

John of Candover

Directly after the Norman Conquest (1066) the family of Andely, or De'aundely, settled in Chilton Candover and St. Mary Bourne. They probably came from Les Andelys, a fortified town on the River Seine between Parish and Rouen. By 1086 the Manor of Chilton Candover was held by Richer de Andely, under the Bishop of Winchester and the land continued in possession of the family for the next 475 years before being sold to John Fyssher.

One of the Daundely family, know as Johan du Candevre, lived at Chilton Candover in the 13th century and when he died in 1295, he was buried in a stone coffin in the churchyard of St. Nicholas church and is inscribed (translated from the Lombardic script) "Here lies John of Candover, may God have mercy on his soul".

John of Candover was a man of considerable importance and during the construction of ten royal castles in North Wales for Edward 1 in the last quarter of the 13th century, he held the appointment of Warden of the Works, under the great Master Builder James of St George. His responsibilities included the assembling of artisans

labourers from every county in England, the provision of iron, steel, timber and masonry and all building materials, near the site of the new castles, Conway, Caernavon, Harlech, Rhuddlan, Ruthin, Flint, Aberysthwyth and other great fortified works.

He received money from the Lord Treasurer for the payment of wages to a large labour force, comprising some 600 smiths, carpenters, masons and quarrymen, together with about 2,000 minor workmen. All had to be found living quarter near the building sites, and arrangements and made for their gathering in from far-flung counties, in groups of 30 to 70, with transport for their tools, each group escorted by guides.

Payment of wages was in silver pennies, and in 1283-84 some 1,400,00 coins had to brought to Conway, a formidable undertaking in itself. Pressure of building work and general administration must have been massive, all ten major castles being completed within eighteen years 1277-1295. This was largely due to the energy and brilliance of Master Builder James of St. George supported by John of Candover.

In 1284 John was admitted to the Rectory of Swarraton and it is noted that he was a receiver of royal revenue in France at Agen, Cahors and Auch; it is also know that he was granted 40 acres of Land at Conway.

Communications and transport at that time was limited to horses, carts and wagons and it astonishing that so much was efficiently and so speedily undertaken.

Message from Ian

A couple of weeks ago I had a free day and as the weather was nice, I took myself off to Brownsea Island to take some photos of the red squirrels.

Brownsea Island, for those who don't know, is a beautiful island off Poole. I loaded up my camera with a really long lens, set off early, got the ferry and walked to where I knew the red squirrels had a drey. I was excited when I arrived, because there was an adult scampering around. I put some nuts around the tree withdrew a short distance and waited. And waited and waited and waited. On the Farm—Julian Gibbons

On the arable farm, June is like listening to an audio book or podcast on x1.5 speed. It seems to speed up as one races to harvest.

The spring sown crops that went in later then would have hoped, generally look better then we could have hoped. They still aren't going to be record breakers, but better then they might have been. This is due to the kind May weather, not too hot and with just enough rain. This contrasts with the very dry Mays we have been having of recent years. Grass has grown constantly so there should have been plenty of grass silage made.

We finished putting in the wild bird crops in the beginning of May and these have had to have slug pellets to stop the biblical plague of slug devouring them as they emerge.

Autumn crop establishment might be challenging if they stay at the current levels. We have bought a straw rake to rake the fields after harvest. The theory is that it helps to spread the post-harvest trash and breaks up slug nests and their eggs. These can then either dry out and die or get eaten by birds. We will see if the theory is correct in practice.

We have re-sheeted another old shed. The old asbestos fibre cement roof had started leaking so has been replaced with a new fibre cement roof and cladding to match the rest. Asbestos fibre cement sheeting doesn't pose a health risk where it is, however, its removal requires specialist teams and is expensive to remove and dispose.

We just have the Maris Otter malting barley still in store, but that should have gone by the end of the week as I write this. Our oats have all gone for processing for UK produced oat milk. From us they go to near Devizes, where they are cleaned, and colour sorted. They then pass through a magnet field and destoner to remove any stones and metal objects. They are then dehulled to remove the husk and leave the clean groat to be stabilised before going for processing, water added, pasteurised and blended and then finally packed, all done in Shepton Mallett. The biggest oat milk brand is Swedish, so it is good that consumers have an opportunity to choose a brand grown and produced in the UK by the Wessex Oat Co. It can even be traced back to the farms and fields that produced it.

The poor autumn is putting pressure on the supply of seed for autumn crops, and we are being encouraged to make plans and order seed before harvest to guarantee supplies. This mirrors what we saw with spring sown crops where if you hadn't secured your orders in early November we would have struggled for supplies. We do have the option of keeping some grain aside to have cleaned and dressed for farm saved seed.

