





# St John's Northington Launch of Organ Conservation and Restoration Project News update: December 2022

The PCC of St John's Church Northington is pleased to announce the formal launch of its Organ Conservation and Restoration Project. The PCC was delighted and grateful to have received a National Lottery Heritage Fund grant towards this exciting heritage project. Made possible by money raised by National Lottery players, and with additional support through a successful fundraising campaign including a grant from the Hampshire and the Island Historic Churches Trust and generous private donors, this will not only ensure the conservation of our heritage instrument, but it will also deliver an associated inspiring and creative education and community programme.

The project, which will run until the end of January 2024 (although the Organ itself will be back in use by early May 2023), was launched during November with a community event in Northington Village Hall, and a concert in St John's by local choir, Vox Lucis. The education and community programme will be facilitated by music animateur, Neil Valentine. This dynamic role will help to highlight the heritage of the church and its organ through, amongst other things, workshops for children, organ and choir concerts and participatory community music events working with a range of partners including Hampshire Music Service and the Grange Festival. At the heart of the education involvement is an innovative approach which will see students from Perins School, Alresford, working on a cross curricular English, History, Film, and Creative Arts programme, resulting in a new, young people-led, digital guide to the heritage of the church.

We will keep you in touch with progress and events via the Oxdrove, Hill and Dale, and via our new website which the Lottery grant will also enable us to create. Work on the organ itself will start from the New Year.

Constituents know of my passion for, and focus on, health matters so it is great to report I have recently become the new chairman of an influential Commons **Health and Social Care Select Committee**.

I gained the support of MPs across the House (Labour, SNP and Liberal Democrat colleagues signed my nomination) and took up my role in early November taking over from Jeremy Hunt who has, of course, become Chancellor. The committee has the power to question ministers and conduct inquiries into health issues – sitting on a cross-party basis which is its great strength.

The ability of the health and social care sectors to continue to deliver for patients is a key priority for my committee, particularly how to deal with the backlog caused by the pandemic and the need to recruit a workforce that's capable of meeting future demand. Further pressures look unavoidable given the current economic climate and the Chief Executive of the NHS has set that out starkly in recent weeks.

Despite spending vast sums on health, we fail to reap the rewards in better outcomes. We need to understand why and to press the government about getting better value for our money while delivering on the 'day job' around access to GP's and dentists in particular.

On mental health, we've a real challenge as demand far outstrips supply and I know the Government could do so much more on prevention to help tackle deeply concerning issues around health inequalities. Prevention and cancer will my focus in the role.

I welcome the opportunity as Chair to examine new solutions to support the NHS to enable it to continue providing the services that we all depend upon and I look forward to working with Ministers and MP's across the House on what is our clear national priority.

This is a national role but it will complement well my work on #priorityNHS in the constituency and the response from local health leaders has been hugely supportive already. You can read more at www.stevebrine.com/prioritynhs

Secondly, and sticking with health, I spoke last month in an important debate in Parliament on access to **fertility treatment** for couples who are struggling to conceive naturally calling for a "step-change" in IVF treatment offered on the NHS.

NICE guidance state that if you are unable to have children without medical help, women under 40 should be able to access three full cycles of NHS





### Summary

Number of days with rain

There was an unsettled start to October and this continued for most of the month. It was mainly dry with sunny periods during the second week with some overnight rain. The first air frost of the season occurred on the 11<sup>th</sup>. It was wet and windy on the evening of the 21st with a fresh to strong breeze. Two days later there was early morning rain with thunder and a late afternoon thunderstorm. Temperatures during the last 10 days or so were particularly mild with the warmest day at 70°F on the 29<sup>th</sup>. Overall, daytime temperatures were the warmest recorded here for mid-autumn at almost 4°F above the seasonal norm. Rainfall for the month was 10% above the average, though the year to date figure is less than 3/4 of the long term average.

# Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

In bright sunshine we set off for a ramble around the Woodland Trust's reserve at Home Farm, Burkham. We follow the way-marked white trail through broad grassy rides before crossing pastures of former farmland, now rapidly regenerating with hawthorn, silver birch and oak saplings. Stands of dogwood, deep claret with autumn leaves, bloom with clusters of white flowers. A kestrel flies over from Wigdell Copse, the ancient heart of these woods.

Beyond Burkham Lodge, we pick up the blue trail which takes us through the woods to the splendid craftwork picnic table set high on the grassy slopes overlooking Lasham Hill. To our delight a fascinating selection of toadstools has been laid out on the table, by an earlier fungal forager. Searching beneath the birch trees close-by, we find troops of huge fungi meandering across the woodland floor. Here are the scarlet caps of fly agaric, the classic fairytale toadstool, plus rings of woolly milkcaps, salmon pink, amongst others. All are of an impressive saucer size, possibly well nourished by the cowpats of sheltering cattle.

