Dear Friends

We are in that season between planting and harvest and whilst enjoying the sunshine farmers are hoping for rain to swell the grain to improve the yield. Here's a little story about plant growth and yield.

A farmer went out to plant her seed. While she was planting, some seed fell by the road, and the birds came and ate it all up. Some seed fell on rocky ground, where there wasn't much soil. And what is the seed that fell among the thorny weeds? That seed is like the person who hears the teaching but let worries about this life and the temptation of wealth stop that teaching from growing. So the teaching does not produce fruit in that person's life.

Water: A Precious But Limited Resource

In England, we're lucky enough that access to clean drinking water requires only a turn of the tap. This incredible natural resource is so readily available, in fact, that we can easily forget about its limitations. But recent summers have painted a worrying picture: increasing demand coupled with insufficient supply.

The UK's population is set to increase by around four million people by 2045. Climate change is shifting our weather towards longer dry spells interspersed with flash flooding. Even in today's conditions, a period of extreme drought would result in a water supply deficit of 500 million litres per day – enough to supply three million people.

This is a problem because our primary water sources – lakes, rivers, reservoirs, and aquifers – have a limited supply. What's more, if too much water is taken then waterbodies can grow overly warm and shallow. Oxygen is lost and pollutants become concentrated. Amazing animals like the mayfly and brown trout can overheat and suffocate.

To address this pressing problem, England's water companies are required to create Water Resources Management Plans. These documents detail how they intend to balance water supply and demand for at least the next 25 years. New plans for 2024 are currently in development, and they will have huge implications for nature.

If you would like to explore your water company's draft Water Resources Management Plan, it will be available somewhere on their website. Southern Water's, for example, can be read at www.southernwater.co.uk/waterresources. Unfortunately, the plans themselves can be lengthy, technical, and difficult to decipher.

Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

A swathe of meadow buttercups borders the trail leading across a grassy plain, now crowded with humps of hawthorns. Here at Home Farm, the Woodland Trust's reserve at Burkham Bentworth near Bradley, the hawthorns are in bloom under hazy blue skies. Smothered white with May blossom, they create a spectacular downland display, somewhat offset by their curious scent.

Beyond the gleaming buttercups, patchworks of pink flowers sway among the tall meadow grasses. First the starry fingers of ragged-robin flicker upwards, followed by a zone of the cones and spires of sainfoin or 'holy hay', a forage plant very popular with bees. A constant tapping from the top of a hawthorn dome reveals a handsome bird, smartly turned out with a black crown, white collar, and a russet-orange chest glowing in the sunshine. It's a male stonechat with its pebble-tap call.

A red kite floats overhead as we follow the white chevrons of the way-marked trail looping through the woods. A soundtrack of bird-song plays from the leafy shadows all around: solos from blackbirds and robins; the chant of a chiffchaff, plus a whole chorus of hidden warblers. Speckled wood butterflies guard their sunlit patches, flying up to challenge intruders in their shaft of sunlight. A lone orange-tip wanders through on a quest for garlic mustard and perhaps some female companions.

Emerging at Tickley meadow where the songs of skylarks and pipits mingle and flow from far above, we stride up to the hillside copse where the green permissive path reveals some hidden highlights. Tucked in beneath the trees are the tall stems of white helleborines, growing in the dappled shade. Each bears a spike of egg-shaped cream -white flowers. Often found growing under beeches, these orchids may have spread down from the beech hangar beyond.

Tiny butterflies bask on the sunlit path – small heaths that favour dry grassland are well camouflaged. Small blues with their silvery under-wings visit the vetches and trefoils, along with common blues. As we head back, a muntjac buck begins to bark from deep in the woods behind.

Covid spring booster programme

Over the months of April-June our amazing bank practice nurses vaccinated 1,300 of our patients who were eligible for their covid spring booster. In addition to this our community nurse team vaccinated any eligible, truly housebound patients.

