



Is it possible to succeed and still have failed?

The Archbishop's Lent book this year is 'Failure' by Bishop Emma Ineson, a thoughtful and happily light-hearted book in the right places! Failure, she says, is part of human experience which should be embraced, reflected on and become a rich lesson in our learning.

Some failures are alright, for instance Thomas Edison inventor of the lightbulb said (purportedly) "I have not failed 10 000 times, I have successfully found 10 000 ways that will not work". Those failures were experimental, we really don't know what will happen so we try something out, though this approach might not be so sensible in a hospital or nuclear power station.

Human failure might be a lapse or slip, some inadvertent and innocent. Others are mistakes of poor judgement in deciding to ignore the sound advice of people who knew what they were talking about or seeking to achieve a goal at any cost! Often with dire consequences.

Desmond Tuto said, "The pressure to succeed has a lot to do with why people overstep the line. It is a peculiar weakness of Western culture where we have made a fetish of success. We give kudos to people who have succeeded if they succeeded. The worst thing that can happen in this cultural environment is to fail".

Success at any cost, is that right, do the means justify the end? St Paul reminds us that deeds done without love are worthless. I may have excellent qualities and competencies, great ability, and power, yet without love I will have failed. When love is just a value on the headed notepaper, it counts for nothing where there is aggression, deceit, domination, and untruths, all in the pursuit of outward excellence.

The sadness is that in denying our own failings we fail to face reality; we can pretend to others for a while, but we know what the case in our own lives is really! The bible is so encouraging when it tells us that yes, in denying our failings we deceive ourselves, but its whole story line faces the failure of human beings and shows God's work to bring us his forgiveness, his grace for change and commitment to stay with us. But it must begin with honesty, the admission things are not 100% ok, we've messed up.

As Easter approaches, we reflect on the life and death of Jesus, someone who was so successful in his life and yet was crucified, was that success or failure?

Jesus could have carried on doing his teaching and miracle work but in dying on the cross he achieved his greatest most successful

#### **Riparian Responsibilities**

This is the time of year when we need to think about the state of Hampshire's land drainage network. As the season for rainier days approaches and leaves begin to fall, all riparian owners (those who have watercourses on or bordering their land) across Hampshire, should be checking the state of drainage ditches, pipes, culverts that carry watercourses to ensure there is unobstructed conveyance of surface (rain) water to reduce the risk of localised flooding.

Please find below the link to a leaflet/poster detailing what responsibilities riparian owners have and guidance on how to undertake this maintenance to reduce flooding from surface water. Please also review our updated web pages on flood prevention where there is a video about riparian responsibility and clearer advice on riparian responsibilities and ditch maintenance:

To reduce the risk of future flooding we would also appreciate being informed of any planned, ongoing or recent works to install a culvert, pipe or infill/realign a ditch (i.e. an ordinary watercourse) so that we can check that a land drainage consent is in place for those works. #### Memorial Woodland Landscape.

For Preston Candover and the wider community.

At 11.00am on Saturday 14

February, the family of the Late Lord Sainsbury of Preston Candover and residents of Preston Candover gathered at Common Bottom Clump to plant an oak tree in celebration of Lord Sainsbury's life. Lord Sainsbury died at his home on 14 January at the age of 95.

Invitations had been sent to all Preston Candover residents and many met to celebrate Lord Sainsbury's life and hear about the plans his family have for the land surrounding the tree.

Lord Sainsbury was passionate about woodland, the British countryside and Preston Candover where he lived for over 40 years. It seemed fitting, therefore, to create a place of natural beauty for the wider community to enjoy and appreciate. Fifty acres of land, just above the village shop and beside the vineyard, has been set aside to create a new woodland landscape.

A wonderful tree had been selected and Sarah, Lady Sainsbury's daughter, gave a much appreciated speech. Lady Sainsbury said that it made her very happy so see so many children, and hoped that they and their children would see the tree grow.

Rev David Chattell spoke movingly, addressing everyone, irrespective of faith, and blessed the tree and the use and enjoyment of the land. Many Preston Candover villagers were there, and there was a deep appreciation of all the generous gifts Lord Sainsbury has given to the village. It was a very special day, and before the planting, the

village hall was packed, with refreshments including sausages being served.

It was a very moving event and something for the village to remember for a long time to come.

Plans for the future include the planting of a wild meadow which will surround the oak tree and onwards towards the woods. Further tree planting will take place in 2023 and 2024. There are also plans to formally designate a new public right of way which, when established, will link with two other footpaths to create a circular walk for the village. It will be a perfect place for people to walk and remember all that Lord Sainsbury has done for Preston Candover.

#### 2 - Hand hygiene

#### 4 – Get vaccinated

Flu vaccination is still available for all eligible age groups and is the best protection against the virus.

We have seen good uptake in older age groups but vaccination among young children remains low. Flu can be very unpleasant and, in some cases, can lead to more serious illness.

Getting your child vaccinated protects them and others they come into contact with. Children are offered the quick and painless nasal spray vaccine. Children eligible include:

- Children aged 2 and 3 on 31 August in 2022
- All primary school-aged children
- Some secondary school-aged children
- Children aged 2 to 17 years with long-term health conditions.

