Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

A startled grey squirrel races over the lawn, takes a flying leap across our little pond and comes down with a splash on the far side. Undaunted, it bounces out and away, its fur cloaked bright green with blobs of duckweed. Apart from the lure of bird-feeders, the local squirrels enjoy raiding our bumper crop of hazelnuts. In a fine summer for fruit and nut crops, it's also show-time for the lime trees along the Candover valley. They appear to be festooned with pale green tickets – the oblong papery bracts of their flower clusters.

On St.Swithin's Day, we avoid the ominous blustery showers with a ramble through Micheldever Woods. We explore the secluded perimeter trail that runs along the woodland edge, overlooking a tract of farmland known as Old Mill. Butterflies abound: with every step we seem to chance upon another favourite. Red admirals in particular are having an astonishing year – we meet six of them spaced out neatly in a row along the path. In a clearing where clumps of brambles are in flower, we discover not only comma butterflies with their raggedy wing outlines, but three splendid silver-washed fritillaries. With deep orange wings wide-spread, these large spectacular butterflies were apparently resting.

There's a Forestry Commission woodland that lies along the lane leading up to Woodmancott from East Stratton. Known as Embley Wood, it's not an obvious choice for a quiet stroll because of the background roar of the motorway. Nevertheless it seems quite popular with dog walkers and trail bikers. On a recent Sunday morning visit, we were pleased to find a fine display of butterflies, some fourteen different species, including a sighting of my first small copper of the season. A southern hawker dragonfly cruised the shady main ride, while a damselfly, the beautiful demoiselle, perched high on a hazel. Birdsong though is quite a challenge in this wood, apart from a black-cap that managed to make itself heard. The bird identification app, Merlin, has proved to be very useful to distinguish calls from dense cover — in quieter parts of the countryside.

Welcome to out new GP trainees

As many of you will know, we are a training practice which means we regularly host doctors who are undergoing their specialist GP training. Prior to starting the GP Specialist Training Programme a doctor will usually have worked in a number of different hospital departments gaining skills, knowledge and experience. The GP training programme takes 3 years and during the first two years of this a GP trainee will undertake placements in a number of different medical specialties including a six month placement in a GP surgery. The final year of the training programme takes place in a different practice where the trainee (or Registrar as they are known) will use the

On the Farm - Julian Gibbons

Writing this on the 18th August after a wet July and then a wet August I cannot with any confidence say that by the time you read this we will have cleaned the combine off and put it away for another year.

We managed to actually start harvest on the 10th July with our Maris Otter Winter Malting Barley. This was, for the first time, under budget in yield, but the price was set this time last year so will more than make up for the reduced yields. More importantly the quality is good; if it failed to make the grade the price would halve.

I picked up a polypin of Triple F Brewery's beer from Four Marks back June and they have switched entirely to using Maris Otter malt.

We then had a long wait until our oilseed rape was ready to harvest. This was better then budget. The spring malting barley we have cut appears to be of reasonably good quality, but we still have more to cut. All the wheat we have cut is feed quality only. The reduction in applied nitrogen doesn't appear to have effected yield, but although it has done wonders for our carbon footprint it does mean none has enough protein even for bag flour. Yields for the spring sown barley and winter wheat appear to be all over the place; I had always said that I thought harvest was a going to be a bit of a "curate's egg" and yields confirm it.

We are trying to be careful at what moistures we cut to avoid excessive drying costs. For long term storage rapeseed must be below 9%, malting barley contractually must be below 14.5% and wheat below 15% moisture. We have to make calculations based on the value of the crop, loss of any premiums due to the weather and field losses due to the crop going flat or in the case of rapeseed, falling out. Cutting rapeseed at 14% and incurring a £25 drying charge is easier as the crop is worth £360/t plus bonuses for oil content. That same charge for wheat is harder with wheat at £173/t.

Going forward we have cover crops to put in where we have spring planted crops planned for next year. The aim is to keep a growing crop over the autumn and winter period. These will then be killed off before planting the spring planted crop. This should reduce nutrient loss over winter and help build up organic matter.

On Saturday 7th October we are hosting the Basingstoke and District Agricultural Society Ploughing Match at Upper Farm. Everything happens in the morning and there are refreshments available. 

