

St John's Northington Launch of Organ Conservation and Restoration Project News update: December 2022

The PCC of St John's Church Northington is pleased to announce the formal launch of its Organ Conservation and Restoration Project. The PCC was delighted and grateful to have received a National Lottery Heritage Fund grant towards this

exciting heritage project. Made possible by money raised by National Lottery players, and with additional support through a successful fundraising campaign including a grant from the Hampshire and the Island Historic Churches Trust and generous private donors, this will not only ensure the conservation of our heritage instrument, but it will also deliver an associated inspiring and creative education and community programme.

The project, which will run until the end of January 2024 (although the Organ itself will be back in use by early May 2023), was launched during November with a community event in Northington Village Hall, and a concert in St John's by local choir, Vox Lucis. The education and community programme will be facilitated by music animateur, Neil Valentine. This dynamic role will help to highlight the heritage of the church and its organ through, amongst other things, workshops for children, organ and choir concerts and participatory community music events working with a range of partners including Hampshire Music Service and the Grange Festival. At the heart of the education involvement is an innovative approach which will see students from Perins School, Alresford, working on a cross curricular English, History, Film, and Creative Arts programme, resulting in a new, young peopleled, digital guide to the heritage of the church.

We will keep you in touch with progress and events via the Oxdrove, Hill and Dale, and via our new website which the Lottery grant will also enable us to create.

Work on the organ itself will start from the New Year.

The new urgent care maternity app is now live across Hampshire and the Isle of Wight. The new service which provides consistent advice for pregnant people 24 hours a day 7 days a week, was launched on Monday 28 November 2022.

Pregnant people are being encouraged to download the Healthier Together app, which already provides help and advice for parents regarding their children and they can log any maternity concerns they may encounter during their pregnancy.

The app will ask the user to assess their symptoms and it will then decide if they fall into a red, amber or green category. The outcomes of those categories are:

Red: These issues will be classed as an emergency and will require the user to call 999.

Amber: The user will be advised to call the maternity triage line if the concern is maternity related or will be advised to contact their GP surgery or 111 if out of hours.

For both the red and amber categories the user can press a button on the app and they will automatically be connected to the service that has been recommended.

Green: The user will be directed to information to self-care at home.

If the user is directed to call the maternity triage line, they will be connected to a midwife either at South Central Ambulance Services (SCAS) in Otterbourne or at the Isle of Wight ambulance station. They will be triaged by the midwives and, if required, advised to attend their local Maternity Day Assessment Unit (MDAU) for further assessment.

Travel vaccinations

Due to a high demand for vaccinations & minimal availability we are asking for a minimum of 12 weeks' notice for travel vaccinations, this includes all NHS funded travel vaccinations.

If you provide us with 12 weeks or less notice you will be asked to a private travel clinic for your vaccinations.

We would like to remind you that the phlebotomy department <u>does not</u> provide a walk-in service.

If a patient requires an urgent blood test, they ask that the patient calls their telephone booking line to arrange an appointment.

Healthier Together:

It can be extremely stressful when your child is unwell. We know that there is a huge amount of information available at your fingertips but finding something that provides clear and accurate information is not always easy! The resources on the Healthier Together website have been developed in partnership between parents and healthcare professionals from across Dorset, Hampshire, and the Isle of Wight. You'll find clear information on common childhood illnesses, including advice on what 'red-flag' signs to look out for, where to seek help if required, what you should do to keep your child comfortable and how long your child's symptoms are likely to last.

Happy New Year! There is no question, 2023 will have its' moments but we've much to be grateful for and I know those of us living in the beautiful Itchen Valley know that more than most.

Parliament always has its' moments of course but constituents will forgive me for hoping the next 12-months is a little more boring than the last. As ever, I will be getting on with my job and whether it be around education, my ongoing Green Winchester work or my role as Chair of the Health & Social Care Select Committee, there's no rest.

I will be doing some work in the early part of this year on electric vehicles which seems pertinent given the Government's ambition to end the sale of all petrol and diesel cars by the end of the decade. It's an ambition I support but, right now, I am struggling to see how we get to 2030.

Matters arising centre around charging points, connection to the grid via home charging solar panels and, above all, the availability and cost of EV's. I'm sure we're not the only ones who want to make the switch but find the cost prohibitive and the (sometimes) 18-month wait, often because of production delays in China, beyond frustrating.