You can find more information on getting your child vaccinated against flu, here.

For adults, both flu and COVID-19 vaccinations remain available. You can read about who is eligible on the NHS UK website.

5 – Use NHS resources for more information about winter illnesses Most winter illnesses can be managed at home and NHS UK has lots of information available to parents:

- Information about flu symptoms and treating them at home
- Information about COVID-19 in children
- Information about scarlet fever symptoms and managing the illness
- Information about fevers in children and how to manage them

#### Patient newsletter (cont.)

- We will aim to make our newsletters free from jargon and as timely and informative as we can. We will also look at how we use other methods of getting information out to our patients.
- Our receptionists have been trained to ask some basic questions about your condition in order to direct you to the most appropriate appointment and with the most appropriate clinician. This may be with your usual GP to discuss

an ongoing problem, or it may be another service at the surgery such as a musculoskeletal assessment with a physiotherapist or a service such as the Minor Eye Conditions Service at one of the local participating opticians. We are very grateful to all who participated in our survey.

#### Back to school - 5 things to do to help manage winter illness

As students start to return to school, it's important to be aware of the winter illnesses currently circulating and the best ways to protect your child and others. In this blog, we set out some of the simple actions that parents of school age children can take to help protect their families and those around them.

What's the current situation?

We are seeing high levels of flu and COVID-19, which is likely to continue in coming weeks. We are also still seeing high numbers of scarlet fever, which is caused by the bacteria Group A streptococcus. You can read more information about strep A here. There are things we can all do to help stop the spread of infections; teaching young people to do these things will help them to stay well and protect others.

1 - Staving home when unwell

Knowing when your child should stay at home from school or nursery if they are poorly can help slow the spread of many winter illnesses.

- If your child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better, and the fever has resolved.
- If your child has diarrhoea and/or vomits, they should stay off school or nursery for at least 48 hours after their symptoms clear up. Adults should try to stay home when unwell too.

#### Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

As I step outside one fine Sunday morning, four long-tailed tits dart onto the suet-ball feeder hanging from the apple tree just in front of me. With tails a-quiver these fluffy bobbles of pink, white and black, tap away at the tallow with their tiny beaks. Following a long cold night they feed frantically, seemingly oblivious to me.

Glancing towards the bottom of the garden, I'm distracted by a large flock of finches flying up from the back field to perch in the canopy of a silver birch. Well-spaced out, each bird seems to bask in the glow of the rising sun, lighting up goldfinches, linnets, chaffinches and their Nordic cousins, some bramblings.

As the sunlight filters through the winter beeches framing the easterly skyline of Northington Down, so the full moon with a pinkish tinge slowly sinks behind the backdrop of Micheldever Woods stretching far to the west.

In early February, the full moon around Candlemas links with the mass blooming of snowdrops along the Candover Valley. Within the space of a few days, drifts of snowdrops, bright white, suddenly appear in favoured spots. Some line the grassy banks above the flowing brook; others spread beneath wayside hedges and copses. Possibly not a native wildflower, I suspect most were planted and left to naturalise, extending year on year. Many though are found by chance, to delight winter walks, planted in discrete clumps and patches.

Heading off to follow the trail running from Itchen Wood to Itchen Stoke Down (part of the Watercress Way), I pass through a landscape still deep in winter slumber. The wayside hedges, twiggy thickets, are neatly topped and trimmed. The frosted verges erupt here and there with earthen heaps of mole hills. Badgers have clearly been rummaging around, snouting for grubs and earthworms, leaving snuffle holes. The first green flutes of arum leaves unfurl on the bare ground beneath the hedges. Here along the sunny side of a verge I find clumps of snowdrops, the white bells a sign that winter is drawing to a close.

#### Patient Survey 2022 Results

We carried out a short survey in November 2022 and we are pleased to present the results. Firstly, there were five questions and the findings from those are as follows:

- 68% of respondents reported that they were satisfied or very satisfied with being able to book an appointment of their choice.
- 89.4% of respondents felt we communicate well or extremely well.
- 68% of respondents found being redirected to other services such as minor eye conditions service or musculoskeletal assessment helpful or very helpful.
- · 79% of respondents felt we responded well or extremely well to the Covid pandemic.
- Overall, 74.5% of respondents are satisfied or somewhat satisfied with the service they receive from Alresford Surgery.

As well as the five questions the survey included the facility to add comments. Summarising the comments, you said:

I'd like a face-to-face appointment with the doctor of my choice, at a convenient time and easily bookable either online or on the telephone without a long wait.

We have looked carefully at the comments and, considering the results of the questions too we have undertaken the following actions:

- More clinicians two additional GPs starting work at Alresford Surgery in early 2023.
- Working with the other local practices we are now offering evening and weekend appointments.
- Our telephone system, and in particular the queueing system, came in for much criticism. We are working closely with our telecoms supplier to try and make improvements.
- We are making many more GP appointments available to book online.
- Patients can choose whether they would prefer a face-to-face or telephone appointment, at the point of booking.



