NEWS IN BRIEF

300 EVENTS FOR THY KINGDOM COME

From prayer walks, quiet days, and 24/7 prayer rooms, over 300 prayer events took place in the Diocese as part of Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) this year.

Rochester Cathedral itself become a giant visual prayer for the Diocese, as it hosted prayers and displays from across the deaneries and church communities.

Canon Rachel Phillips, Canon for Mission and Growth at Rochester Cathedral, who coordinated TKC events across the region said: "It's been great to see people from across our churches getting involved simply to pray, Thy Kingdom Come."

NEW MISSIONAL PROPERTY FUND

The Missional Property Fund is a new fund, aimed at supporting projects which will allow parishes to open up their church buildings for mission.

The Fund has been made possible by generous support from Marshalls Charity, match funded by the Diocese of Rochester by funds from restricted funds.

WELCOME THE NEW LLMS

A scientist, a solicitor and a sports enthusiast are among a group of 15 people licensed as Lay Ministers (LLM) at a special service in Rochester Cathedral. The service was led by Bishop Laurie Green.

An LLM is a distinctive role in the Diocese open to those called to work for God and the Church, but not called to be ordained.

As well as being able to preach in church and take services, LLMs are able to develop a particular focus for their ministry; this might include specialising in working with elderly people and those with dementia; with the bereaved; with children and families; and, caring for the vulnerable in their communities.

Karen Senior, Warden of Lay Ministry for the Diocese said, that the 15 LLMs were from diverse backgrounds,

CARD READERS IN CHURCH

St. Gabriel's Church in Kingshill have been exploring technology to make it easier for people to donate to church funds, pay for hall hire, or coffee after church!

With many people no longer carrying cash, allowing them to make payments in the way they choose is becoming increasingly important.

One solution is a card reader which works alongside a smart phone or tablet. Parishes can buy card readers at a discount through the Parish Buying website and use them with specially negotiated low transaction rates.