Chance encounters are one of the highlights of autumn walks. While visiting the Abbotstone Down reserve one morning, I pause to listen. Four British White cattle, conservation grazing, placidly chomp and chew. Pheasants croak from far afield; a distant muntjac deer begins to groan. From the out-lying yews comes the clamour and chatter of foraging birds. Heading along the perimeter path now recently cut and cleared, I find a flock of redwings busily gorging themselves on bright red arils, the fleshy fruits of the yew.

Large numbers of redwings and fieldfares, wintering thrushes, have been flying in from Scandinavia, having gobbled up all their rowanberry crops. Nervous flocks now roam the downland woods and hedges searching for berries.

The Royal Netherlands Air Force have a radar unit that tracks the seasonal 'vogeltrek' of flocks of birds, both large and small, crossing the Dutch coastline to winter here. Continental goldcrests, the tiniest of our birds, are quite intrepid flyers, migrating here from as far away as Finland.

I wish you the best of times this Christmas period. The year seems to pass so quickly: when you read my next County Corner the days will be getting longer again!

The ONS has now published more granular and fascinating data from the 2021 census. Go to the Office for National Statistics website ons.gov.uk to see the latest publications dated from 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022. This is a powerful set of data looking at age, living arrangements, household size, health and education/deprivation etc. It is fascinating to compare your area with another. Local authorities at all levels are making plans for the future. Budgets being set out and Draft Plans are being consulted upon, and we'd like to know what you think of the new policies as well as the proposed sites.

The South Downs National Park has called for new sites for its refreshed Local Plan. Some parishes, like Micheldever are renewing their Parish Design statements, and Alresford is creating a Neighbourhood Plan.

Winchester is currently consulting on our Draft local plan, called **Your Place**, **Your Plan** until the 14<sup>th</sup> December and the County Council has its **Draft Minerals & Waste plan** out for consultation until the 31<sup>st</sup> January. Both of these are weighty and expensive books to produce! So, they are being published online for everyone on the www.hants.gov.uk and www.winchester.gov.uk websites- (search draft reg 18 plan for each) and paper copies are available in the libraries. There are details of their contents on my website. Both draft plans include important policies on which the success or failure of future planning permissions will depend as well as proposed sites. Please do have your say. Both can be tackled in 'bite size chunks.'

Last month I spoke about **the future financing of HCC.** The situation was recently described by the Director of Corporate Operations as 'dire'. As a result of the pressure on finances, **there is a rearrangement in the number of Directorships at HCC:** with one for Adults, one for Children which are statutory services providing personal services such as education and social

### On the Farm - Julian Gibbons

The dry weather was never going to last, that we all knew. Fortunately most of the autumn planting was over by the time the heavens opened and started making a valiant attempt to get the rainfall figures for the year closer to average. Wet spots, where the drainage isn't as good as we had hoped, have appeared in some fields.

We had our Red Tractor inspection in October. Our inspector was new to us, so the inspection took a bit longer than normal. However we passed without any minor failures (last year we failed for not having a no smoking sign by our pesticide store). The mild autumn has been good for our late-drilled rape that has grown big enough to get to hopefully avoid the ravages of pigeons and the winter.

We started moving feed wheat in the middle of November. The first day wasn't too bad, but the second day it was lashing with rain. In days gone by loading would have been out of the question. However most lorries now have electric controlled sheets that can open and close between buckets. Upper Farm, Bradley is a very windy spot and in days gone by with old-fashioned tarpaulin sheets it could take 4 of us to get the lorry sheeted after loading. The modern rollover sheet was brought in for health and safety reasons as it meant the load could be sheeted from the ground. The addition of an electrically operated hydraulic motor means that the driver can sheet and un-sheet using a remote control. Many farms now have rollover sheets on their dedicated grain trailers although with manual mechanism. We use ours to take loads to the Trinity grain store at Micheldever Station.

The newspapers have been full of news of shortages of eggs in the supermarkets. This has been the result of a perfect storm. The free-range market has been oversupplied for some time resulting in prices to producers being below the cost of production. The cost of production has shot up due to the rise in feed prices. This has resulted in many producers stopping production or cutting back to stem losses. Avian influenza has resulted in many producers having to destock, resulting in even lower production. The supermarkets move away from caged eggs, when producers had only just invested vast amounts into new large enhanced cages, has also dented industry confidence to invest. The result is we will be importing eggs to make up the shortfall, in many cases produced to lower standards then those we had already moved from.

