Dear Friends

Handel wrote his anthem 'Zadok the Priest and Nathan the Prophet' for the coronation of George II in 1727 and is likely to be heard on Classic Fm playlists this month.

The anthem, sung at Queen Elizabeth II coronation in 1953, refers to the anointing of King Solomon by Nathan the Prophet and Zadok the Priest. King Charles III will be anointed with specially prepared olive oil from the Mount of olives in Jerusalem by the Archbishop of Canterbury in the coronation service.

Anointing with oil is a special action and something a priest or minister may give when prayers for healing are made or applied to a person near to death. A child in the baptism service receives the sign of the cross in oil with the words, "Christ claims you for his own". Church of England clergy in their ordination services are anointed with oil on their hands for service by a Bishop and the oil used in all these occasions will have been blessed in a cathedral service on Maundy Thursday.

The anointing of the monarch draws on the action of Samuel anointing King David, of Zadok anointing Solomon and also the anointing of Bishops, Priests and Deacons in Church of England ordinations. The anointing of the King is a part of the coronation service in which the King's divine role is recognised, that under God he may fulfil that role in which power and service, state and God, authority and accountability all combine in such a way that seeks the best welfare of his subjects. Interestingly the actual anointing of Her late Majesty the Queen was an action too intimate to be televised in 1953, we shall see what happens on May 6th, 2023!

Her late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II was widely praised and respected for her obvious commitment to serve the nation and commonwealth as monarch in a Christ honouring way, she sought wholeheartedly to fulfil her coronation oaths. Some people, we are told, will protest the crowning of King Charles saying, "not my king". (Is that treasonable under the Treason Felony Act 1848?) but we will have a crowned monarch on May 6th who will have sworn to serve faithfully under God







Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

With lambs bouncing around the fields and the hedgerows sprinkled white with blackthorn blossom, spring returns to the high downs. On rare sunny days, great spotted woodpeckers begin to drum, beating out their familiar tattoos from the bare branches of ash trees.

Lesser celandines revel in the record damp days of March creating a broad splash, a golden gleam in fleeting sunshine along the lane-side verges. Brimstone butterflies, sulphur yellow, huge buff-tailed queen bumblebees, and the curiously furry bee-flies, emerge to roam in search of nectar, mainly from primroses.

For squelchy woodland walks, wellie boots and wet weather gear seem most appropriate this spring. The white flowers of wood anemones light up the dappled shade of the woodland edge. An indicator of ancient woodland, wood anemones bloom well before the massed ranks of bluebells. Tracking down wood-sorrel is another springtime delight. An early spring flower of the shady woodland floor, this plant was often sought at Easter-time. With distinctive three-lobed leaflets and delicate white flowers, wood-sorrel was formerly known as Alleluia for its links to Holy Week. The less devout apparently found the leaves quite tasty and would nibble them as a tangy salad in cheese sandwiches.

Good Friday proved to be fine and fair as we headed over to Noar Hill near Selborne, for an early springtime ramble around the humps and hollows of this intriguing nature reserve. Chiffchaffs were the bird of the morning, chanting from the tree-tops, active but quite elusive. Perhaps eight or more of these little brown leaf warblers were darting about. By chance, two birds burst from the sunlit crown of a juniper, wings flicking, tails twitching, their repetitive calls amplified by the dip of the dell.

Across the grassy slopes, sweet violets were the flower of the moment, centre stage in the springtime succession. Their intensely deep blue flowers were visited by queen bumblebees, especially the impressive black ones with red tails.

At the woodland edge, the crown of a goat or pussy willow glowed in the morning sunshine with golden catkins humming with honeybees.



This year, we had an **INSPIRING WOMEN** eclectic mix of female pioneers in the fields of political lobbying and journalism plus tales of adventure on the high seas.

Jennifer Miller was a director of the CBI during the Thatcher, Major, Blair, and Cameron years, encountering a range of politicians and heads of industry, some pleasant others rather challenging and most with huge egos!! She was usually the only woman in the room, having to take on many varied roles in her time, learned to think quickly on her feet and hold her own. Jennifer rapidly became an expert in organising information sharing events, dealing with HR, PR, marketing, and finance matters whilst also getting her feet on the ground by visiting businesses, manufacturing industries and even nuclear plants. She conducted many interviews with the press, including one memorable and unexpected TV session where she had to go on camera wearing a Christmas jumper. It was very well received!!

Diana Irons had an amazing career as a journalist specialising in the movie and film industry. She began, earning just £14.10 a week for MGM in St James' in London, by helping to publicise and promote new film releases. She rapidly learned how to deal with the press, to manage crowds at premiers, shepherding film stars or royalty, helping with big receptions, obtaining unusual props at short notice such as a sleigh in Bond Street for the premier of Dr Zhivago just because it was snowing! In her time, Diana rubbed shoulders with Sophia Loren, Julie Christie, Peter Ustinov amongst others. Strangely, she only met Omar Sharif many years later when they ended up sitting next to each other at a dinner!