We would like to thank our amazing staff who have carried out this booster programme in addition to their usual workload, this includes our tremendous Reception team & Management team who are pivotal in the coordination of the programme.

After 30 June, the COVID-19 vaccine will only be offered to those at higher risk of serious infection & these will need to be given via a vaccination hub.

We will update patients as soon as we have been updated by NHS England with regards to if/when there will be an autumn booster program.

Travelling abroad

Immunisations and advice are available through our Travel Service. Please collect a form from Reception or follow the link on our website to complete the form online, and then make an appointment in our Travel Clinic.

The form should be returned to the surgery prior to your appointment. You will have a telephone appointment initially to discuss all your travel arrangements, then if required a follow up face to face appointment for the vaccinations.

You should allow at least 8 weeks to enable vaccination courses to be completed.

On the Farm - Julian Gibbons

May and June have been very dry, and the heavy showers have been hit and miss, but all gratefully received. I am glad we chose peas and not spring beans as our pulse crop as peas generally cope better with dry spells. They have however been plagued by pigeons especially around the edges. Our whirly "Flash Harrys" seemed to act as a landing indicator and I have reluctantly dragged a gas gun out to try and move them on. We have had a couple of guys shooting at weekends who have been quite successful.

We finally have got our winter wild bird strips planted. We had been waiting for enough rain to give us confidence they will go in and grow quickly. The mixtures we are allowed to use under our environmental schemes are quite prescriptive. This is to ensure they have a range of seed sizes and will shed gradually over the winter period. It is no use just have seed for September and October. WE will spray them with a herbicide to make sure they don't become swamped with weeds, but the odd weed can produce a food source even if it is insects not seeds.

We had a visit in early June to a processing plant for Oats. They clean the oats and use colour sorters to take out weed material and bits of Ergot. It uses blasts of air to blow out the foreign material. They also have magnets to remove any small bit of metal. The oats are then dehulled. This involves removing the husk (or outer coating of the seed) to leave the groat. The processed oats are then delivered to a processing and packing plant where they are turned into oat milk. Although I am a big milk drinker and there is little better than it as a complete food, I appreciate some people choose to have something else. British produced oat milk uses locally grown oats has a short supply chain. Oats are a low input crop requiring much less fertiliser and spray inputs and unlike soya there is no dispute on whether it is grown on former rainforest land. Almond milk is controversial, because of the vast amounts of water used to grow Almonds, and the fact that they are grown in areas that are generally low in rainfall doesn't help the local environment.

On the farm there is little more we can do to the current crops except the peas that are only just coming into flower as I write this. Threats to the peas are Pea Moth (lots of them this year) and Pea Aphids (lots of them as well). We still have our oats to move off the farm, but they should go in the first half of July.

As always, please watch out for tractors and trailers and combine harvesters moving on the lanes over harvest and apologies if you get stuck behind one on your journey, we can only pull over if it is safe for you to pass.



Daytime temperatures were above average in the last two weeks, despite a persistent north/north-easterly breeze. There was unbroken sunshine on several of the last eight days with a cloudless sky at times, and colder overnight temperatures. The overall temperature and rainfall for the month were slightly above the norm. The spring season was slightly cooler than normal, and it was the second wettest, due to the extremely wet March, with 162% of the long term average rainfall.

Water quality is a hot topic, and I was pleased to join Margot Power on a group visit to the water treatment plant at Alresford recently. There, we took the politics out of the conversation, and learned a lot about the science and the way the engineers manage the varying flows in very dry and very wet weather to avoid storm overflows. It is heartening to hear that the site has capacity to take the new developments in the town. We discussed how Southern Water manages the chemicals and other materials that arise from the wastewater, but wherever we live in the division, we can all play our part too. Only put the three P's* in the toilet, and please choose cleaning products with the lowest phosphate levels if you can.

The County Council has a budget consultation out until the 23rd July. The link is www.hants.gov.uk/budgetconsultation You can see a commentary before you respond. Can I urge you to take part? Often the low level of responses implies that citizens aren't interested, which I'm sure is far from the truth. Suggestions to reduce costs are cutting school crossing patrols, cutting HWRC costs by over 50%, and not resurfacing roads! But there are implications for social care for children and adults too: services which are already overstretched.

