#### **Dear Friends**

We live in hope! Looking out on the parched grass and wilting plants I'm longing for a decent rainfall to irrigate the dry garden and allotment. Of course by the time this article goes out we might have enjoyed some torrential rain which is why we live in hope because it will rain again! Experience tells us that the clouds will one day bring the rain we need and water levels in reservoirs will rise again.

But sitting out this dry hot weather is not easy and we long for cool nights to sleep better, and the rainfall to satisfy the thirsty land.

In Psalm 63 King David wrote, while living in the desert, of how our longing for water is akin to another thirst, that of God. "O God...my soul thirsts for you...in a dry and thirsty land where there is no water." We turn on a tap for our water and many around the world go to a well or bore hole but how might we 'source God' to satisfy our longings for him? King David explained that he finds God satisfying his soul like the tastiest of foods, celebrating, actually revelling, in his loving kindness, goodness, mercy, his help, his character and in the praise and worship of the perfect God he finds his thirst is satisfied.

Jesus told the crowds of his hearers that he is the 'water of life' whoever drinks of him shall be satisfied. This is an amazing claim that the God who satisfied the early worshippers of King David's time is known through Jesus Christ who satisfies the thirsty who come to him with an invitation to anyone who thirsts to come to him. (John ch7 verse37)

This water is only a prayer of faith and trust away. When the longing heart seeks God he promises to give the water of life and his peace and forgiveness. The 'tap handle' turns with our honest acknowledgment of our need for God, to praise and worship, to listen to, to receive of his presence and goodness and forgiveness of our sins.

Other 'waters' are available but won't do the above, pleasure, education, wealth and status will not meet our needs of God who specialises in water for the soul with all its needs.

You are always welcome to join us in our churches as we worship the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who promises water to all who ask. We worship because we have found 'water' and even when thirsty we live in hope of God who is faithful.

#### To Everyone

It is with very deep sadness, but absolutely no regret that I have resigned from Preston Candover CofE Primary School after 44 years of working there as a teacher. It is a very sad way to end my long career and my service to the community. I joined the school in 1978, and oh my, we had some wonderful times. I also married and came to live just outside of Preston Candover in the same year.

However, I have not been happy at the school for several years. Having to join a supply company in order to be offered work in my own school, when I agreed to go to one teaching day a week, only served to compound my unhappiness at Preston Candover, as I visited and taught in many other lovely, happy, welcoming schools.

I have NOT retired, I resigned as I needed to, for my own wellbeing, and because my trust and faith in the leadership of the school have been irretrievably broken.

I did not give my life to the school as I was paid for my role. Nevertheless, I did everything to the best of my ability, with dedication and love.

I have a great fondness for the many children whom I have taught over the years and have enjoyed watching lots of you grow into adults and, in some cases, allow me the opportunity to teach your children. I have worked with some fantastic people over time but have been greatly saddened, in more recent years, by the number of colleagues leaving the school. In fact, this term I left with two other teachers and two members of the support team.

I have a strong faith and loved leading and coordinating Collective Worship within the school and with the church. I continue to hope that links with the church and especially our Rector David will be maintained and repaired, Respectively; Preston Candover is a Church of England School.

I still sincerely maintain that if the children at Preston Candover are expected to live out the Christian values of Love, Hope and Justice, these values must be embedded in the hearts and minds of all adults in the school. They should be naturally practised, as an example, from the top, cascading down through everyone and all relationships within the school.

# From conversation in a cave with the Taliban to a column in The Times.

A short piece following on from conversations about August's Dear Friends.

**Dr Amy Orr-Ewing** was an Oxford under graduate, when she and some friends and a bag full of courage, took Bibles as gifts to Taliban leaders. She was led at the point of an AK 47 into a cave of Taliban fighters but it all ended well as the fighters took a bible and a good conversation was had!

Thirty years on Amy, based in Berkshire, lives out mission today explaining and reasoning the Christian Faith. She is an engaging speaker and a readable author with many books published.

In my August 'Dear Friends' letter I mentioned the article Amy wrote for **The Times newspaper (June 2022)** where she described her experience of supporting victims of abuse as they gave evidence in court. The victims had courage to speak up.

Afterwards, grateful for the calm of a nearby cathedral service she was struck afresh hearing the words "He will cast the mighty down from their seat..." There are so many mighty in our world and we know many use their might wrongfully causing harm to others. Whether on the world stage as politicians or nearer to home there are people with positional power, who abuse and bully people in the organisation. Those bullied cannot do anything except to endure abuse and suffer consequent fear and deep anxiety, this is compounded when those in charge won't take allegations of abuse seriously.