Tina Bowie is a remarkably intrepid sailor, who learned to sail as a child with her father in India. She loved exploring, sailing on her own and racing. When she met and married Ian Bowie, they shared the same love of the sea and the joy of racing. Together they raced from Hong Kong to Manilla, got stuck on a reef at one point, explored ex-President Marcos' palace (Imelda really did have masses of highend shoes!) and were hosted by local island people who had nothing by comparison. They undertook a huge trip from Singapore to the UK, taking in the Malacca Straits, Sri Lanka, the Maldives, and Spain amongst others! Subsequently, they crossed the Pacific to the Caribbean several times and returned to the far east for further adventures. Tina especially recalls one trip from Phuket to Hong Kong and Sri Lanka where they encountered a huge whale. The whale, although curious as to what the boat was, eventually got bored, spat masses of water over them and disappeared.

Rediscovering Chalk Stream Treasures

Formed by a happy accident of weather and geology, our chalk streams show nature at its most magnificent. But look into the water near an old house, footpath, or footbridge and you may also see human additions: fragments of blue-and -white Victorian pottery, the edge of a stoneware beer bottle, or a shard of aqua glass from the 19th century.

Jane Eastman, who lives near the Upper Test, is dedicated to rediscovering these lost treasures. For several years now, she has been 'streamlarking' – wading in chalk streams and plucking pieces of history from their gravelly beds. The result is an incredible range of finds, each made more fascinating when her research reveals their origins.

There are coffin-shaped poison bottles, sometimes with contents remaining. There are the bowls of broken clay pipes – the cigarette butts of their day. There are imperfectly made ink bottles – testaments to a time of rapidly increasing literacy. Then there are precious metals: an 18-carat gold wristwatch and a folding fruit knife in sterling silver.

After some careful cleaning, Jane posts her finds on a dedicated Instagram account called @myordinarytreasure, along with their stories. This act of sharing has given thousands of people a window into Hampshire's history, and highlighted how our chalk streams have shaped – and been shaped by – human lives over the centuries.

But for Jane, the search itself has equal value. "It's a privilege to enjoy the local landscape from this unique perspective; to be immersed in a river that's thriving and teeming with life," she says. "Without a doubt, it is this experience of being in the beautiful chalk stream environment which I take home as the ultimate 'treasure'."

If you'd like to have a go at streamlarking, remember to get permission from the landowner when on private land. Stick to shallow water and don't go out alone; chalk streams can be deeper and faster than they look. Always use the 'Check, Clean, Dry' process for your clothes and equipment, to avoid spreading diseases and invasive species.



Summary March started dry and cold, with temperatures significantly below the seasonal norm. This changed with measurable rain on all but one day from the 5th and milder air from the middle of the second week. There was over two inches of snow on the 8th which was followed by light rain in the evening. The unsettled and largely dull conditions continued to the end of the month, with drizzle and showers or longer outbreaks of rain and it was breezy at times. This was the wettest March in over two decades, following on from the driest February, with more rain than the two preceding months combined and more than twice the monthly norm. The days were cooler and nights milder than average, resulting in overall temperatures normal for the time of year.

On the Farm -

Lambing has finished now apart from around half a dozen stragglers who have been turned out into the paddock behind the farm buildings. Despite a lot of rain and some fairly cold temperatures lambing has gone well.

Vaccinating pre-tupping against enzootic abortion has made a big positive difference to both the rate of abortion and the vitality of the lambs. At lambing time I am often asked by non-farmers 'have you lost any?' The simple answer is yes. Vets reckon that losing less than 10% of lambs from pregnancy scanning to sale is a good level to aim for. On an indoor lambing system losing less than 5% in the first week of life is doing very well. Sadly, it's inevitable for many reasons; nutrition, mismothering, predators, bacterial infection, bad weather and many more! Sheep aren't always the most robust of animals when young.

I am just clearing the last of the hoggets (last year's lambs). Prices were poor from January to March, so I left them out on some water meadow ground to 'tick over'. They won't grow much on winter rough grazing, but it will keep them fed. In the middle of March, a boatload of lamb from New Zealand destined for the UK was diverted to China. Following the Chinese releasing of lockdowns they were prepared to pay more than we were for the frozen lamb, so the captain turned sharply to starboard and docked in Shangai! This, coupled with Easter and Ramadan being at a very similar time this year has led to the lamb price rocketing in a few short weeks. By luck rather than judgement I had 450 lambs on hard feed ready to sell into the hungry market. Next year I will no doubt get the timing wrong. All commodity markets are increasingly volatile, with lamb being no exception!

