Looking to the future...

I have just begun my 8th year at St. Oswalds and in terms of ministry and ministers, it's been something of a roller-coaster. I inherited an established team of three Readers and three active retired clergy alongside four Churchwardens, a Director of Music with a well-stocked choir, a part-time administrator, a team of altar servers and numerous people doing a huge amount of work behind the scenes. I was, and remain, very grateful.

Sadly, Covid resulted in all three of our Readers stepping back for a variety of reasons and whilst we have gained two more retired clergy colleagues, '*Old Father Time*' has caught up with all but one of the original trinity. Three years ago, we gained two full time stipendiary clergy, one left at the end of last year, the other by the time you read this article; once again, I am the only full-time priest.

Thankfully, this is only half the story, for alongside the ordained team, is a growing team of lay ministers, though some of them would be reluctant to use the term 'minister.' My vision has always been to encourage everyone to engage in mission and ministry in a capacity which affirms their gifts and time availability, and it is joyful to experience new people ministering in existing and established areas, and established people ministering in new.

You will be aware that there is a significant drive to minister to and encourage families and young people into our church communities and, 'hand's up,' it's not one of our strengths. Sadly, we don't have sufficient people with the appropriate gifts or time to give. However, we do have a flourishing ministry to young people through our choir with young people in positions of ministerial and missional leadership, the bell ringers are having success in attracting and retaining young people as ringers, and our team of altar servers has seen two of its young people confirmed in the last two years; one of whom is on the PCC. We also resource two mums to run and oversee our Under 5's group, and one of them is on the PCC. But there is much to do in this area of our offering to the people of Oswestry; if it is something we want to do.

Whilst we should be aware of this particular missional limitation, we should also recognise and affirm our ministry to the more mature members of our congregation, we are a church of mature people with mature needs and experience. We have people helping with Sunday

worship, offering their time and gifts to help maintain our building, and the pastoral care team is seeing pastoral care in a much wider context. We run a MU fellowship and a Ladies Group, a Place of Welcome, we have a small team of parish visitors, and a growing number of home Communion administrators taking the sacrament and pastoral care to people in private and residential homes.

Our ministry to the people of Oswestry also includes a significant pastoral ministry of baptisms and funerals, and as the civic church we have been active in the events surrounding D-Day and VE-Day commemorations. I am honoured to have been asked by our new Mayor, Cllr. Rosie Radford to be her chaplain and I look forward to supporting her and the new Town Council in that role. All this points to the fact that this is a complex parish with complex needs and there will always be more opportunities to serve than time and resources to do so.

So, we return to the fact that I am now the only full-time priest at St. Oswald's and we, and I, must face the reality that I can only be spread so far. Despite the help and fellowship provided by my retired colleagues and the lay people who generously offer their time and talents, for which I am extremely grateful, I cannot be all things to all people. So, we need to spend some time prayerfully considering where and how we move forward in mission and in ministry.

Over the next few months, I will be working with the church wardens, PCC and others to see how we can regularise some of these roles and responsibilities and how we can enable people to feel able to participate in our ministry here at St. Oswald's in a way which is achievable and sustainable. I am already considering where I need to focus my time and energy in the parish. Alongside this however, is the simple truth that we need to increase the involvement of lay people in our church life. Many of our volunteer teams require more help, some of these roles require specific gifts, others simply require people to spare a little time and energy.

As we begin this process together, I simply ask that you prayerfully consider where you might be able to offer your time and talents to the service of God and God's people in this place, and then, just as importantly, speak to me or to a Churchwarden.

I look forward to the next twelve months with hope and anticipation...

A historical perspective – 263

An impressive memorial to the Rev. James Donne

A few weeks ago I visited St Eata's church in Atcham, and was struck by the similarity of a monument, on the east wall of that church, to the side of the altar, to one of the monuments here at St Oswald's. Having since then had the opportunity to look at that monument, on the south wall of the Lady Chapel, beneath the painted triptych featuring Moses and Aaron, the similarity is only partial: there are significant differences. That said, I was reminded that the monument, or memorial, here in our Lady Chapel, is one that I have not previously discussed, and prompted to correct that omission.