Talking of potholes; I asked three questions at the last HCC meeting, about potholes, recycling, and the cost of travel to special needs education.

My first question related to your complaints about tyre and wheel damage: how many **complaints had HCC received about potholes in the first three months of 2023**? The answer was a staggering 1175, approx. 10 every day, distinctly increasing from the previous year. You can see the answers to all three questions on the HCC County Council recording of the 18th May 2023.

The County Councillor grant scheme is now open for small grants. Each councillor has a total fund of £8000, so you are advised to contact me before applying so that we can discuss your plans. Go to www.hants.gov.uk and search county councillor grants. This fund is open until the money runs out, so please contact me in the next few months to ensure you are not disappointed.

Although maybe not in your ward, the Cart and Horses junction is used by most drivers and cyclists After the fatal accident in the Autumn, the local councillors felt they had no democratic way to voice their concerns to the Exec Member and it was a relief that he was persuaded to meet with Parish and City Councillors.

We discussed every suggestion that you have put to us for short term junction improvements which are now being assessed for feasibility by the traffic engineers. We acknowledged that the time for major change is when building the new junction 9 is and the County will be consulting on options for that new Cart and Horses junction in the summer, probably July-September. I raised this matter too, at the M3 Junction 9 Open Floor Hearing in May. You can see the full (OFH) Open Floor Hearing on the NSIP website; my presentation is also on my website.



The issue of water quality and combined storm overflows (CSO's) has shot up the agenda in recent years. As a result, I have worked really hard educate myself - and in-turn I hope constituents when they get in touch - about the subject.

If it were easy CSO's would never have been a thing in the first place so anyone who tells you it's a simple fix is deceiving, you and I think most reasonable people know that. Also, and I find very few people genuinely know this, it's essential to understand why overflows are not simply switched off by Ministerial decree.

It all goes back to a Victorian sewerage system which was never built for this level of development or indeed rainfall.

This Government has done more than any other on the issue of water quality starting with proper monitoring, so we know the extent of the problem. That has given great publicity to the issue but I guess that's the serious business of Government not the luxury of opposition.

The 'Storm overflow discharge reduction plan', brought about by the Environment Act I voted FOR requires water companies to make their largest infrastructure spend in water company history to increase capacity. It is backed by up to £56 billion capital investment. And we've ringfenced now unlimited fines from water companies so that they don't go to HM Treasury but stay in DEFRA for environmental projects.

Last year I visited Southern Water's water treatment works at Morestead Lane (pictured) to really understand how the waste-water process works. And I visited Thruxton (near Andover) see what how their 'Pathfinder' project is pioneering a way to tackle groundwater infiltration into sewer s ystems, which adds to the pressure that triggers a discharge.

I am staying close to Southern Water to understand how they are interpreting the Environment Act and urging them to go further and faster.

No-one is pretending this is easy. Our Victorian sewerage system combines storm / ground water with that produced by toilets, dishwashers and bathtubs. Without a discharge it would literally come back up your loo and plug hole.



We want to change that which is why we're facing up to the problem and acting.

That is painstaking work so far from ignoring the situation, the Government and I are taking it extremely seriously and taking action to provide better water quality in this country. You can find more on this, and links to all I've mentioned here, at stevebrine.com/factorfake-waterquality

Finally, I have spoken out against plans by **Winchester City Council** to start charging for **parking after 7pm** in most city centre. Clearly many residents supported this council and the current administration in May – it has a big majority to force it through - but you have to win the argument as well as the vote in my opinion. This is the last thing the city needs right now in terms of the nighttime economy and it's going to be especially unwelcome for residents out in these villages who may have no choice but to drive into Winchester for an evening at a restaurant, bar or such like. Please tell your city councillors what you think, and they can feed that into the leadership.


