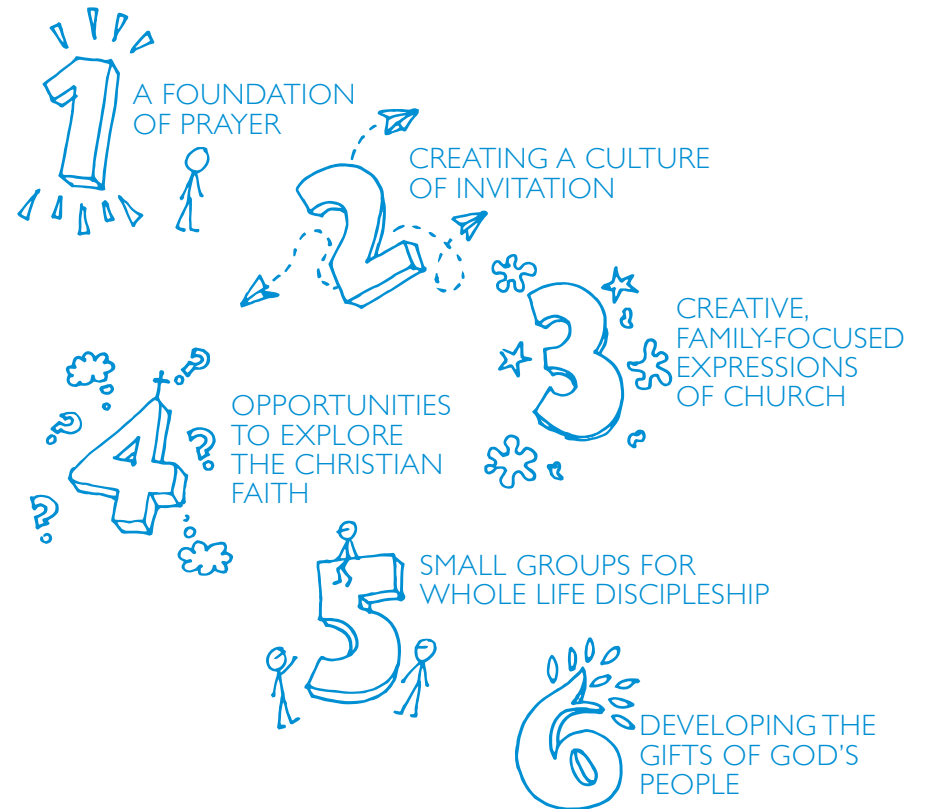

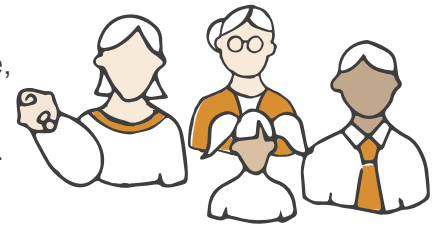
# CREATIVE, FAMILY-FOCUSED EXPRESSIONS OF CHURCH

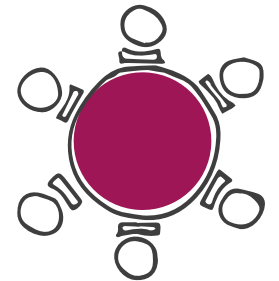