**Summary** The unsettled and mild conditions from the previous month continued into January. It was wet and windy at times, with heavy showers including hail on the 8<sup>th</sup>. There was measurable rain on each of the first fifteen days by which time the average total for the month had been exceeded. High pressure was the dominant feature in the second half of the month and there was sunny weather with clear skies at the end of the third week. Temperatures were significantly colder with hard overnight frosts, and the daytime temperature did not rise above freezing on the 17<sup>th</sup>. There was morning fog on the 25<sup>th</sup> which failed to lift completely and returned by late afternoon. Temperatures gradually edged towards near normal in the final week but overall, this mid-winter month was colder than average whilst rainfall was a third above the norm.



#### **Swarraton and Northington WI**

There was a very good turn out for our February meeting when Lt..Col. Jeremy Prescott gave an excellent illustrated talk entitled '90 Minutes at Entebbe.' Jeremy took us back to 1976 and Operation Thunderbolt. Many of us remembered the raid but little of the detail and were fascinated by the careful, bold planning carried out by the Israeli military elite force, The Tip of the Spear, as they rescued the hostages from the Air France plane trapped by the terrorists in Entebbe airport.

We were reminded of the roles played by Simon Perez, Yitzhak Rabin, the duplicitous Idi Amin and Sadat Arafat. In the assault on the building, 7 terrorists were killed, 4 Ugandan soldiers and 3 Israeli hostages. The commanding Israeli officer Yonatan Netanyahu was killed by a bullet from the control tower. His brother Benjamin later became Prime Minister of Israel.

Dora Bloch, one of the hostages taken to hospital in Uganda and Bruce McKenzie, a British civil servant working in Kenya were later murdered, ordered by Idi Amin, in revenge for the attack.

Jeremy, a retired army officer of 26 years, speaks to raise funds for Combat Stress and has given 448 presentations to over 16,000 people in his mission to honour the Sacrifice and Remembrance of military personnel who have fought for their country. He talked of his work to make sure memorials are maintained and assist relatives in finding the memorials of loved ones.

Jeremy has raised £26,000 for Combat Stress to support those suffering for mental health issues as a result of active service.

During the meeting members were invited to sign up for the planned visit to Stratfield Saye on May 17<sup>th</sup>.



#### On the Farm - Ben Robinson

I write this article on the evening before the annual National Farmers' Union Conference in Birmingham. It's a pretty lively event, with 1500 farmers from across England and Wales heading to for two days to listen to our representatives, politicians and other speakers of note. It's a younger crowd than people outside the industry might expect, which surprises the nearby Walkabout Aussie bar when several hundred farmers file in to line up Jaegarbombs on a normally quiet February Tuesday night. You can tell an election is nearing as this year the Conference is being swamped by politicians, with addresses expected by PM Rishi Sunak, Kier Starmer, Therese Coffey the DEFRA secretary and Mark Spencer the farming minister. Even if MPs have no particular interest in farming as such many are aware that government policy on; food security and affordability, biodiversity, the environment and Net Zero cannot be achieved without harnessing the 75% of the country that is farmland and the farmers that manage that land.

One of the standout speakers from last year was the President of the World Farmers Union, South African Theo de Jager. His fascinating speech definitely put into context the often parochial issues we face here compared with the challenges farmers from rural Africa have to combat. To my knowledge a herd of elephants has never destroyed a whole village in the Candovers, locusts have never eaten all the crops in Hampshire and it's been at least a couple of hundred years since Wield fought Medstead in a pitched battlethough 'Battle Corner' named after an earlier skirmish is just down the road from the farm.

The sheep continue to move around many cover crops in the area. A new trial this winter is my lambs grazing some early drilled wheat. The theory is that light grazing encourages the wheat to grow back strongly as the temperatures warm up. The crop doesn't go into the Spring so lush which means there is less of a disease burden and a fungicide spray or two can usually be dropped. This kind of management was common up until the Second World War when modern chemistry rendered a mixed farming approach to wheat growing less necessary.

The eagle eyed among you may have spied a new shed that has gone up in the yard. This will increase the number of sheep we can lamb indoors, as well as housing straw for the winter. Outside straw stacks make a bit of a mess and it would be good to get away from them. Investing is always a bit of a gamble, but I generally prefer investing in buildings and livestock than machinery. A shed doesn't depreciate as much as a new tractor, and it doesn't take me as long to find out how it all works!

#### Lent came quickly after Dry January this year!

HCC's Public Health Director, Simon Bryant recently briefed County Councillors on the County's renewed Drug and Alcohol strategy .Over 1/4 million people in Hampshire are drinking more than 14 units a week. HCC's Revenue Budget was finalised in February so that you receive your Council Tax demand in time for the new financial year 23/24. HCC is budgeting turnover of around £2.6 billion. There is an expected £58m budget to fund, even after using some reserves to plug the spending gap. HCC proposed 4.99% increase (ie: £1460.25 for Band D, an increase of £1.34 a week or £69.68 a year). Capital Funding over the next three years is expected to be £645.3m- much of this is generated by funds from developers for schools etc.