Summary The weather often felt rather autumnal as through the month, a succession of frontal systems made regular west-to-east progress across the UK. An inch and a half of rain fell on the 4th following showers the previous day. The first week was otherwise reasonably sunny, but with below average temperatures and breezy at times. It was significantly warmer by the end of the week with the warmest day at 82°F on the 7th. Cooler weather then returned, and temperatures mostly remained below the seasonal norm. There were sunny periods with showers, accompanied by a strong breeze on the 15th, and longer outbreaks of rain for the remainder of July. The monthly rainfall was almost 175% of the long-term average. The overall temperature was below average, which contrasted with a report from the World Meteorological Organisation that the global average temperature for July 2023 was the highest on record for any month.

Of the many birds that frequent our chalk streams, the brightly plumed kingfisher is perhaps the most celebrated. Ours are actually Eurasian kingfishers — one of over 100 such species worldwide, including Australia's laughing kookaburra. Our local kingfishers make a high-pitched call when in flight, so keep your eyes peeled if you hear several short whistles.

Unlike many of our feathered friends, kingfishers make their nests by burrowing into riverbanks. The tunnels are barely wider than the birds themselves

but can be 90 centimetres long. After teaming up in February, breeding pairs will raise up to three clutches of eggs through the spring and summer. Of the two, you can spot the female by the reddish patch on her beak.

Though stocky, kingfishers are surprisingly small, weighing a mere 40 grams on average. Despite this, they earn their name with their impressive fishing skills. While they mostly eat sticklebacks and minnows, they will snack on insects, freshwater shrimp, and tadpoles. You may see them perched on low-hanging branches, waiting for their next meal to swim by.

Once their prey has been spotted, they will assess its depth before taking the plunge. A third eyelid draws shut when they enter the water, so the catch itself is done almost blindly. But if their aim is true, they return to their perch and deliver the final blow. Since they must eat their body weight in food each day, they will soon be back in the water.

A key factor in this formidable fishing ability is the shape of the birds' beaks, the cross-section of which resembles a diamond with curved edges. When they dive, water flows along their beaks instead of being pushed away, allowing for a seamless entry. In fact, this shape is so effective that it inspired the design of the Japanese bullet train!

Sadly, our local kingfishers must contend with a number of pressures. Flooding can threaten their nests and prevent them from fishing. Disturbance can scare them away from their nests, stopping them from feeding their young. Chemical and nutrient pollution can affect insect, amphibian, and fish numbers, reducing their food supply.

One of the best ways to support these beautiful birds is by keeping their homes in a healthy condition. 



ASIAN HORNET

What is it?

Vespa velutina

An invasive non-native hornet originally from Asia. Asian hornet is a highly aggressive predator of native insects and poses a significant threat to honey bees and other pollinators. In 2004 it was accidentally introduced to France where it has spread rapidly and into neighbouring countries. Since 2016 a number of sightings have been recorded in the UK.

Suspected sightings should be reported immediately using the details provided at the bottom of this poster.



Where might I see it?

May be seen on flowering plants, around beehives, around rotting / fermenting fruit and protein, and at street markets attracted by sweet fruit and fish stalls.

Active from February to November across England and Wales.

What does it look like?

- ☐ Slightly smaller than native hornet
- Dark abdomen, 4th segment yellow / orange
- Bright yellow tips to legs (native hornet dark)
- Entirely brown or black thorax (native hornet more orange)

The Asian Hornet

At this time of year queen hornets are emerging and being mated ready to establish new nests next spring.

It is vitally important to keep this invasive, non-native insect out of the UK.

Local beekeepers have established 'sentinel' hives at all ports of entry to the UK, but it can be carried accidentally across the channel on vehicles, in camping gear and anything else that travels across the sea from France and Europe.

In France and in other parts of Europe it has had a marked impact on the biodiversity of the country.

The hornet predates on honey bees and can clear a hive in a day. It also predates on the insects that gather round fallen fruit, so it is important to clear fallen fruit as soon as possible.

Government and other agencies such as RSPB, and DEFRA have strategies to combat incursions, but they can only enact these strategies once Asian hornets have been reported to them. It is, therefore, very important that any and all sightings of the insect are reported as soon as possible.

If you see a suspect insect take a photo and use the app on your phone to identify it. **Asian Hornet Watch.**
