English Civil War the font had been broken up and buried in the cathedral close. When it had been dug up the Dean had repaired it, fixed iron rods in the four corners, and used it for horticultural purposes.

The font in St James has clearly been repaired and a hole had been plugged in each corner. What a coincidence. I went to the Cathedral Archivist and showed him this newspaper report, but he denied any knowledge of a Norman font saying very reasonably that they had a world famous Tournai marble font already in 1893. I then gave up although it seemed obvious that we had that font.

Enter Jonathan (Sherlock) Enderby who was intrigued and carried on the investigation. After discovering much of the detail of our church in Victorian times he finally found in the Cathedral records for 1899 a hand-written note saying that "the Norman font from the North transept has been given to the church at Wield by request of the Vicar."

So, we know now that we have a Norman Purbeck marble font that, after a rather dodgy passage, has come to rest in our little Norman church.

Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

On bright and breezy days, the autumn sunshine lights up the land-scape of the valley and the wooded downlands beyond. Massive field oaks still in full leaf glow a golden brown; roadside beeches cascade bouncing beechnuts, while silver birches shake out showers of tiny seeds. The lime trees of Northington Down, storm-stripped of leaves, now reveal green globes of mistletoe high in their canopies. A towering ash tree, struggling with die-back, shows bare branches emerging from a trunk swathed in ivy. A tawny owl roosts here, tucked away deep in his evergreen haunt. At twilight he emerges to emit strange bubbling calls and to challenge any upstart owls with loud hooting contests.

Chalk woodlands often produce splendid autumn displays, especially among the broadleaved thickets. On a recent ramble around my local woods one fine morning after rain, I viewed an intriguing tableau. Set against the amber tones of a hazel copse stood a field maple with leaves of a startling yellow. A drift of dogwood, deep claret-red filled the foreground, while centre stage the bizarre coral-red berries of a spindle bush twinkled in the sunshine.

Squelching along a grassy ride beside banks of bracken, coppery brown, I tiptoed around a red admiral butterfly basking on the track. Once a seasonal visitor that migrated south in the autumn, many now remain, often visiting gardens to feed on windfall apples. Another glimpse of red beneath a wayside silver birch revealed not a butterfly, but the bright domes of fly agarics - the classic fairytale toadstool. With caps of orange-red speckled with white scales, they trooped around the birch trunk.

Heading along the track, I almost stepped on the complete skeleton of a small deer, a muntjac doe, laid out on its side in an apparent peaceful repose, the bones seemingly undisturbed and showing no obvious signs of injury.

Later while cycling home through Hassock Copse, a muntjac buck appeared by chance on the far verge. Strolling nonchalantly across the road, he paused to stare at me before slipping away into the shadows, white tail bobbing.



Summary The first week and a half was all but dry and generally sunny with above average temperatures. There were three consecutive days with temperatures in the seventies Fahrenheit with the warmest at 74°F on the 9th. This was 14°F above the seasonal average. It was overcast and wet as fronts swept across the country in the second half of the second week. Then conditions settled down to give a few days of brighter weather with significantly cooler temperatures and the first frost of the season on the 15th. The remainder of the month was dominated by low pressure with milder and unsettled conditions and rain on all but one day. The wettest day was on the 19th, with over an inch of rain. Overall, October was mild and wet with 160% of the normal rainfall for the time of year.

On the Farm—Ben Robinson

November and December on our farm is probably the quietest time of year in terms of jobs to do, though the lack of daylight means the pressure to get everything done is still very present. Largely we are putting electric fences up and taking them down as well as moving flocks of sheep between blocks of grazing. As the grass growth slows and eventually stops, we need to move sheep more regularly than in the Summer just to keep feed in front of them. If the weather is very wet or freezes hard the grazing will last even less time.

The rams have finished with the ewes and have been removed to rest and repose for another year. Any rams lacking condition will be sold as culls following some hard feeding. Scanning has been booked for early January when we find out how many lambs each ewe is carrying. We keep weighing lambs and sending them for slaughter as and when they come fit; 42kg plus and feeling 'finished'.