Turning to education, I was very pleased to see a positive response from the Chancellor in his Autumn Statement on school funding which received an uplift. But there are cost of living issues, national pay awards and the huge challenge of rising (low-level) mental health issues, which are putting school budgets under significant pressure. The cost of school meals, as the cost of ingredients soar, is a little reported story but it's one we cannot overlook as the synergy between eating (and learning) well is obvious.

As Ministers return to aspects within the Schools White Paper – first published two Prime Minister's ago – issues including academisation and special educational needs reform will come to the fore and I want to make sure the voice of Winchester is heard as always. We have direct access to those in power and we are going to use it.

Finally, those of us with young children (or grandchildren) must stay on our guard as internet use amongst children continues to rise while unregulated social media has presented risks for too long. We must (and we are) therefore take action to make the internet safer for young people.

Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

In the half-light of a cold grey winter's day, two jays flush from the long grass at the lake's edge. There's just a glimpse of pink plumage, a flash of white rumps and a goblin screech or two, before they dive headfirst into the mistletoe that festoons the lakeside lime trees here.

We are taking a brisk stroll around the parkland at Avington, a central countryside site overlooking Avington Lake. A cormorant stands, bolt upright, slim and black, on the far bank. Behind him a vast flock of coots, jet black, bobble the lawns of Avington House, their bright white foreheads dipping up and down. A raft of black-headed gulls drift across the lake, while mallard and yet more coots dabble through the shallows.

Heading upwards we cross the cattle grid to leave the park, following the wooded lane over Beech Hill. To our right the woodland edge has been well churned up by a pair of charming pigs: Wessex Saddlebacks, according to a farming journalist who we met on a previous visit. We find them down by the Easton Lodge end of their enclosure; one is brown and white, her companion black and white. Hardy and quite docile, these large sturdy pigs are busily engaged in conservation truffling, snouts down in the rich soil, ears flapping over their eyes.

Emerging from the trees, we turn right to follow the footpath across the wetland pastures of the valley bottom. All is quiet apart from the trickling rivulets of the Itchen. Flickering shadows of blue tits and robins forage through the wayside hedges.

The wooded backdrop of the valley hillside reveals a wintry skyline of trees, their bare canopies bulging with globes of mistletoe. The scent of distant woodsmoke drifts across on the cool air. Reaching the bridge at Chilland Ford, we scan for wildlife along the banks of the surging river and spot some strange mallard dabbling at the edge by Chilland Mill. Emerald green with an iridescent sheen, these are known as Cayuga, a North American breed of duck.



Summary The unsettled weather from the previous month continued into November with a blustery shower and thunderstorm on the 1st. There was continuous rain the following afternoon with a strengthening breeze, and persistent overnight rain resulted in almost 1½ inches. High pressure in the latter half of the second week brought dry and slightly brighter weather and the warmest November day at 65°F was recorded on the 12th. The unsettled conditions then resumed and lasted through to the end of the month. Overall, temperatures were almost 3°F above the norm and the autumn was also mild. It was the third wettest November over the past two decades with 176% of the normal rainfall and the wettest autumn since 2006.


She explained that the term canape comes from the French meaning couch and recommended serving 3 or 4 per person as a starter or 8 to 10 for a drinks party.





Happy New Year to all our customers!

We hope to welcome you to the store very soon. Don't forget January is "Marmalade-making Month" and the Seville oranges will be arriving any day!

We begin 2023 with another in our occasional series which focuses on a member of our wonderful band of volunteers ... and this time it's the turn of one of our youngest, Evie James.

Evie, who was 15 when she began volunteering at the store as part of the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award scheme, lives in the valley and goes to school in Alton. Evie says: "Once I had gained my D of E award, I realised that I enjoyed being at the store so much that I wanted to continue volunteering." Since then, Evie has become a paid youth worker, taking shifts at the weekend and during school holidays which can often be the more difficult slots for the store rota manager to fill. She adds, "Earning my own money is helping me to learn how to budget and is definitely developing my work ethic."

