FAREHAM FOCUS – February 2020

Dear Friends.

We have just celebrated the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2020 and this year the material was prepared by Christians in Malta and the theme was 'Unusual Kindness'. Not too surprisingly, the focus was on the story of how Paul, having endured storms at sea and much danger and trouble, finds himself shipwrecked and he and his travelling companions finally arrive on the shores of Malta grateful that they have survived. They note that the natives who greet them showed them 'unusual kindness' for which they were especially grateful! It is a cracking story in Acts chapters 27-28 - lots of detail is included by Luke (who we think wrote Acts as well as his gospel) which suggests that he was one of the travelling companions on the boat with Paul. Kindness is a much underrated quality. And yet, I suspect that most days we have an opportunity to be kind or to receive kindness from another person. In my conversations and meetings with people I hear many stories of little acts of kindness that remind me that there is much good in people and in the world, if only we were able to see it more clearly and celebrate it more widely. Paul's experience when he and others arrived in Malta was that they recognised the unusual kindness of strangers - they were in a strange land (they only learn they are in Malta after they have arrived) amongst strange people and yet they received a welcome and immediate hospitality. Where might we see acts of unusual kindness in our world, local community and in our own lives? How might we and the church be known for the unusual kindness we might offer others in times of difficulty and trouble? I'm sure that there will be many opportunities in 2020 to demonstrate kindness to others both individually and as a church community. May we be open to these opportunities as a way of sharing God's love and care for all. Love Claire