The monument is one which will be familiar to many, or most readers of these articles. Sited immediately to the right of the door leading to the church office, set against the wall, it was erected here in 1845, being described in *Eddowes's Shrewsbury Journal* for September 24th of that year as "a fine monument [whose] design is very chaste, of the florid Gothic style, beautifully executed in white Caen stone". The newspaper reported that "it is about 12 feet high, and stands on the left on entering St Mary's chancel by the eastern door ... [it] will, when the wall against which it is placed is coloured, have a very imposing effect". To explain, the eastern door referred to here was a door installed in 1830 in the east wall of (what is now) the Lady Chapel, and removed as part of the restorations of 1872/74.

The monument includes, in the recess of its central arch, a long inscription, wholly in Latin, indicating that it is a memorial to the Rev. James Donne, vicar of Llanyblodwel, and master of Oswestry School for 36 years, and telling us that the memorial was paid for by former pupils of the school. I could not find a maker's mark on the monument, but the report in the Shrewsbury newspaper notes that it was made "at the celebrated works of Mr Brown, Great Russell Street, Bloomsbury, and put up under the direction of Mr Weeks from that establishment". Robert Brown, of 58 Great Russell Street, was responsible for a number of notable monuments, in London churches and elsewhere; in 1851, he was an exhibitor at the Great Exhibition, displaying there a "sepulchral monument, of the decorated period, In Caen stone".

The memorial gives Dr Donne's date of birth, February 14th 1764, and the date of his death, January 23rd 1844. However, he was not buried at St Oswald's, but at Llanyblodwel, where their registers record his burial on January 30th, aged 80. *Eddowes's Journal*, of January 31st, reported that

“the remains of the late Rev. Dr Donne were interred yesterday in the family vault at Llanyblodwell”.

James Donne was born in Radnorshire, and baptised at Llanfihangel Rhydiithon on February 26th 1764. He may have attended a school in Llanbister, and in 1784 was admitted to St John’s College, Cambridge. He graduated with a B.A. in 1788, being awarded his M.A. in 1792, and made Doctor of Divinity in 1825. He taught at a school in Kensington in 1788, and was appointed second master at the King’s School, Chester, in 1794. He was ordained as a deacon in 1790, and a priest in 1791; in February 1796, he was appointed a minor canon of Chester Cathedral.

Shortly afterwards, on February 23rd 1796, the *Chester Courant* reported that he had been “appointed by the Lord Bishop of St Asaph to be master of the grammar school at Oswestry”. And a month later, the same ‘paper included an advertisement placed by the Rev. James Donne, A.M., telling readers that “the Grammar School at Oswestry will open upon Monday the 4th of April, where young gentlemen will be boarded and instructed in Writing and Arithmetic, the Latin and Greek classics, French, ancient and modern History, Geography, Astronomy, and the Use of the Globes, Geometry, algebra, and the other branches of the mathematics”.

Reflecting the move by the school from its historic site next to the parish church to its present home on the Trefonen road, the notice continued, saying that “the situation of the school is in the highest degree healthful and pleasant, the house commodious, and the play-grounds extensive”. And readers were told that “very careful attention will be paid to the moral and religious instruction of the young gentlemen, and nothing left undone to promote their health and comfort: as well as their progress in the various branches of useful and polite learning”.

The entrance fee was two guineas; tuition a further two guineas per annum, and boarding another twenty-two guineas each year.

There is much more to say about Dr Donne – certainly enough for another of these articles in July. For the time being, I will conclude by noting that he served as Headmaster until 1833, when he was succeeded by his son Stephen Donne, who continued as Head until 1860. Oswestry School’s own website states that “under Donne’s headship, the school significantly improved in social and financial standing, so much so that Donne is often honoured as the school’s second founder”.

It is now 11 years since my late wife and Joint Director of Music, Veronica, died of bowel cancer.