Meeting new people and interacting with them in a safe and supportive environment has strengthened Evie's social skills and she says that she now also feels more connected with the wider, valley community. She particularly enjoys using the till, serving customers with cake and coffee and helping them to find things around the store. From a business point of view, her work has given Evie the opportunity to see how a shop functions and how much hard work goes on behind the scenes to make it successful. The fact that ours is a community store and therefore run on a different model from a normal shop, gives youth workers like Evie additional insight into its particular benefits. And challenges! As she points out, the store provides a welcoming and useful "hub" for everyone in our rural community and a valuable opportunity for young people to have a taste of the world of work, in an area where part-time jobs are scarce. "To be a part of this team continues to be a particularly rewarding experience. I am learning real-world skills that are likely to help me in the future. I think young people having a job here is a really good idea and the opportunity to learn about business is very important."

On the Farm - Ben Robinson

Generally, I like frosty weather in winter. It dries out the land, allows field work without poaching and usually brings a bit of sunshine which is good for the soul. However, we are now on the seventh day on the bounce without the temperature rising above freezing and defrosting water is getting a little tedious. The water to the main sheds has been kept running by heaping up cow muck around any exposed pipes. The manure creates its own warmth, allowing the water to keep flowing. However, the pipe to the calf housing goes on an exposed and lengthy aerial route from the main cattle shed and freezes up fairly easily. Bucketed water has been the order of the day for the calves. Hopefully one day I will be able to justify digging up the concrete and relaying the water pipe underground. At least lows of -9°c at night have meant we have been able to get on with hedge cutting even on the heaviest clay fields and around the newly sown grass ley fields. It seems ironic that only in late November we clipped the backs of the store cattle to prevent them sweating in the sheds!

This Autumn arable farmers locally have taken to cover crops in a big way. Though most are principally soil conditioning mixes including plants such as buckwheat, vetch, phacelia and spring beans many neighbouring arable growers are keen to have sheep to graze their cover crops off. It is a learning curve as to what the plants are capable of and whether ewes or lambs do best on them. Communication is the key. I am learning that different arable managers have quite different views and expectations of what they want from sheep grazing.

I also have sheep grazing a local dairy farm. Grazing sheep on dairy ground in the winter encourages the grass to tiller (grow more side shoots) which leads to a more resilient crop of grass and higher yields of silage in the Spring and Summer. As it has been a slightly quieter time of year on our largely beef and sheep farm myself and my colleague have been undertaking some relief work on dairy farms. Dairy farming never stops and the need for people with good levels of experience with cattle in the sector is constant.

May I take this opportunity to wish all Oxdrove readers a very Happy and Prosperous New Year.

The Wonders of Chalk Streams in Wintertime

The weather may be grey at this time of year, but our precious chalk streams are still great places for a stroll. Visit in the early morning, and you might be treated to the sight of mist rising gently from the water's surface. This happens because the streams, which are fed by an underground aquifer, can actually be warmer than the air on cold days – as the two meet, a truly atmospheric effect occurs!



Up on the stream banks, the ground may have gained a smattering of snowdrops. Native to mainland Europe, these delicate blooms were introduced in the 16th century and now thrive along our waterways. But it's not just flowers that benefit wildlife – the hollow stems of dead plants can be an ideal hibernation spot for insects. So if you're tempted to have a tidy up, do wait until the springtime.

Unlike the raucous chorus of the breeding seasons, birds are often quieter in the winter. As the hunt for food takes centre stage, many species become less territorial and gather in larger numbers. Listen for not only chalk stream icons like kingfishers and Cetti's warblers, but also jays, wrens, goldcrests, little egrets, and woodpeckers. Use free apps like Merlin or BirdNET to identify

their calls.

Though leaves and flowers are in short supply, look for clues to the identity of streamside trees. The size of buds, the texture of bark, and the presence of sap can all aid your quest. For example: alders and weeping willows both love damp ground (alder wood is actually more durable when wet) so are often found next to water. But the willow's catkins are golden, while the alders are tinged purple.

Winter is also a great time to see where animals are travelling, as mud, frost, and snow make their footprints more visible. Deer, foxes, badgers, water voles, or even otters could have passed by; with some detective work, you'll soon know. You can also look for things like nibbled tree bark, empty nut shells, and piles of droppings – there are lots of online guides with pictures of these 'signs'.
