## Find discipleship resources

### Priority: Making Disciples

Making disciples is one of the Diocese of Bristol's three core priorities, alongside growing leaders and engaging younger generations. We want to ensure resources are available to parishes to support them in prioritising discipleship and making disciples.

As our 'Creating connections' vision explains, we need to encourage greater commitment to following Jesus in discipleship and to take seriously the call of the Great Commission. What would it look like for the Church and our Church schools to be salt and light in the world, demonstrating and declaring the Good News?

Our aim is to call people into a more radical relationship with Jesus. We will encourage discipleship that engages people in both personal and corporate prayer and Bible study, that inspires them to live their daily lives influenced by their faith.

We will invest resources in evangelism and outreach so that lives and communities might be transformed as people are invited to respond to the Good News of Jesus Christ.

### DiscipleKit: Discipleship resources reviewed



[DiscipleKit](http://DiscipleKit) is a website run by [CPAS](http://CPAS). On the site you can choose from a variety of discipleship resources from many different publishers, all reviewed and rated to save you time.

Each posting has information on the resource, as well as a rating, extensive review and a link to buy it. Resources are listed by category, these include: Small groups; Whole church; Beginning; Growing; Adults; Children; For men; For women; All-age and Sharing your faith.

By signing up for free as a registered member of the community, you can save your favorite resources and add your comments to the website about the resources you have used. As a registered user, [DiscipleKit](http://DiscipleKit) will then send you occasional updates about resources via email, and suggest new ones for you to review.

DiscipleKit, through CPAS also produce 2 regular email newsletters;

The first will email you short reviews of different discipleship resources that may be of interest to you and will draw your attention to new resources that have been launched and added to the site. The second is a monthly leadership email through which CPAS will send you inspiring and informative information about leadership.