Having finished our own lambing, we are helping another flock down near Alton with theirs. They lamb later and run an outdoor lambing system. The thinking behind this is that the weather is kinder, and the grass is more plentiful at the end of April and early May compared to earlier in the Spring. This means the ewes can lamb outside with lower labour input. However, a hardier, less productive breed is needed, and the lambs may take a little longer to get up to slaughter weight than on a more intensive, earlier lambing indoor system. It also needs fields sheltered from the weather. The normal weather here at Newmer seems to be a howling gale so we have continued lambing in the shed. I haven't been involved in an outdoor lambing set up before so it will be interesting to see how it differs from our way of doing things.

Can you lend us a hand?

A few years back, when I held the Public Health brief in Government, I published a robust tobacco control plan to drive down the **number of smokers** and support people to quit. Smoking is still the biggest preventable killer in our country so it's the right thing to do.

Now, my successor is going further with an updated plan to help meet the ambition of being smokefree by 2030 – reducing smoking rates to 5% or less. Part of this will see one million smokers encouraged to swap cigarettes for vapes under a pioneering new "swap to stop" scheme.

As part of the world-first national scheme, almost one in five of all smokers in England will be provided with a vape starter kit alongside support to help them quit the habit as part of a series of new measures.

Hampshire County Council will be invited to take part in the scheme and design a scheme which suits our needs, including deciding which groups to prioritise.

And following the success of previous schemes, pregnant women will be offered financial incentives to help them stop smoking. This will involve offering vouchers, alongside behavioural support, to all pregnant women who smoke by the end of next year.

Supporting more women to have a smokefree pregnancy will reduce the number of babies born underweight or underdeveloped with health problems requiring neonatal and ongoing care. It will also reduce the risk of miscarriage and stillbirth.

I hear the government will also consult on introducing mandatory cigarette pack inserts with positive messages and information to help people to quit the habit. There will be a welcome crackdown on illicit vape sales as part of measures to stop children and non-smokers take up the habit – which is growing in popularity among young people.

NHS figures for 2021 showed that 9% of 11- to 15-year-old children used e-cigarettes, up from 6% in 2018 so we must act. The fact remains, up to two out of three lifelong smokers will die from smoking. Cigarettes are the only product on sale which will kill you if used correctly. But for those who quit, the risk of heart attack is halved after one year of quitting, ultimately halving the likelihood of ending up in a hospital bed or worse.

Cutting smoking rates reduces the number of smoking-related illnesses needing to be treated, in turn reducing the pressure on the NHS, helping to cut NHS waiting lists.

All of this follows positive progress in the recent decade; smoking prevalence in England in 2021 was 13% - the lowest on record thanks to measures such as doubling duty on cigarettes since 2010 and continued funding to local stop smoking services.

Last year an independent smoking review led by Javed Khan proposed a range of measures to help people stub out the addiction, which has informed many of the measures set out in this new plan.



So many people complain about dreadful potholes everywhere. I am worried that the public aren't looking ahead now when they drive but look down at the road to swerve round the next deep hole in the roadway. Flooded roads means that holes are often unseen until your tyre bursts. Residents are having to pay out for a new tyre or wheel but unfortunately in most cases, HCC refuses to accept their claims for compensation.

Hampshire received £5.954m of the £200m Government budget announcement and has informed county councillors how this will be spent. They will continue to tackle them as they do now. But I know that many of you (like me) are frustrated by the 'one complaint, one patch' method, when you can see holes not mended in the same vicinity in one visit.

HCC say the primary objective of the programme will be to deploy more smaller patching teams that can focus on fixing potholes and other localised defects across the road network. HCC will utilise the existing 'Dragon Patchers' and other established repair techniques. The Director estimates that the extra money should enable HCC to repair up to 40,000 more potholes.

Bus Service changes

Although the £2 fee (running until 30th June) has been popular, the bus services in Winchester district are changing with some bus cuts too. The new timetable is on the Stagecoach website, but changes are as extensive as the weblink, so I've created a tinyurl which works too: https://tinyurl.com/BusChangesApril23 Use of buses has declined since Covid, and recovery is slow-driver shortages contribute to this. These cuts and changes will be hard for students and

keyworkers who rely on buses. No route in my division has been eliminated, but please contact me if anyone in your family is experiencing difficulties. I continue to campaign for a better early/late offer for all communities along the 86 route.

School Places for Children starting school.

The current HCC school transport policy adversely affects children starting at rural schools with long journeys as the free school transport offer is not provided for children before the term after they are 5 (unless they are entitled to Free School Meals). If you are worried about getting your child to school, please contact me without delay. I want to ensure that all parents are confident that transport arrangements are in place for September.

Cart and Horses Junction

Cllr Nick Adams-King has *again refused to meet* with local councillors on this matter, until the recent accident investigation is received. This is very disappointing. We have secured the principle of works when the M3 junction 9 work is being done, but this is subject to funding and only likely by 2027! Like you, I want to HCC to install earlier, simple, and effective changes now.