From personal experience, Amy wrote about an abuser's typical reaction when called to account. The acronym **DARVO** stands for Deny Accuse Reverse Victim and Offender. Denial of abuse is usually the first response with emphatic denials of what the victim alleges is true. Then follows on a counter accusation to portray the victim as the abuser and the bully as the victim. This is so common in cases of alleged harassment and bullying cases that it has been recognised in academic study by Professor Freyd who includes it as part of her work on Institutional Betrayal. (All found on Google).

In **Institutional Betrayal** the victim is betrayed by those who should deal with the abuser (trustees, or co-leaders) but fail to investigate. Often after long delays in investigating the abuse allegations, the victim is forced into leaving their organisation in which abuse has taken place compounding the injustice they have experienced. This leaves the abused person with their integrity under suspicion, suffering from enormous anxiety, sleep loss and mental health issues. It is clearly very debilitating and I have heard dreadful stories of those who have suffered in this way. The abuser gets away with their abuse because responsible persons refuse to listen to allegations or are afraid themselves to conduct a proper investigation since an investigation makes a call on their courage. The soft target here is the victim, the balance of power is not on their side.

Dr Diane Langberg writes, "It is very important for all of us to remember that telling an abuse story, facing the truth, and expressing the deep and painful emotions that keep company with trauma takes tremendous courage." Enormous courage is required and also resilience, to endure the process of putting their case against an abuser who is unlikely to be truthful, may bring reprisals and make the organisation an untenable place to be.

It is an act of 'love for our neighbour' to speak up for victims, to hear their allegations, and to support them to find justice- this takes courage rather than standing aside. Those who do stand up for a victim and courageously take up the issues, may also receive the same unfair treatment and suffer too. But in doing so we give hope, the alternative is to collude with oppression leaving the victims to suffer in isolation. Amy heard words of scripture when she stood alongside victims that gave her hope, may I commend Psalm 37 to you.

#### Grants available for community chalk stream projects

Keen to take action for our local chalk streams, but need help to make your idea a reality? The Watercress and Winterbournes scheme is offering funding for community-led projects that protect, enhance, or celebrate the Candover Brook, Cheriton Stream, Bourne Rivulet, Pillhill Brook, River Arle, Upper Anton, or Upper Test.

Your project must be based around at least one of the above streams, and must support one of two aims. It could improve the condition of locally important chalk stream habitats, or their associated built heritage. It could also enable people to explore, enjoy and learn about the streams' natural and cultural heritage. The proposed activities should be accessible to, or beneficial for, the wider public. We'd love to hear from passionate groups of people with the drive to bring their vision to life. You might be part of a parish council, a school, a registered charity, or a Community Interest Company. Voluntary and community groups are also welcome.

sion to life. You might be part of a parish council, a school, a registered charity, or a Community Interest Company. Voluntary and community groups are also welcome, provided you're constituted and have your own bank account. If successful, you'll receive up to £5,000 in funding and have one year to complete your activities.

The projects funded so far have been varied. New Alresford Town Trust created information materials that capture the unique story of the town's Eel House. Hampshire Bat Group installed 35 roosting boxes to support the bats that thrive along our chalk streams. Andover Trees United connected communities with the Upper Anton through artist-led walks and musical performances. Finally, the Watercress Way Charity are currently developing a programme of educational events focused on the River Arle.

The deadline for the next round of funding is Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> October, but we recommend expressing your interest as soon as possible. You can find more information, including details of eligibility criteria, on the Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust website: www.hiwwt.org.uk/winterbournes/communitygrants. The GP training programme takes 3 years and during the first two years of this a GP trainee will undertake placements in a number of different medical specialties including a six month placement in a GP surgery. The final year of the training programme takes place in a different practice where the trainee (or Registrar as they are known) will use the knowledge and experience they have already have to gain the particular skills of a GP.

#### Flu vaccines and COVID Boosters Autumn/ Winter 2022

We are preparing now for the delivery of 2 mass vaccination programmes that will commence in September/October 2022 (Seasonal influenza and the COVID autumn booster).

# Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

I was just popping out to top up our birdbath early one bone dry and very warm summer's morning and was delighted to find a frog – a full-sized adult, ochre brown – calmly sitting, soaking in this shallow pool. He was having a cool dip before hopping off into the parched undergrowth. The birdbath is a large flat terracotta tray placed in a shady spot on the dried out lawn, popular with birds to wash and to drink when there is little moisture, apart from windfall apples and the last of the plums. Bees also line up around the damp rim to sip.