Avian influenza is devastating to farmers whose flocks contract it. It is not just the loss of the flock. I heard of one egg producer who had 1 million eggs on the farm that had to try and find a home in the liquid pasteurised market. They then have to carry out a deep clean that is so thorough that in many cases it can be cheaper to build a new shed. The alternative is to leave the farm de-stocked for 12 months, this is the most likely option for small backyard flocks. There is insurance available to cover cleaning costs, but premiums have gone through the roof and policy holders were being told by the one company providing cover, that if they wanted cover at renewal they had to renew early with a reduced level of cover

It would appear that we are going to have to live with avian influenza for some time and manage the consequences both to the poultry flocks and the wild bird population.

The children have been developing their fine motor skills to mould clay to create divas to celebrate Diwali and make their own little animals looking for somewhere to hibernate this Autumn! The little ones have also had a great interest in ponies and unicorns over the last few weeks, so we have been researching information and using our imaginations during role play.

For the next few weeks, we will be focusing on encouraging the little ones to make marks with meaning. We use many experiences at pre-school not just paper and pencils including chalk, paint, sand, playdough, flour, clay, gloop, sticks and mud, transient art and sensory trays. This is a very important step to develop before moving on to pre-writing skills. Access to practise these skills by having resources available daily along with adults modelling mark making is very helpful.

The children have been exploring the stories 'Superworm' and 'Room on the Broom' during the forest sessions by making clay models, wands from sticks they found and decorated with ribbon and wool, role playing the stories together and making a special potion with natural resources they found in the woods. What fun at 'The Hornbeam Hideout' Forest School too, exploring, drinking hot chocolate,

eating marshmallows and getting to know some animals.

# **Local Police report**

There has been a significant spike of rural Burglaries and Thefts in the Basingstoke & Dean Borough within the last month. Police have noticed more often, that the criminals revisit locations very soon after an initial failed attempt of Theft / Burglary.

On re-attending addresses they appear to return better equipped with more advanced and heavy duty tools of their trade.

Two Honda CRVs have been identified as being involved in recent offences and have been described as one in green and another in silver. Police are following up on lines of enquiry.

Police advice, is to remain suspicious of cold callers attending your address and enquiring of cars that maybe for sale, especially those with 4 wheel drive functionality.

Any information about cold callers and any registrations of cars they arrive in are always of interest to the Police. You are requested to pass the information to the police by an online report or to your local Beat Officer.

Properties that have waste skips, usually because of renovation works, are also at an increased risk of being targeted. Whilst this usually involves theft from the skips themselves, namely metal objects from within. It also highlights other tools that may be used for any project work ongoing. All plant machinery and petrol powered tools like chainsaws & leaf blowers remain high on the criminal's gift list. Alas the list is not exhaustive.

### **Redd Alert: Spotting Spawning Salmonids**



Stroll along a chalk stream in winter, and you might see a wildlife wonder in progress. At this time of year, the cool, clear, oxygen-rich water is alive with amorous brown trout and salmon. As the females get busy building their nests, the males compete for the chance to be their spawning partners.

To create a nest, or 'redd', a female turns on her side and flexes her body. This directs the flow towards the stream bed, forming a hollow and sweeping away the finer sediment.

She lays her eggs in this hollow, the victorious male fertilises them, and she covers them over with a layer of gravel.

This process can take several days, but the result is a dip followed by a slight mound just downstream. A freshly made redd is easier to spot, since the disturbed patch is a lighter colour than the area around it. As sediment and algae accumulate, the redd gradually becomes less visible.

Of course, not every breeding attempt will be successful. Moreover, a female may start forming a redd to test a spot's suitability, only to abandon the site upon finding a better option. Beyond this natural uncertainty, however, there are other factors that make the odds less favourable.

Barriers like weirs and dams can be impassable for some fish, which isolates them and limits their space for spawning – you might see redds crowded together in the vicinity of these obstacles. In dry weather years, low water levels can leave redds exposed, putting the eggs at risk of dehydration.

Excess sediment can fill the gaps between larger pieces of gravel, thereby preventing water from flowing through them. This deprives a redd's eggs of oxygen, which is crucial to their development. Dredging can remove gravel from a stream bed entirely, leaving only fine sediment behind.

To ensure healthy wild fish populations, we must keep our chalk streams in good condition. The Watercress and Winterbournes scheme is improving spawning habitats on the Test and Itchen headwaters; explore our projects at www.hiwwt.org.uk. Our work is made possible by the National Lottery Heritage Fund.
