ANTI LOAN SHARK AWARD & CHARTER SIGNED

Civic and community representatives joined Bishop James in signing a charter committing to help foster a zero-tolerance attitude to illegal money lending in our communities.

The signing was organised in conjunction with the England Illegal Money Lending Team (IMLT) who also recognised the work of the Diocese so far with a highly commended award.

BISHOP'S CERTIFICATE RECEIVED BY 21 STUDENTS

A wonderful celebration of study and achievement took place in June, when 21 students received their Bishop's Certificate, after two-years of study.

The aim of the Bishop's Certificate course is to give people the knowledge and skills they need to express their faith and explore their Christian life and service; it can lead on to further opportunities such as Licensed Lay Ministry.

BISHOP SIMON CONSECRATED!

The new Bishop of Tonbridge, Rt Rev Simon Burton-Jones, was consecrated by the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby, at a service in St Paul's Cathedral on Tuesday 3 July.

Formerly the Archdeacon of Rochester, large numbers of people from across the Diocese travelled to London to support Simon and his family on this special occasion.

One of those who attended said: "It's been a lovely occasion and Bishop Simon is a fantastic choice for the Diocese. He's a fantastic carer of people and I'm looking forward to that continuing in his Bishop's ministry."

During the ceremony, Simon received three items to symbolise his office as bishop: an episcopal ring, a pastoral staff and a pectoral cross..

All were made by local craftsman Andrew Lapthorn in Chatham. Two of the items were crafted from 4,500-year-old 'bog wood' and Simon was personally involved in their design. A full round-up of events and videos can be found on the Diocesan website.