Unexpected finds may be literally on the doorstep – especially when moth wings begin to appear on our front porch in mid-July. Odds and ends of silver-Y moths, these are the remnants of a bat's dinner, dining alfresco, perched on top of an old Dutch barometer. It seems that generations of brown long-eared bats have foraged here for the previous twenty years or so, using the barometer as a convenient feeding post.

Leaving the roadside verges to romp away unmown in May and June yields many benefits botanical. Amid the swaying stands of ripening grasses, the purple heads of knapweeds, plus blue pincushions of scabious, meet the eye. Pinky-purple splashes reveal another treasure of these strips of chalk grassland – the cones and domes of the pyramidal orchids. Along the lane from my home, one or two of these orchids are often to be found on the verge but with a change in mowing regime, they've been left to flower and set seed, steadily increasing in numbers until this year we counted a record thirteen of these colourful troopers.

Clumps of dark mullein with their yellow flower spikes are a familiar feature of wayside verges. In late July, those on Kites Hill at Totford in particular, are being munched by large caterpillars with distinctive yellow and black markings. Pale green bands separating each body segment identify those of the striped lychnis moth, a nationally scarce species found here in the Candovers.



### **Summary**

After a cool start with sunny spells and a few passing light showers, July was predominantly fine and sunny. High pressure dominated for much of the month and daytime temperatures increased steadily for two and a half weeks, culminating in 95°F on the 19<sup>th</sup>. It was also the warmest night in over two decades at 67°F on the 19<sup>th</sup>. There was a 19°F drop the following day as temperatures returned more to the seasonal norm and overall, the temperature for July was above average. The first measurable rain fell on the 21<sup>st</sup> but only 0.01 inches. The sunny weather continued to the end of the month with the occasional light shower. At 0.02 inches and 0.8% of the normal rainfall, it was the driest month recorded and the lowest year to date total with just 55% of the long term average.

I hope you have enjoyed the summer months despite the very hot weather. The imposition of water restrictions by Southern Water

bring worries about the security of our water supply to the fore. RAPID is the Regulators' Alliance for Progressing Infrastructure Development. As part of this programme, Southern Water is developing a scheme to supplement the aquifer water they already extract for our use. You can see more online at www.southernwater.co.uk, search 'Water for life'. Southern Water is proposing to treat our wastewater as usual, but instead of pumping the treated sewage out to sea as it does now, it will be added to the reservoir at Havant Thicket, and that water will be returned to Otterbourne to be cleaned again and processed for drinking water. Southern Water is seeking views on the principles of this from the public this summer- and I'd be interested to hear your views too.

Every year a National Highways Transport Survey is carried out to assess the public view of highways across the country. You often make your views known to me-this is your chance to take part!

Go to www.hants.gov.uk/transport/nht-surveys And please give your views on 20mph limits too: go to www.hants.gov.uk ,search '20mph' deadline 11<sup>th</sup> September.





#### On the Farm - Ben Robinson

It has thankfully just started raining after six weeks without any measurable rain. Even before the last rainfall on 1<sup>st</sup> July it was very dry.

The countryside has been a tinderbox, with many fires around the county and further afield. As the combine was cutting at the top of Chalky Hill, Medstead, a spark caused the straw to ignite and start a major blaze. Luckily the combine did not catch light. The quick actions of those working in the field and the massive help of our farming neighbours prevented the fire spreading further than the field it started it. At one stage it looked like both the nearby woodland and the next door vineyard could go up in flames too. As it was about 5 acres of standing crop and 15 acres of straw in the swath was destroyed.

If a fire starts in a field while it is being cut it is best to cultivate around the area ablaze to create a firebreak which removes the fuel from the path of the flames. This worked well on our fire, however the very hot temperatures, exceptionally dry straw and stiff breeze enabled the flames to periodically jump across firebreaks. These smaller fires that crossed the breaks had to be extinguished by farm water bowsers and also the excellent fire brigade. The local fire service had done quite a bit of practice at fighting field fires this season before they got to us! I would like to thank them for their efforts as well as our farming neighbours the Tickners, Grahams, Laileys and Gibbons for their quick actions without which the situation could have got seriously out of hand

I am not too involved with the cereal harvest, however we do cart the straw back for use as winter cattle bedding. The straw this year has been incredibly dry and the baling hassle free. This means the absorbent quality should be good. The challenge is that very dry straw is shattered by a modern rotary combine which means that picking up the bales with our JCB attachment is quite difficult as the spikes don't grip in the bale as well.

There are many bale stacks in the area currently- however please don't be tempted to climb them or allow children in your care to scale them. They are not the small bale stacks of old. A modern 6 string straw bale can weigh approaching half a ton. Very few people survive to tell the tale of one of those landing on them.
