NEWS IN BRIEF

PAST CASES REVIEW

Independent reviewers are currently carrying out a comprehensive safeguarding review of churches and key institutions within the Diocese of Rochester, called the Past Cases Review.

Its purpose is to help establish whether all known cases of church-related abuse have been considered and dealt with appropriately.

It's also an opportunity to learn about concerns that may not have previously been known about.

The Ven Julie Conalty, Archdeacon of Tonbridge and Bishop's Lead for Safeguarding says:

"We want to encourage anyone who may have information about churchrelated abuse to know that there are people you can talk to and you will be taken seriously.

"If you are concerned about something you have experienced in a church, now or in the past, we want to hear from you."

'BISHOP JAMES' CHRISTMAS MESSAGE: WHERE CAN WE LOOK FOR THE SIGNS OF GOD'S KINGDOM?

Bishop James has used his Christmas message this year to encourage us, amidst the uncertainty in our society, to look for where we see the signs of God's kingdom and to take those with us as we enter the season of Christmas.

Advent, he says, is a time when we are, 'watching and waiting, looking, expecting, anticipating', the arrival of God made flesh, of the 'breaking in of the reality of God's reign, of God's presence.'

Referencing the uncertainty and conflict present in our world, he highlights issues that the Diocese has itself focused on in recent months: knife crime, modern slavery, and domestic abuse.

In such an environment, where are we to see the signs of 'God's kingdom'?

For Bishop James, it is present in the many churches, schools, and chaplaincies he visits day to day. In the stories he hears of those being nurtured to faith and the people meeting the needs of others.

The environmentalist, theologian and author of the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent book in 2020, Dr Ruth Valerio, has been appointed to the honorary position of Canon Theologian at Rochester Cathedral.

The appointment will be for 3 years. Dr Valerio will be officially installed at the Cathedral during a service of Evensong on Sunday 23 February - followed by a lecture given by Dr Ruth which will be live streamed.

Dr Ruth is Global Advocacy and Influencing Director at the Christian relief and development charity Tearfund. Prior to this, she was Churches and Theology Director for A Rocha UK, and spearheaded the Eco Church initiative.

Speaking about her appointment she said:

"This is an immense honour. We are facing an unprecedented climate emergency and we all have a calling to be part of the solution and to care for God's earth.

"I look forward to helping to develop the Diocese's work in this area."

Bishop James said:

"We greatly look forward to the inspiration, guidance and expertise Ruth's connection to the Cathedral will bring to us, as we aim to take better care of God's creation across the area of the Diocese."
