SERVICES IN CHURCH

It is with sadness that Revd David, the wardens and the ministry team, with the support of the PCC, have decided to **suspend public worship with immediate effect**. This means we, along with many other churches in the deanery and diocese, have had to seek a special dispensation from the bishop to allow us to hold online services only. We will review the situation in the middle of February, and decide whether or not it is safe to resume worship, taking full notice of Government, medical and Church of England advice. Regular services will continue online – a 10am livestreamed service on Sunday mornings and a 10am BCP Spiritual Communion on Wednesdays. With the new variant of Coronavirus spreading so rapidly and unpredictably, we could not risk the health of the elderly and vulnerable members of our congregation. We sincerely believe, after much prayer and thought, that it is the most responsible action we can take as Christians. We look forward to resuming our communal worship as soon as possible. The church will be open for private prayer on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9am–3pm and on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9-11.30am.

PARISH PRAYER CYCLE

In our **cycle of prayer**, we pray for the residents of The Butts and for the work of Sevenoaks Counselling Service. We pray especially for those remembering today the importance of the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan and for all who are baptised. COLLECT



THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Jesus is seen at this time publicly demonstrating the type of ministry which he has chosen. When we baptise a baby, it is more than putting off of the old self, it is a putting on of the new - perhaps this is made more explicit when we baptise a baby, which it is hard to recognise as steeped in sin. So too the baptism of Jesus is not a washing away of the past, but rather a putting on of the new, preparing himself for the great task, setting out his style of ministry. The baptism of Jesus shows God entering flesh and becoming one of us. At his baptism Jesus goes down into the waters with us. Jesus enters the waters, comes up close to us, lets the waters that covered the repentant sinners flow over him. He takes what is weak and wavering, makes us his disciples and strengthens us who would follow him.

A prayer for the nation