Last jobs before harvest are barn cleaning and rogueing crops to pull up wild oats. This is especially important if we wish to keep some of the grain for seed

We know there hasn't been a lot of love for our telephone system – lots of you have told us that the queue facility wasn't good enough and that you frequently got cut off after waiting for over 20 minutes. Looking for a solution to these problems we have been in negotiations with our current telecoms supplier for the last two years. We are now pleased to report that we have negotiated an early release from our contract and commissioned a new system from a new supplier.

Our new telephone system went live on Friday 17th May and we have been working hard behind the scenes to get everything set up.

From a caller's point of view, you may notice several changes. Firstly, you will be told where you are in the queue and if the queue reaches a certain size, or you have been waiting for a while, you will be offered the choice of receiving a call back. This is an automated process which holds your place in the queue and calls you back when you reach the front. From our point of view, we will have easy and ready access to data on how busy the phones are and the number of calls waiting.

All incoming and outgoing calls will be automatically recorded and used for training purposes.

Alongside this investment in technology, we are increasing the size of the team handling the calls and we hope both these factors will improve the experience for our patients in their first contact with the surgery.



Summary The unsettled and cool conditions from the previous month continued into May before high pressure provided some fine, sunny weather in the second week culminating in the warmest day at 79°F on the 12th. Low pressure systems returned towards the middle of the month with ³/₄ of an inch of rain on the 13th which ended, almost a week of dry weather. The second half of May was cloudy with sunny spells interspersed with showers or longer outbreaks of rain and temperatures were about average for the time of year. The rainfall for May and the spring season were above average and this was the fourth consecutive month with high rainfall. The temperature for the month and season were above the norm.



Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

Heading down to Ovington for a stroll by the river, we park in the shade of the wooded lane leading along to the Bush Inn. A splendid array of hart's-tongue ferns, with their clumps of glossy green blades, cover the bank bordering the narrow side-stream. From the tree canopy high above, a thrush sings loud and clear, pouring out melodies as we follow the path along to the wooden footbridge that spans the river.

We find the Itchen in full spate, surging below the bridge. Gazing down into the clear waters, we try to spot brown trout lying almost invisible on the stony bed beside the swirling green tresses of water crowfoot. Upriver a throng of house martins, swallows and swifts sweep low over the treeline, clearly feeding on insects. A mayfly spins by – a clue perhaps to the aerial feast taking place beyond.

Tall stands of yellow flag irises fill the wetland meadows beside the river and mark the way along the footpath that leads to Itchen Stoke. Dancing damselflies, known as banded demoiselles, are an unexpected delight this morning, shimmering a metallic blue at the water's edge. A chubby brown water vole comes bumbling along the soggy path. As we watch, it abruptly turns and dives into the undergrowth of bankside plants.

Later, on our journey home we note a curious sight. Here and there the leafy hedgerows are festooned with dusky webs – spun not by spiders but by caterpillars. Tucked under their protective netting, safe from foraging birds, these moth larvae munch away, stripping the bushes bare of leaves. The caterpillars will next pupate before emerging later in the summer as Small Ermine moths.

Here on the chalk downland, there are two main species of these moths: those that feed on spindle bushes and those that favour hawthorn or blackthorn hedges. Small Ermines are elegant little moths with fluffy white heads and sleek white wings, decorated with black spots. Over the summer their webs will gradually fade away as the shrubs slowly recover from their vigorous pruning.





Amongst the congregation were labradors, whippets, wire haired dachshunds and Dolly, the horse that hacked all the way from Medstead!






Jackie's County Corner for July 2024

Council meetings include formal questions: the whole question time is limited to 30 minutes, and like the rest of the meeting, is recorded for public viewing. I asked a question on speed limits relating to one village, but took the opportunity (as a supplementary) to ask if a community must choose between 20 and 30 mph: which limit would be best /most likely to secure enforcement for a village with traffic issues?

Questions come up some way into the recording. My first on speed limits is about 11 minutes in. I asked another on the Cart and Horses junction about 24 minutes into the session. I will add the transcript to my website.

Calling the General Election means that no new decisions can be made or meetings called in the 'pre-election period',. This has delayed the working party decisions on the cuts to HCC Services consulted upon in the Spring until the September round of council meetings. This is unfortunate but allows us as local citizens more time to make a case for improvements to services, not cuts.

I continue to work almost daily with Parents who don't think their children are getting a fair deal from Hampshire's Education and Social care teams. This is heart rending, especially as HCC's work is considered 'Outstanding' by Ofsted but I will continue to work for each parent and child one by one to resolve differences amicably. It is very frustrating to see parents going to the complaint stage in the hope of a final resolution in their fight for a decent education for their child.

I asked for broadband issues from you, and you delivered!

Some of you still struggle to secure a system that works for you. Delivering faster internet speed is no longer a specific County role, and was reassigned to Government some time ago, but if I can use your cases to show that HCC influence is still needed before everyone has access to a superfast Service, and it could improve delivery of FTTP to more of you in this division, then it will be worthwhile.