We came to Oswestry in 2000 inspired by the fact that our then vicar had said that we could have a free hand but to give him a cathedral standard choir. Veronica was instrumental in helping to develop the choir into the fine group of singers that has contributed so well to the music for our services. She was also the guiding light in the restoration of our wonderful Hill Organ which was completed in 2104. She was able to hear the result of her labours on Easter Sunday but, sadly, by then was too ill to play it. She died that year on 27th June.

Since that time (with the exception of the Covid lockdown), we have marked each year with a memorial recital on the Saturday nearest to the date of her passing. This year it is on Saturday 28th June and the recital will be given at 7.00pm by James Kellas, Organist of St. Alkmund's Church, Whitchurch.

You may have noticed that the choir has looked a bit thin in recent weeks. This is because some of our choristers are taking time out for GCSE exams. Of course they will be back but, in the last two years we have lost some fine singers as they move on to take up their studies at university. We do need to recruit to make sure that we always have enough singers to maintain the standard of music that we are used to.

We particularly need some adult sopranos and tenors but altos and basses will also be welcome.

And of course, we always need new choristers. Young people from 10 to 14 receive a very fine training in vocal technique and musicianship.

Please think about whether you can offer your voice to the choir. We are a very friendly bunch and you will be made very welcome.

Adopt a Chorister

One of the main events in our choir training calendar is the Royal School of Church Music summer school in Bath. The Choristers receive a week of intensive training from some of the top choir trainers and vocal coaches in the country. The benefits are passed on to us in the fine singing that our choristers produce.

However, we need help to send the choristers to Bath. The total cost per chorister this year is £625. It seems a lot but it includes full board for a week together with all teaching including special voice coaching sessions and music and transport from the school to Bath Abbey.

Recently I walked with a friend to the stepping stones at Dovedale. He suddenly stopped in his tracks and said “I just remembered the last time I walked across these steps. It was 65 years ago. I was 11 years old.”

A few weeks before, I was talking to a seasoned headteacher whose face lit up when I mentioned the same place. He shared vivid memories of a childhood stay at Dovedale House while at primary school. Why do I mention these memories?

PROFUSION IN JUNE

June is a great month for spending time close to nature in your local churchyard or cemetery. The second week of June sees three initiatives; Love Your Burial Ground Week with Churches Count on Nature and National Cemeteries Week all taking place in celebration of these special places and the fantastic volunteers who care for them.

You may be able to attend an event as part of one of these, take a look on the Caring for Gods Acre [map of events](#) to see what is happening near you but if not, please go to a churchyard, chapel yard or cemetery on your own, with your family or friends and see what you can see.

Wildflowers may be present in profusion if there is a meadow area, look out for oxeye daisy, lady's bedstraw, vetches, cat's ear, hawkbit amongst others. Is there a patch of medium length grass, where shorter-stemmed plants can flower without the mower cutting them off? If so search for bird's eye speedwell, self-heal, red clover, buttercups and medics. Burial grounds can be rich in species as they contain a mosaic of habitats, with large trees, areas of shaded woodland, stonework as well as grassland of varying lengths. The butterflies to be found can be a mix of species usually found in woodland, grassland and scrub. In June you may find a rich array, look out for comma, red admiral, small copper and common blue which favour shorter vegetation such as grasses and nettles for laying their eggs, all plants found in meadows or in the dappled shade of a woodland or large tree canopy. You may catch a glimpse of a yellow brimstone, which lays its eggs on buckthorn, a woodland shrub.

June is also a good time to sit quietly and watch birds busily feeding young, darting in and out of nests. Again, burial grounds can be rich in birds which may also use neighbouring gardens. The church itself can host house martins under the eaves, swallows in the porch or lychgate and perhaps swifts, nesting invisibly in the eaves or in boxes behind tower louvres. A visit in the early evening may be rewarded with the sound of screaming swifts circling around the church building.

Please let us know what you see and hear, be it plant, insect or bird. You can record species using a smart phone and the iNaturalist or iRecord app, by email or by post. Open this link to find out [how to make a recording](#) or visit our website.