We have a TB test this week. Some cattle are being pre-movement tested before sale and others are calves being post movement tested. TB regulations change frequently, and a recent rule is that cattle from certain parishes of the 'Edge Area' (of which Hampshire is a part) require post movement testing if they move to a lower risk parish, such as Wield. This means that some calves that I bought from near Overton in the Summer require post movement testing. Although TB testing and movement controls are a chore it does seem that together with the badger cull, they are having a positive effect on the disease. The prevalence of TB in England is now at its lowest level since the early 2000s.

Meanwhile in Wales, where the devolved government refuses to deal with the TB reservoir in wildlife, the numbers of the cattle killed prematurely due to contracting TB continues to rise year on year.

We had a bit of a shock today- at only 16, one of our two horses, Winston, died in the field of a suspected heart attack. He went out for a hack this morning and seemed totally fine, so it was a bit out of the blue when we found him this afternoon. At least we can be glad that no one was on his back when it happened. Like any of our cattle or sheep that die on farm Winston has gone to the Hampshire Hunt kennels at Ropley, which operates a fallen stock service. It seems fitting that a horse that loved his hunting so much should end his life feeding the hounds.

As I write the weather forecast is looking increasingly wintry. On behalf of all snowplough drivers may I ask everyone to locate the towing eye on your car in case you need towing in the snow. Please also don't set out driving in a blizzard in swim wear and flip flops as I memorably saw on the A339 a few years agohowever good your car heating may be!

Progress towards new hospitals for Hampshire Hospitals Foundation Ttrust

I am a member of the Joint Health Overview and Scrutiny Committee at HCC. The meeting at the end of October was very interesting: my role there is to represent your views, so please keep them coming! Health services provided by the different parts of the NHS are scrutinised by the County Council and this JHOSC looks specifically at the progress of the HHFT's application for the 'new hospital'. Our local Hospital Trust has received confirmation that new hospital funding is still available, but choice of design is not for our Trust alone: work is being done nationally to look at value for money/best practice designs for new hospitals.

The Integrated Care Board (ICB) is looking at provision, bearing in mind that the number of over 75's is predicted to increase by over 50% in the next 20 years. There are a few more hurdles to cross- but a consultation for all of us is expected relatively soon: picture yourself in a decade: what services will you and your family need then and in 2050? Responses will be online, and in person, I'll advertise details asap.





Westminster has been a buzz of activity (more than usual even) in recent weeks as the new session of Parliament got underway with a **King's Speech**, an **Autumn Statement** that did even more to stand with people as we head into Winter and a **Cabinet reshuffle** that rather took me back to my early days as an MP.

David Cameron and I have stayed in touch since he left the House of Commons in 2016 – he's done some really good stuff with dementia research – but to become our new Foreign Secretary was a (rare) well-kept Westminster secret. I look forward to working with David again and he's already made himself freely available to colleagues; crucial of course given world events.

Much more local – where all politics is of course – I am welcoming a massive new funding package from central Government to **fix potholes and maintain local roads**. Ministers announced £132 million for Hampshire to tackle the issue of potholes and over the next ten years invest in longer term, proactive road maintenance.

How did we do that given money is tight? Well, everyone had something to say about scaling back HS2 but it's because of funds redistributed from that we can put this cash directly into Hampshire.

Wherever it comes from, this is welcome news for Hampshire and follows significant lobbying by the Conservative County Council to make the case for additional money, nationally, to help reverse the deterioration of our roads. Having a ten-year settlement confirmed enables them to plan ahead carefully with more certainty, and to allocate and prioritise resources more effectively.

The money will help to tackle the challenges of unprecedented demand, soaring inflation, and the impacts of heavy rain, flooding and sub-zero temperatures; all which impact on our road surfaces. The County Council has already allocated £22.5 million of its own money over the next three years to repair potholes and other defects and this is already helping to make our roads stronger ahead of another potentially difficult winter period.
